

From Pastor Ralph's Desk:

The Voice, The Vision, The Victory (Part I)

Revelation 1:9-20

Intro: There are times that we have what we consider some amazing worship experiences that just seem to, as the expression goes, just blows us away.

Well, John had one of those worship experiences that literally blew him away, so to speak, and we have the privilege of enjoying the experience with him because he recorded for us to be able to know what he saw. If we had been there with him, we too would have been blown away as well. Let our prayer be that our study of this awesome worship experience will give us the sense of being there with John.

You know there is a very important lesson to learn from John's experience and that is that you will miss out on great experiences with God when you are not worshipping Him as John was doing on the Lord's day. The Bible says that God inhabits the praises of His people. So, as John was worshipping, the Holy Spirit took control of him. This allows John to hear the voice of Jesus. It also allowed him to see the vision of Jesus and finally it allowed him to understand the victory of Jesus Christ. Today, we will begin our study of the remainder of this chapter by examining the voice that John heard and in the following weeks we will look at the vision he saw and victory he revealed. I am simply calling these messages, "The Voice, The Vision, The Victory."

I. First, let us take a look at the voice that John heard.

The first thing that John experienced during his unbelievable worship experience was that he heard a voice. Now, we know without any doubt that the voice, vision and victory belong to Jesus. We know this because, first, no one else could be described in the manner that John describes Him unless it is the glorious Son of God.

Second, however we know that this is Jesus because the context itself reveals that the voice, vision and victory belongs to Jesus. It doesn't mention His name Jesus in the verses that we are examining but they do give us a description that we know to be facts that only belong to Jesus. Verse seventeen tells us that this person is the one who is "the Living One." He is the One who was dead but is now, "alive forever and ever." Now, no one has conquered death but Jesus Christ our risen Lord and Savior. Amen.

Now we learn an important lesson right here about the Book of Revelation and that is that when we find a vision or symbol in the book, keep reading because almost always the context will eventually have the answer to the vision or symbol we've read. If you don't find it in the immediate context then you will probably find it a chapter or two later. If not, then it can be found in the Word of God somewhere.

Now, let us examine what these verses tell us about the voice of our Blessed Lord that John heard.

<u>A. First, I want us to recognize that His voice was meant to</u> be clearly recognized. (vs. 10,15)

By this I mean that His voice was clearly heard. Regardless of the fact that John by this time, its' believed to be in his nineties possibly even a hundred, thus most likely hard of hearing, he had no problem picking our Savior's voice. To John, it sounded like a trumpet was being played, or as he said in verse fifteen, like the sound of rushing waters.

Both of these sounds are very familiar to me. I grew up in the mountains around many waterfalls and my daughter Amanda played the trumpet in band.

Now trumpets were used for many, many years to get people's attention that either someone of great importance was coming through or was about to speak. What his tells us is that the Lord is speaking loudly because He wants us to understand that He and His message is to be taken seriously. He is not just a person of renown but rather He tops the scale of all who are considered renown. As a matter of fact, no one else is even in the same boat. Therefore, He must have our attention.

The rushing water reminds us of being near a large water fall. When you are close to one the only voice you hear is the falls themselves. So, it is that Jesus is letting us know that the only voice we need to hear is His. It is the only one that matters. Are you listening? Are

you paying attention?

Also, I believe that His voice is loud because He wants all to hear His message. Our Lord is not trying to hide Himself. No, He is speaking loudly. As a matter of fact, He's been speaking loudly for a long time. All the way back to the Book of Psalm, we are reminded from King David that, "The heavens declare the glory of God. The skies proclaim the work of His hands. Day after day, they pour forth speech; night after night they display knowledge. "There is no speech or language where their voice is not heard. Their voice goes out into all the earth, their words to the ends of the world." (Ps. 19:1-4)

So His voice is heard in creation loudly. It is heard from His Word strongly. It is heard from His people and finally it is heard through His Spirit. Oh, praise His name that HE cares enough to get His voice out to all of us. Help all to be good listeners.

<u>B. Second, I want us to recognize that His voice was to be re-</u> corded and was recorded. (vs. 11,19)

The Lord told John to write down what he saw on a scroll. This was the first of twelve times in the Book of Revelation that he was told to write down what he saw and heard. So, once again, God is saying that what He was saying was to be taken so seriously that it had to be written down.

Also, it was written down not only to indicate that the Lord's message was totally serious, but also so that the message wouldn't be forgotten and so the message could be passed on down to following generations until Jesus comes back again.

Eventually what John recorded from the things he saw and heard and experienced became a part, as a matter of fact the closing part, of God's Holy Word, the Bible. So, when we open the pages of the Book of Revelation and as people we must, we do with excitement because this blessed book came from the Lord and we do in a serious manner. Also, Because John is recording what he received from the Lord God Almighty. This blessed book we call the Bible should and should alone be our only source of authority. Oh, praise be to our blessed Lord that He made sure that His Word was recorded for our benefit.

<u>C. Third, I want us to recognizer that His voice was and is meant</u> to be read.

God told John to write down what he saw and send it to the seven churches in Asia Minor. Now the question is, what were those churches suppose to do with these writings that John sent them? Were they suppose to place them in a good canister and then display that canister in some kind of see through display and then allow the people to parade by and say wow we got to see the canister that holds the sacred writings that the Apostle John received from the Lord.

Well, obviously we know that's not the reason why John sent the letters to the churches. Yet that's how we often treat not only the Book of Revelation but the whole Bible. It is only meant to be for display purposes. Well, of course, it is not. It is meant to be read, studied, preached and lived. In our present chapter, we are told, "blessed is the one who reads the Words of this prophesy, and blessed are those who hear it and take to heart what is written in it because the time is near." (1:3)

Also, in the last chapter of the Book, God told John, "Do not seal up the words of the prophesy of this book because the time is near." (22:10)

In other words, don't put it in a display but rather record it; read it; share it; and be blessed by it. Are you reading and sharing it? Fourth, I want us to recognize that His voice ultimately is meant to bring redemption. (vs. 12,17-18)

John, when he heard the voice and saw the visions, he fell on his face fearing for his very life. However, the Lord reached over to John with His right hand touching him and said, "Do not be afraid. I am the First and the Last. I am the living one; I was dead, and behold I am alive for ever and ever! And I hold the keys of death and Hades." (vs. 17-18) So, as we see from this God is primarily speaking the words of the Book of Revelation and the words of the entire Bible because He wants to draw all men unto Him. He wants to bring redemption to their lives.

Concl. So, let us read this book and share this book and preach this book so that it will lead people to the One who was dead but now is alive forevermore giving eternal life to those who call upon Him for redemption.


