From Pastor Ralph's Desk: The Driving Force of Love Fulfills God's Two Great Commandments

(Matthew 22: 34-40)

Intro: If I were to ask each individual in our congregation why God saves us, I am sure that many different answers would be given and I am also sure that probably most of, if not all, would be correct. Some would say that He saves us because He loves us. Some would say that He saves us because we are sinners and can not save ourselves. Some would say that He saves us to reconcile us to Himself. Others would say that He saves us to give us eternal life and an eternal home in Heaven. And I would say to all of these answers that they are absolutely 100% correct.

However, I also want us to understand that God saves us not only to fix our eternal future with Him, but also to make a difference in our world in the here and now. And the way that He wants to do that is by leading us to fulfill His two great commandments. So, what I am saying is that God also saves us to demonstrate to the world His two great commandments.

Now, to tie this together with my series, I began preaching a couple of weeks ago, I want us to understand and see that in order to fulfill God's two commandments, it will take the driving force of His love. The driving force of love alone is the means by which we carry our His two great commands in the world today.

I. First, I want us to notice the declaration of these two great commands.

Jesus was asked by the religious leaders of the day who were trying to trip Him up, hoping He would make a mistake so they could accuse Him and have Him arrested or crucified. What was the greatest commandment? Well, Jesus declared to them that the greatest commandment was to love God with all your heart, soul and mind. He then said that the second was to love your neighbor as yourself.

Now, these commandments that Jesus declared were not new commandments. They had been a part of the life of the nation of Israel for nearly 1500 years. What Jesus did was to summarize the Ten Commandments into two commandments.

Now, what is important for us to remember is that, though they were not new, the fact that Jesus was declaring them the greatest commandments of all just reminds us how important these old, old commandments are. He is reminding us that love is the greatest thing that He wants us to do while we live out our lives in this world.

II. Second, I want us to notice the depth's of these two great commands.

First of all, Jesus shows us the depths of these two great commandments when He includes the totality of our being in the fulfillment of the first one. What I mean by totality of our being is wrapped up in the three areas that Jesus mentioned of our lives. He mentioned our heart, our soul, and our mind. Those three areas represent the totality of a person. So, what Jesus was saying was that there was to be absolutely no area of our being that is not in love with God. Or simply put, every ounce of our being should love God.

Second, Jesus shows us the depth of these two great commands when He declares that you are to love your neighbor as yourself. This is deep because Jesus is including an assumption in this particular command. The assumption is that you already love yourself because you do what is necessary to take care of yourself and to give yourself as much pleasure as you possibly can. So, I believe that what Jesus is saying is that whatever you would do for yourself out of love, you should be willing to do to your neighbor.

Third, Jesus shows us the depths of these two great commands when He declares that these two commands fulfill all the Law and the Prophets. So, what Jesus is saying is that when you are carrying out these two command, then you are essentially carrying out the total direction of the Word of God as found in the Law and Prophets and these two together represent the whole of the Old Testament. Also, because Jesus is declaring it more in what is part of the New Testament, it becomes therefore, the direction of the New Testament as well. Meaning that if we want to follow the totality of the Word of God, then we need to follow and do these two great commands.

III. Third, I want us to notice the definition of these two great commands.

Now the definition that I am referring to is the definition of the word love itself. In the context that we are reading, it is a reference to the Greek word Agape. This is the word that describes God's love. Therefore, it is the highest and truest form of love that there is. Pastor John MacArthur describes God's love this way, 'genuine love of the Lord is intelligent, feeling, willing and serving. It involves thought, sensitivity, intent and even action where that is possible and appropriate." So, what this means is that God's love is a total commitment of Himself to us in every way. What God is commanding us to do is to love Him and our neighbor with the highest for of love, God's love. This means therefore, that we must love God and our neighbors with the love that we receive from God.

IV. Fourth, I want us to notice the duty of these two great commands.

The duty simply is to put the definition into action, and the one who perfectly demonstrated the duty of these two great commands was Jesus Himself. In john 13:34-35, Jesus ups the ante when He said, "A new command I give you: love on another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." So, Jesus says you don't just love one another as your yourselves but now you love one another as I have loved you. So, the duty is to love as Jesus did, and all one needs to do to know how Jesus loved us is to read the gospels and you wil see the many ways Jesus loved His followers even to the point of dying on the cross for them. So, we must ask ourselves, are we loving as Jesus did? If we do, we will indeed fulfill these two great commandments.

Conclusion: by now as you read my message, you may have come to the conclusion that you might as well not even begin trying to carry out the greatest commandment given to us by God. For there is no way that we can love as Jesus did and does. However, there is good news and the good news is that God has made it possible for us to love Him and our neighbors as He commanded us to do. The answer is found in Romans 5:5. "And hope does not disappoint us because God has poured out His love into our hearts by the Holy Spirit, whom He has given us." You see

according to this verse, we can love the way God asked us to because He has given us Himself in the person of the Holy Spirit and with Him comes God's love to abide in our hearts so that we can share it with others. Therefore, let our prayer be, Oh Holy Spirit, continue to pour out God's love through us. Amen.






