Tastor Ralph's Desk:



A Challenge to His Honor

(Malachi 1:6-14)

Intro: Last week we began examining from the Book of Malachi a challenge to God's Honor. What we looked at first was God's affirmation of His honor. First, He affirms that we should honor Him and second He affirms why we should honor Him. We should honor Him plain and simple because of who He is. Seven times He said to Israel in these verses that He was the Lord Almighty. The second reason why we should honor Him is because of the relationship He has allowed us to have. It is a relationship where we get to call Him our Father and that means we are His children. Also, He is our Father and we are His children because of His actions, not our own. Third, we found out that we were to honor Him because one day all nations and people will.

II. Today as we examine a challenge to His honor, I want us to notice Israel's objection to His honor.

We have already examined God's affirmation of His honor. Now we want to see how Israel and how we object to His honor.

A, First, notice with me the problem with their objection.

Well, the problem was that they weren't even aware of the fact that they were objecting His honor. In other words, they didn't realize that they were dishonoring His name. They had grown so cold and callous in their faith, commitment, service and worship of the Lord that they even objected to the fact that they were dishonoring Him. They went so far as to ask God to prove that they had

and they did not really believe that He could.

We see this even today. We have what we call worship, commitment, faith and service but it really does not seem to truly honor the name of the Lord. For as we carry out our honor to Him, we are merely doing it in a fashion that is just another thing we must do. It is a ritual in which we carry out in a cold and callous manner. Yet we are not even aware that we are doing it. As a matter of fact, we would point our fingers to them and say we are doing everything right and just prove that we are not. What a shame that we would challenge the Lord Almighty's assessment of the situation. May the Lord through His Spirit help us to see how we are dishonoring His name especially when we think we are not.

B. Second, notice with me the persons who make the objection.

Well, there is no problem understanding this answer because God plainly states who the persons were. They were the priest. The people who were suppose to be the Spiritual leaders of the people. However, tragically, what the priest did greatly affected what the people did and that is what we see happening in the last verse of the chapter.

Now, there are a couple of lessons we learn from this point. The first lesson we learn is that there is no position that can allow you to even rise above the necessity of honoring the name of the Lord. Whether you are a priest or a pastor or a pope or a president or a prime minister, you have not reached a level in which you can say I am beyond needing to honor God because of the position that I hold.

On the other end of the stick, you are never too low. so to speak. to stop honoring God. Some people believe that because they have not received the fame or the possession or the positions that others hold, they are somehow exempt from having to honor God.


Satan is behind this whole matter of objecting to honoring God. For at one time He was the highest angelic being created by God in Heaven. The Bible tells us that he was an amazing creature. He was powerful, beautiful and popular. He allowed his position to not only think he did not need to honor God, but, rather that he was better than God and could even be God himself. So, instead of giving God the honor, he demanded that it go to him and he has not stopped insisting on it even now. Well, tragically the devil has convinced us that we do not need to honor God either but rather that we can rise to the same level as God Himself and demand praise to ourselves.


Many so called religious leaders have begun placing man on the same level as God. They have done so by downgrading the level of God so that Jesus Christ is not who He said He was, and that man is better than whom God declared him to be. As a matter of fact, the pope just recently said that the cross was a failure of Jesus Christ and also that a good atheist was a redeemed person. By having made these statements, he was giving honor to mankind more that to God. As a matter of fact, he was dishonoring God.

Ask yourself a question, are you truly honoring God or have you grown cold and callous in your faith? Just simply remember that God is God and you are not and that is because God is God, you are not. Don't challenge His honor but rather, relish in His honor.
