From Pastor Ralph's Desk:

The Best Things You Can Do For Your Children

Ex. 2:1-10

Intro: Moses was indeed one of the greatest leaders of all time. There is no one that I know who would argue that point. For through God's leadership he led possibly as many as two to four million people through the wilderness for forty years. This was one of the greatest accomplishments of all time.

Now the man that he was clearly was the result of God's work in his life. However, of course, one of the ways God worked in his live and ours is through other Godly people. One of the persons that God used to greatly impact Moses' life was his mother as well as his father. These two persons show us how to do the right things for our children both before and after they are conceived and born that will impact their lives for God's glory. So, let us look at what are the best things we can do for our children.

I. First, let us notice the best things we can do for our children before we have our children.

There are three our four things I want us to notice that we should do for our children before they are born. These are the things that Moses' parents did for him before they had him.

A. The first thing Moses' parents did and we should do before having our children was and is to have a Christian home.

Both of Moses' parents were of the house of Levi. This was the tribe that went on to serve as priests and workers in the Tabernacle. Clearly, however, the author of Hebrews tells us that, "By faith Moses' parents hid him for three months after he was born..." (Heb. 11:23). So, this verse lets us know that they were people of faith. That faith was centered in God and this made their home a Christian home. A home built on faith.

If you want your children to be children of faith, then the best thing you can do is to do is to become people of faith so that you then can instruct them in and guide them by the faith that you have already established before they even come along. So, have you moms and dads committed your life to Jesus Christ to begin your life of faith?

B. The second thing Moses 'parents did and we should do before having our children was and is to have a Christian marriage. (vs. 1)

"Now a man of the house of Levi married a Levite woman." it doesn't say that they decided to live together for a while. It doesn't say that they decided just to shack up together. No, it says they got married, end of story.

So, you ask why is this so important? What's so important about a wedding ceremony and signing the marriage license" Well, the answers are first of all that the wedding ceremony, whether small or large, in a church, courthouse or outside, says to those who witnessed it that you have made the commitment before God and man that lets them know you are married. Secondly, it brings a far greater commitment to the marriage because you do go through the ceremony and sign the marriage license which declare you are husband and wife. If you just live together you can easily walk out any time you want because you didn't make the vows toward one another before God and man.

There are two other important matters in their Christian marriage. First, they chose to marry persons of like faith. They were a man of the house of Levi and a woman of the house of Levi. Now, let me point out that I am not saying that you have to marry someone of the same denomination or same church but I am saying be sure to marry someone else who indeed is a born again Believer in Jesus Christ. This will greatly enhance your ability to raise your children for Christ.

The other thing that tragically we have to deal with today is when it comes to having a Christian marriage is that it must be only between a man and a woman. It says a man of the house of Levi married a woman of the house of Levi. There is not one place in all of the Word of God that condones marriage between persons of the same sex. As a matter of fact, it only and I emphasize only condemns any act of homosexuality. Our Lord loves the person that struggle with this form of sin and if they turn to Him, He can help them to rise above the struggle of this sin and live victoriously.

C. The third thing Moses' parents did and we must do before having our children is to decide to have our children.

The children of Israel had been in bondage to the Egyptians for nearly four hundred years. However, even though they were slaves they managed to continue to multiply and this frightened the Egyptians. They were afraid they would be able to get enough of their own people to conquer them. Therefore, they demanded that anytime a baby boy was born to an Israelite family, they were to take that boy and throw him in the Nile River

Well, praise God for the faith of Moses' parents, that would not allow them to feed their son to the crocodiles. Against the edict of the king, they made the only choice that godly parents can make regardless of the outcome and that was and is to let your children live. For God is the One who created the means by which children are brought into the world and that begins at conception. Let me list some of the references for you to go and read. Here they are: Psalm 51:5; 139:13-16; Jeremiah 1:4-5; Matthew 1:18-23; Luke 1:31. So, a Christian home and marriage will lead you not to abort your children but instead rejoice at receiving them.

Abortion is a sin that our God certainly can forgive but we must understand that it carries with it some terrible consequences. As a nation and indeed on the people of God, we must reject it and seek to defeat it. If you are hurting because you have had one, then cry out for forgiveness and healing from the Lord.

II. Second, let us notice the best things we can do for our children after they are born.

There are three things I want us to see that Moses' parents did after he was born that we too should do for our children after they are born.

A. The first thing that Moses' parents did and we should do after they are born is to look at them with real admiration. (vs. 2)

This verse tells us that when Moses' mother gave birth to him she saw that he was a fine and good child. They saw that their child They saw that their child was a gift from God. I did not see him as a disturbance to their lives or as an inconvenience. As hard as it was, they were grateful and loved him. How do you see your children? My prayer is that you see them with admiration.

B. The second thing that Moses' parents did that we should do for our children after they are born is to have the right attitude.

Now the right attitude that they had was to determine that they would do everything within their human power that they possibly could do to protect their children. They fed him, clothed him, rocked him and hid him to the best of their ability. Humanly speaking, they couldn't do anymore than they were doing. Now ultimately it wasn't enough but it was their absolute best.

We too, need to have the right attitude that we humanly too will do our absolute best for our children. Our attitude must be that our children are our responsibility and we must do everything we can to provide for them and protect them. Can you say that is what you are doing for your children?

C. The third thing Moses' parents did that we should after our children are born is to take the right actions.

Now the action that I am referring to is what Moses' mother did once she realized that all of her own human effort was not enough to protect her son from being discovered. At that point the Bible tells us that she got a basket made from papyrus reed and then she water proofed the basket with tar and pitch. She then placed baby Moses in the basket and took him down to the edge of the Nile River and placed him among the reeds that grow on the edge of the river. She then walked away.

Now le me tell you what she was doing. She was placing her son in the arms of Jesus. When God told Noah to build an ark, He told him to waterproof it with tar and pitch. Noah did as God had instructed him. So, when the floods came, the only persons safe were Noah and his family because they were in the ark. What Noah and his family had done was to place themselves in the hands of Jesus because they had listened to Him. I believe that maybe Moses' mother had thought about the story of Noah and his family. She thought how God took care of

Noah and his family in the ark. So, I believe that Moses' mother said I have done everything I humanly possibly can and it is still not enough. So, like Noah, she decided to build her own ark and waterproof it with tar and pitch and place her son in it trusting him now to the care of our Lord. That is why she was able to walk away because she knew he was safe in the arms of Jesus.

Like Moses' mother, we must do all that we can for our children but we must also realize that it is never enough. There comes times in our lives that we must say Lord, all my efforts are not enough but you are so to the best of our ability we want to place them in your hands and ask you to do what we can't. Have you placed your children in the arms of Jesus?

Concl: The good news is that when she put Moses in the hands of the Lord, He took over. He rescued Moses by placing everybody in the bright placer at the right moment. If we will keep on taking our children to Jesus, we can trust Him with the places and the times and the persons. There is no better place then being safe is the arms of Jesus.
