From Pastor Ralph's Desk:

Should We Be Celebrating Christmas?

Intro: I wanted us to consider the question of whether we should be celebrating the Christmas story as Believers? I ask this question for two reasons. First, because no where in the Bible does Jesus tell us to celebrate His birth, but He does explicitly tell us to celebrate His death through the means of the Lord's Supper. The second reason why is because some cult groups don't celebrate Christmas and they say that the church didn't start celebrating Christmas until two to three hundred years after His birth.

However, I want to come out with a very loud and clear affirmative yes that God's people should indeed be celebrating the Christmas story. I believe that I can show many reasons why from the Word of God. So, let us see what some of the reasons why we should are.

<u>I. First, we should be celebrating the Christmas story because</u> the Wod of God does.

The Word of God celebrates the Christmas story in both the Old and New Testaments. Isaiah the prophet tells us how the Christ Child would be born of a virgin and be called Immanuel (Is. 7:17). He also tells us that many wonderful things, "Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace" (Is.9:6-7). Then the Old Testament even tells us where the Christ Child would be born. Hundreds of years before His birth, we are already told where it would take place at in "Bethlehem Ephrathah" (Micah 5:2).

However, long before either Isaiah or Micah's prophecies, the first Book of the Bible only there chapters in gives us our first glimpse into the Christmas story. After Adam and Eve have sinned Against God, god promises the consequences of their sin. Speaking to the serpent indwelt by the devil, god said, "And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your seed and hers; He will crush your head and you will strike His heel" (Gen. 3:15). The offspring of the serpent would be the devil and his followers but the seed of the woman is referring to a single individual because it then calls Him, "He". The woman I believe is referring to the virgin Mary and her seed is of course Jesus Christ who alone has the power and did indeed crush the serpent.

So, as we see the Old Testament has much to say about the Christmas story thousands of years before it happens. But then, of course, we don't have to say much about the Christmas story in the New Testament because we are already well aware of it. Very clearly Matthew and Luke's gospels plainly tell us the story of the birth of our Savior. Also, though John doesn't mention the specific characters of the Christmas story, he clearly lets us know that His birth took place when he tells us that, "the Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us" (John 1:14).

Many folks tell us that the Christmas story wasn't important to the early believers because Paul didn't mention it. However, that is not true, Paul tells us in Gal. 4:4-5, "But when the time had fully come, God sent His Son, born of a woman (The Virgin Mary), born under the law, to redeem those under the law that we might receive the full right of sons." So, Paul mentions who His virgin birth and Matthew, Luke and John who mentions the Christmas story are the early Believers. So, the Word of God and the Old and New Testament Believers recognized and celebrated the Christmas story. If it is good enough for the Word of God, it ought to be for us as well.

II. Second, we should be celebrating the Christmas story because the actual participants in the Christmas story did.

Now, simply what I by this point is that the actual person involved the first Christmas celebrated the great news of the Savior's birth. Mary, upon receiving the news went and met her cousin, Elizabeth, who was six months pregnant with John the Baptist. It was during this visit that John in his mother's womb leaped for joy when Mary entered the home and Elizabeth herself filled with the Holy Spirit worshipped the child Mary was carrying, actually calling Him Lord because that is who He was and is and will ever be. Then Mary herself broke out in singing over the whole event. (Luke 1:39-56) So, celebrating began by the Christmas story individual even before Jesus was born.

Now, there is no need for me to go over all of the rest of them be-

cause the fact for their celebrating the first Christmas is well established, Joseph, the angels, the shepherds and the wise men. All of the persons really cover the bases. With their names, we have both Heaven and earth together celebrating His birth. We also have the rich (the wise men), and the poor (Mary, Joseph and the shepherds) celebrating His birth. We also have the lowest of the low (the shepherds) and the highest of the high (the wise men) celebrating His birth.

There are also a couple more persons often left out when it comes to celebrating the Christmas story who were there at that time and they are a man named Simeon and a senior adult lady named Anna who was a prophetess. Both of these persons were at the temple the day that Mary and Joseph brought baby Jesus to the temple to get him circumcised according to Jewish law. He was just eight days old. Both of them right off, by the Spirit's leadership, knew that this was the coming Messiah which the Jews had been looking for and both of them worshipped the Child and acknowledged that He was both Lord and Savior. (Luke 2:21-40)

Now, if everyone that was there at the actual first Christmas event worshipped and celebrated that first Christmas, then there is no doubt that we need to.

III. Third, we should be celebrating the Christmas story because of its' connection to the rest of His story.

Or I probably should say to the rest of the events of His life. We are calling it the Christmas story and the other parts of His walking on earth as a story but we mean a story that was real not made up. There are actual events that took place that make up His story, and all these events connect together. You can't have one of them without the other. You see the critics say Jesus told us to only celebrate His death, not His birth. Well, if we are going to use that argument then we shouldn't celebrate Easter, either because Jesus didn't tell us to celebrate His resurrection.

Well nobody told the early believers not to celebrate His resurrection because they did and they did so quickly afterwards and never stopped celebrating it.

You see Jesus death without the resurrection would be of no service to any of us. Nor would His death save any of us without Him being born of a virgin which was essential. For He had to be without sin to be our sacrifice. Thus His virgin birth was required. So, to celebrate one event was to celebrate them all.

IV. Fourth, we should celebrate the Christmas story because of what it means to us. (Luke: 8-14)

In these set of verses, the angels tell the shepherds that the Christmas story was great news of great joy for all the people. Then he goes on to tell them that the great news was that a Savior had been born to you and that He is

Christ the Lord. So, notice this news is for all the people and this Savior was born to you. This means the Christmas story is for us. Without, we would have no redemption but because of it, we do have redemption. So, it would be sinful not to celebrate such a great event that effects the salvation of our souls.

Concl. Oh, let us come out every Christmas with songs, sermons, plays and events that proudly display our praise and worship that our Savior has been born.
