### Pastor Ralph's Desk: What Will You Do With The Lord's Anointed? (II Samuel 1:1-18)

Intro: On Wednesday Nights in our Bible Study, we have come to the first chapter of II Samuel. In verse fourteen of this chapter, David raises a question to the man that brought him the news about the battle between Israel and the Philistines. Part of the news that the Amalekite man shared with David was the fact that Saul and his son, Jonathan, had died in the battle. He then tells David the specifics of how King Saul died. He told David that King Saul had been hit by an arrow and was badly wounded. He then told David that King Saul asked him to finish him off before the enemy got a hold of him. He then told David that, that is exactly what he did. In verse fourteen, David asked the man, "Why were you not afraid to lift your hand to destroy the Lord's Anointed?" This incident is a good example and lesson on what is it that we are to do with the Lord's Anointed.

<u>I. As we examine what will we do with the Lord's Anointed,</u> <u>let us notice in this particular situation just who is the Lord's Anointed!</u>

<u>A. In the first place, the Lord's Anointed is the person that the</u> <u>Lord has chosen and set aside to hold a certain position or carry out a</u> <u>certain task.</u> Whenever God chose those persons, he would send someone, usually a prophet, to advise the person that they had been chosen by God to fulfill a certain position or carry out a task, then he would actually anoint the person with oil as a symbol of their selection by God.

<u>B. Second, in this particular situation the person that had been</u> <u>chosen and set aside as the Lord's Anointed, that David is referring to</u> <u>is of course King Saul.</u> David very clearly calls King Saul as the Lord's Anointed and it was very clearly the prophet and Judge of Israel, Samuel, that God used to reveal to King Saul that God had chosen him to be king, and then proceeded to actually anoint him with oil.

<u>C. Third, I want to notice that regardless of King Saul's many</u> faults and there were many, such as: direct disobedience in not destroying all the Amelakites when God told him to; and trying to kill David, God's next chosen one that David still referred to him as the Lord's Anointed.</u> Now understanding all this will help us to understand what we should do with the Lord's Anointed.

II. As we examine what will you do with the Lord's Anointed, I want us notice the reactions that took place in these verses toward the Lord's Anointed!

<u>A. First, notice the reaction of the Amalekite man who brought</u> <u>the news of King Saul's death.</u> It is first important that we notice the man understood that King Saul was the Lord's Anointed. This meant that whatever he did to King Saul, he knew he was doing it to the Lord's Anointed.

Next, this man wasn't afraid to talk as though he had killed King Saul. Now, we know from the previous chapters, that he actually didn't but he made out like he did.

Then finally, he revealed what he was really doing with the Lord's Anointed and that was simply trying to use him as a means of benefiting himself either by gaining property, power or position from David. He thought David would be glad that he finished off Saul.

<u>B. Now in contrast to this, notice David's reaction toward the</u> <u>Lord's Anointed.</u> In the first place, David and his men wept, moaned and fasted over the news of the Lord's Anointed death. Next, David reacted by condemning the Amalekite man who claimed to finish off the Lord's Anointed, and had him executed. It is also obvious that David forgave King Saul, the Lord's Anointed, by the previous reaction. Then finally, David wrote a song in honor of King Saul, the Lord's Anointed, and caused his men to sing it along with him.

III. Now let me tie all this together in my final point, as we examine what will you do with the Lord's Anointed by bringing this all down to where we are today. You see when we come to the New Testament, we discover just who is the ultimate Anointed One of the Lord. Of course, it is none other that Jesus Christ himself. He is the Lord's Anointed One. You see his name, Christ, means Anointed One and it is found 529 times in the New Testament.

The real question today is what will you do with Christ the ultimate Anointed One? For if one man could lose his life for how he reacted toward a very imperfect Anointed One of God, and if David could honor this very imperfect Anointed One of God, how much more should we be afraid to make light of the perfect Anointed One and how much more should we praise, honor, accept, serve and declare the ultimate perfect Anointed One, Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. So, what will you do with Jesus Christ, His Anointed One? Will you be destroyed because you reject Him; refuse Him; make light of Him? Or will you recognize Him for who He is and trust Him and honor and find life?

Conclusion: Let us hear the question Jesus asked His disciples and the answer Peter gave Him in Matthew 16:13-20, "When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, "Who do people say the Son of Man is?"

They replied, "Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, Jeremiah or one of the prophets."

"But what about you?" he asked. "Who do you say I am?"


Simon Peter answered, "You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God."

Jesus replied, "Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, for this was not revealed to you by flesh and blood, but by my Father in heaven. And I tell you that you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not overcome it. I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven; whatever you bind on earth will be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth will be loosed in heaven." Then he ordered his disciples not to tell anyone that he was the Messiah.
