From Pastor Ralph's Desk:

The Voice, The Vision, The Victory (Part VI)

Revelation 1:9-20

Intro: in our topic of the victory that belongs to the church, we've already noticed several ways in which the church has absolute and complete victory. Let me remind us of the ways that we've already examined that victory belongs to the church. First, we noticed that the church has victory because of the priority that has been given to the church from Christ. Second, we noticed that victory belongs to the church because of the place where we find the church, which happens to be in the hand of Jesus and as well Jesus is in their midst. Third, we've seen that victory belongs to the church because of how precious is the church to Christ. He referred to us with the most precious and valuable type of metal out there, gold. And He purchased us with His very own blood. That is how precious we are to Him. Fourth, victory belongs to the church because of the prayers being lifted up for the church. Since we see that Jesus is wearing a robe, we are reminded that Jesus is our great High Priest. As a great High Priest, He is interceding to the Father on our behalf twenty four hours a day. Fifth, victory belongs to the church because of the proclamation given to the church from Christ. This long robe that He wears let's us know that He is not only our great High Priest but also our permanent prophet. As a prophet, He speaks God's Word to us directly and personally through the Holy Word of God. Today, we will examine another way that victory belongs to the church through our victorious Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

<u>F. Sixth, let us notice that victory belongs to the church because the power that rules over the church.</u>

One more time we are going to take notice of the long robe Jesus is wearing in the vision John had. We've noted that in the Old Testament, the highest wore a long robe indicating that Jesus is our great High Priest. We also noted that prophets wore long robes also indicating that Jesus is our permanent prophet. However, there was one more person in the Old Testament who wore a long robe and that was the king. So, Jesus is not only our

Great High Priest and our permanent prophet but He is also our all powerful eternal King. As this Book tells us, "The King of kings and Lord of lords."

Now when Gabriel announced to Mary that she would give birth to a Son, and that she was to call Him Jesus. He also told her that her Son would rule over, "the throne his father David; and He will reign over the home of Jacob forever; His kingdom will never end." (Luke 1:32-33). Then the wise men came from the east seeking the One who was born King of the Jews. (Matt. 2:1-2). Also, when Jesus entered Jerusalem in His triumphal entry, the throng of people that greeted Him and cheered Him and hailed Him like a King. When He was arrested the soldiers mocked Him as though He were a King. Then as He faced His trial before Pilate, He was asked by Pilate if He were King of the Jews? Jesus' response was, "Yes it is as you say." (Matt. 27:11).

However, One thing seems to have blown His whole Kingship and Kingdom completely out of the water, so to speak, when He was crucified on the old rugged cross, He can't be the eternal King over all of creation if He's dead.

Oh, but praise be to our blessed majestic King because on that third day following His crucifixion, He got up out of the grave in the sight of all the angels of glory, and the one that had planned to take His place as King, we call him Satan, couldn't hold Him down. No, not him nor all of his satanic force could keep Him in that grave. In their plain view He arose victoriously displaying in the open view that only one has been, is, and will ever be King of kings and Lord of lords and His name is Jesus Christ our Lord.

We often, as preachers, preach on the Great Commission. The tragedy is that when we preach on the Great Commission, we usually begin in the wrong place. We need to start at least one verse earlier that we usually begin. We usually begin with, "Therefore go and make disciples..." (Matt. 28:19). However, the most important verse is verse eighteen. It is the key to not only the Great Commission but also to everything else that we do or experience in life. This is what that verse says, "Then Jesus came to them and said, 'All authority in Heaven and in earth has been given to Me." (Matt. 28:18). So, Jesus is saying because I have all authority in all places because I am the exalted, everlasting King, you must and you can do the Great Commission. This would also apply to all situations in our lives. Because our King has all authority, then we have the power available to live life as He intended us to and power enough to deal with the blows of life.

I like the way one writer said it. He said, "Christ's kingly of-fice provides us with a wealth of comfort and assurance. For while the nations rage one against another; while the earth groans beneath our feet; while there is sickness, disease, and economic hardship (Matt. 24:3 ff.) Even now our Lord is ruling and reigning, until he makes his enemies his footstool (I Cor. 15:22-27). And so while unbelievers may look around at these world conditions and see the apparent chaos as an excuse to scoff, saying, 'where is this 'coming' he promised?' (2 Pet. 3:3-4), the believer can take heart, for the signs of the end are exactly that. The tumult we see around us is, in fact, proof that Christ is reigning and that he is directing all of history toward a great and final consummation, when he will come with great glory with his angels, as the great conquering king (! Thess. 4:13-5:11)."

Oh child of God, let us rejoice that one day every leader, power, authority, king, emperor, president and etc... will bow down at the feet of Jesus and acknowledge that He is King of kings and Lord of lords. We indeed have victory because we belong to the King of the ages.
