

From Pastor Ralph's Desk:

The First More to Come (Part 1)

(Rev. 8: 1-13)

Intro: Now we are grateful for the mercies that God introduces in the midst of judgment which we have examined over the last two weeks. Particularly as we looked at chapter seven, we discovered that outside of the cross of Calvary in which Jesus suffered for all of our sins, the greatest act of mercy in judgment will take place during the tribulation period when God causes a cessation of His judgment in order to select, save, and reel a large group of people unto Himself. The Bible says that the number will be so large that it will be uncountable. So, while we are shocked by the overwhelming judgment, which by the way is deserved, we are totally blown away by God's amazing work of mercy in the midst of judgment.

However, we can also praise our Lord that there is another great act of mercy in the midst of this powerful work of judgment of the great tribulation. This other great act of mercy is the fact that the Lord is limiting the great tribulation to only seven years. Not it will be the most intense seven years ever but it will only be seven years. So, we thank our Lord for this act of mercy.

However, we can't forget that even though mercy will be demonstrated, still it will predominantly be a time of unparallel judgment. That is why it is called the great tribulation. But with the six seal judgments, we already examined, we would have guessed that that has to be all the judgments that God is going to release. How wrong our guess would be if we figured it stopped with the judgments we've already examined. No, there is more to come. There is more to come because what we have already examined with the six seals, they were not enough to accomplish the work that needs to be done. As a matter of fact, there are two more to come. Today, we will begin looking at the first more to come. The first more to come begins when the Lord Jesus Christ opens up the seventh seal which will release seven more events of judgment. They will be called the trumpet judgments.

I. First, let us notice that the first more to come begins with silence in Heaven. Of course in chapter four we discovered that the Apostle John was transported up to Heaven and before the throne of God so that he could receive the rest of the Book of Revelation. Then in turn he would come back and share it with us. So, far we've examined three chapters of what John was experiencing up in Heaven while receiving the words of this blessed Book. In those three chapters, one thing we know for sure is that John experienced sound and lots of it. Now of course, it was all good, but there was plenty of it. The sounds that he heard were speaking, singing, shouting, worshipping, praising, voices of thunder and many others. These glorious sounds were continuous.

However, all of a sudden all goes quiet and not just on the western front but all over Heaven. The Bible tells us here that this silence lasted for a period of about a half an hour. My pastor friends tell me that is why they know that there won't be any preachers or women in Heaven, Ha! Ha! or LOL! But in all seriousness, we need to ask the question why was their silence in Heaven the seventh seal was opened? Well k, it is like the calm before the storm. It is really more like the silence that takes place in a courtroom when everyone is waiting and anticipating the verdict to be announced concerning the case before the court.

Well, this is exactly what is happening in Heaven. All of Heaven is quieting down as we see the judgment that is now about to be poured out upon the earth. In light of the wrath of God about to be poured out with such fury, all Heaven could do was to speak with silence. Silence became the loud voice in their hearts and minds of, Oh My!

However, let me say that there is a good silence as well. A silence like when you head to the wilderness to get away from it all. A silence from the pressures of life when we just relax and unwind in the stillness and quiet of the wilderness. Well, ultimately, God will give us a permanent sense of quiet with everlasting peace. Blessed be the name of our Lord.

II. Second, let us notice that the first more to come will come with a sound in Heaven. Once the seventh seal is opened, silence first takes place. However, that silence will come to an end with the sound of a trumpet. As a matter of fact, we are told that there are seven of them, one for each of the seven angels before the throne.

Now, throughout history and particularly in the nation of Israel as we discover in the Word of God, that the trumpet was the most used instrument by this nation, and it was by many other nations as well. It was used for many reasons. They used them to alarm the nation of incoming enemies. They were used by the military to instruct the soldiers. They were used to announce the beginning of religious festivals and to announce important news. From the New Testament we know that the Lord will use the sounding of a trumpet to announce the rapture of the church. In our present situation, the trumpet is announcing that the day of judgment is about to begin.

Now, let us examine our own lives to see and know which trumpet we'll hear. Will we hear the trumpet call of the rapture to call out the Church of the Living Christ, which is His bride, to come up to Heaven to forever be with Him? Praise the Lord! (I Thess. 4:13-18). Or will you hear the trumpet sound for the warning of in coming judgment from God during the Tribulation? If you've accepted Jesus Christ as your personal Lord and Savior, then you are promised that it will be the trumpet sound of the rapture which you will hear.

Concl. Now, let me close by challenging us to sound the trumpet of warning to our world today. Let us warn them of the upcoming tribulation that the world is going to face. Let us warn them that there is a hell to avoid.

However, just as the trumpet was used not only as a means of warning but also as a means to announce news. Let us sound the trumpet of announcement and announce to the world there is good news and the good news is that through repentance and faith in Jesus Christ our Lord we will avoid both hell and the tribulation. Praise the Lord. So, what are you waiting for? Start sounding the trumpet.




