

From Pastor Ralph's Desk:

The Worship of Heaven

(Rev. 5:1-14)

Intro: There is a vast difference between the activities of Heaven and the activities on earth. Tonight will be a great example of what I am referring to. Millions upon millions will be tuned into their televisions to watch the playing of Super Bowl LIII. Bars all across the country will be packed and all their tv's will be showing the game. Homes will be hosting parties for families, neighbors and friends. People will be wearing their favorite teams memorabilia. For several hours they will watch closely, scream loudly, cheer boldly or fuss angrily.

However, on the opposite end of the evening most churches across America will be half-filled and many won't even be opened. Very few even this morning will be in our services across America will sit still for no more than an hour as we worship our Lord. They will not get excited about the singing, giving or preaching. They will instead sit there squirming around looking at their watches just wondering when are we going to get out of this place. As a matter of fact, they come to church already thinking I hope we can hurry and get out of this place. Worship of our Lord really means so little to these folks. The activities of this world consume them. One writer I read said, "For many Christians Heaven is an unreal place." (Walvood).

However, John's experience in Heaven reveals that the focus of Heaven is worship, no ifs ands or buts. So, if the focus of Heaven is worship, how much more should the focus of God's people here on earth be about worship? I want us to join in on this worship scene in Heaven and join the Heavenly choir and discover how they worship in Heaven and how we need to do here on earth. My message is simply The Worship of Heaven.

I. First, let us notice that all the worship in Heaven focuses upon one person.

The worship service in Heaven breaks loose when the Lamb who looked as if He had been slain took the sealed scroll from the Hand of God the Father seated on the Heavenly Throne. At the moment He received the scroll the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb and began singing a new song. This song was not general or generic. It was rather personal because they began the song with the personal pronoun "You". Of course, they meant the Lamb. It was Him that they were singing about. The question is who is the "You" or who is the "Lamb"? The answer is simple. We have already answered in previous messages but in case you're not sure, just look at the song they sang. There is no doubt that there is only one person they were referring to. The Lamb that was slain and poured out His blood to purchase men from everywhere was none other than the Lord Jesus Christ Himself. There were no songs about the celebrities in Hollywood, or the celebrities in professional sports or the politicians in Washington, D.C.

Nor were there songs about the great Saints of old and present. No, it is all about Jesus the Lamb slain from the foundation of the earth. Let us sing and worship with the Heavenly choir that no one is worthy of our praise other than the Lord Jesus Christ. He and He alone must always be exalted.

II. Second, let us notice that all the worship of Heaven focused upon one purpose.

The obvious question is what was that one purpose? Well, again that is a simple answer. The answer is that the purpose of their worship was the activities of Almighty God. Their songs and sayings were all about what Christ the Lord has done on our behalf. The only activities of mankind mentioned are the worship and praise they are doing of the Lamb who has been slain on our behalf.

Both chapters four and five, we read about four songs or sayings that are all about who God is and what He has accomplished. He is Holy and eternal. He is our Creator and Redeemer. He alone is praise and honored in this worship scene.

The tragedy is that so many religious groups give Jesus a role and a place in their religion but He is not everything. He only goes so far. Then according to these groups, mankind themselves, must do the rest. It is Jesus plus man's accomplishments. However, in Heaven the accomplishments that are worthy of praise are God's and God's alone. Worship is not about tooting our own horns but rather about tooting His horn.

Paul tells us that our salvation is nothing that we can brag about at all. "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith, and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God not by works, so that no one can boast." (Eph. 2:8-9).

Paul also tells us that one day the whole universe will exalt and worship just one and that one is Jesus Christ our Lord. "Therefore God exalted Him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee shall bow in Heaven and on earth, and under the earth and every tongue shall confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (Phil. 2:9-11). Jesus did it all so all the praise belongs to Him.

III. Third, let us notice that all the worship in Heaven is the work of God's people. It is God's people who are the beneficiary of the creative and redemptive work of Jesus Christ not the other way around. Therefore, it is we who join in with the living creatures, the angelic host, the twenty-four elders who represent the church of all times and places and myriads who represent ad number of uncountable. Let us therefore immediately begin doing what we will do for eternity exalting the Lord Jesus Christ. As a matter of fact, let us not stop worshipping when we leave today. Rather, let our lives be a constant worship service to our Lord Jesus Christ. The way Paul says it is that our lives are to be a living sacrifice which is our reasonable act of worship. (Rom. 12:1-2).

IV. Fourth, let us notice that all the worship of Heaven is demonstrated with great power. By this I mean that all the force s of Heaven was focused upon this worship. Worship in Heaven was powerful, strong and carried with every means available. The whole of Heaven either said it or sang it, or played it or fell down before Him or lifting their hands to Him. Earth has never experienced such a service. However, may it be the desire, drive, goal

And effort of the church here on earth to worship our blessed Lord with all the means, power and force that has been granted us from God. May it be said at Great Swamp or about Great Swamp Baptist Church that our worship literally raised the roof off of our building and that the community around us both hears and sees our praise to Jesus Christ our Lord.

Concl. When the time finally comes and Christ Jesus our Lord has fulfilled all that the remainder of the Book reveals, He will do to claim His heritage that the Father promised Him in the sealed scroll, then we literally will experience this great worship service before us. But let us don't wit. Let us get started.



Operation Christmas Child




