

From Pastor Ralph's Desk:

The Redeemed of the Tribulation

(Rev. 6: 12-17)

Intro: in our last message, we took a look at various examples in the Word of God where the Lord introduced mercy in the midst of judgment. Those examples included the world-wide flood of Noah's day; the destruction of Sodom and Gomorrah; the defeat of Jericho; and the final plague on Egypt during the days of Pharaoh. In all these judgments brought on by the Lord, mercy was also introduced into each of these events. These mentioned are just a few of many others found in the Word of God.

Now the purpose last time for pointing out these acts of mercy in the midst of judgment was to prepare us for what we will be examining today in Revelation chapter seven. For in today's Scripture, outside of the judgment that took place at Calvary and the mercy introduced in the midst of that judgment, the greatest act of mercy that will ever be displayed will come during the greatest period of judgment the world will ever know, the Great Tribulation. During this

Greatest period of judgment, God will introduce mercy by bringing a myriad of souls to salvation. This is exactly what we discover taking place in our present chapter. So, let us take a look at what I am calling simply The Redeemed of the Tribulation.

I. First, let us notice that the redeemed of the Tribulation will experience cessation of the wrath of God. (vs. 1-3). What we discover is that for a temporary period of time, the Lord ceases His judgment to introduce mercy in the midst of judgment which results in an uncountable number of persons coming to Jesus.

The four angels standing at the four corners of the earth represent the four directions on earth, which of course are east, west, north and south. Our winds move in these directions which in turn moves the weather patterns around the globe. These winds are a powerful force since they can move weather with speed and at times violently.

However, God commands the angels to hold back this tremendous source of power so that no harm would come upon the earth for a brief period of time so that He can carry out His amazing out of mercy in the midst of this strong period of Tribulation. This stopping of the winds represent the cessation of God's wrath which we've been examining in the opening of the first six seals of judgment.

As we've said already many times in this study it is really not God's desire to have to bring about great judgment. However, because of sin and mankind's continuous rebellion and rejection, God has to carry out judgment to deal with all of these acts of rebellion. But God's judgment is never totally and completely void of God's mercy, grace and love. Also, thank you Lord, that the day will come when you be able to stop all judgment and then full peace will completely rule and reign. Let us praise God now that for the Child of God there is therefore now no condemnation to them that are in Christ Jesus our Lord. (Rom. 8:1)

II. Second, let us notice that the redeemed of the tribulation will be divided into two distinct groups. The first group that the Lord is going to select, seal and protect will be the 144,000 Israelites, 12,000 from each of the twelve tribes of Israel. As we study the four Gospels and the Book of Acts, we discover that God always begins with the Jews first and the Gentiles second. Jesus said to the disciples just before He ascended back to Heaven to be His witnesses beginning in Jerusalem, Judah, Samaria and to the ends of the earth. (Acts 1:8).

So these 144,000 saved Israelites are selected and sealed to be God's special servants of witnessing during a portion of the tribulation period. Because they are sealed, a word indicating ownership plus protection, these servants of God will survive the entire period of tribulation so they can enter into the millennium reign of Christ on earth and repopulate it. God will supernaturally protect this special group of witnesses from all the acts of judgment that He pours out and He supernaturally empowers their witnessing efforts that will result in a second distinct

group, the redeemed during the tribulation.

The second distinct group will be everyone else who is redeemed upon the earth at that time. This group is made up of every nation, tribe, people and language, and this group represents a great multitude. Praise the Lord. This group will include Jews and Gentiles.

Of course, the question is what is different between this group of the redeemed and the first group? Well the answer is two-fold. First the first group is all Jews and the second group is both Jews and Gentiles. The second difference is that the first group will live out the entire period of the tribulation while the second group will be martyred. We find them, "standing before the throne and in front of the Lamb." they are in Heaven along side the church together worshipping and praising God for His great salvation.

Now, let me point out that God always has His witnesses in every age and today in this age of grace, we are His witnesses. May we never forget that we are here for the purpose of bearing witness to the Gospel of Christ.

III. Third, let us notice that the redeemed of the tribulation are all redeemed by the same means. As a matter of fact, it is the same means that all of God's people in all times are redeemed by the Blood of the Lamb. That's exactly what verse fourteen tells us: "And he said, 'There are they who have come out of the great tribulation; they have washed their robes and mad them white in the blood of the Lamb." in the Old Testament, the people were saved by looking forward to the Lamb that would one day be their true sacrificial Lamb, which all of their animal sacrifices only represented. Then in the New Testament, the church is saved by looking at the cross or today back to the cross of Calvary for our salvation. In chapter fice of Revelation, before the martyrs of the tribulation show up, we discover that the church and all the Saints of the Old Testament are there, and together they all sing praises to Jesus Christ our Savior who purchased us with His own blood.

So though we have been distinguished in different groups; Old Testament Saints, the Church, the redeemed of the tribulation, we all have one thing in common, the same means of salvation, which is through the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ our Lord and our repentance and faith which we put 100% in to the work which Jesus Christ accomplished

For us when He poured out His blood on our behalf. Let us unendingly and urgently preach no message other than salvation by grace through faith in Christ alone.

IV. Fourth, let us notice that the redeemed of the tribulation will experience exceeding rewards. (vs. 14-17). Now what I mean by this is that the trials, tribulations, persecutions and martyrdom that the redeemed of the tribulation will experience will in no way exceed the rewards that they will experience when they get to glory. In other words, their rewards exceed their pain beyond measure. For all that they experienced during that time of great tribulation, hunger, thirst, pain, trials, persecution will be so totally reversed that I an sure they will see things for eternity as though they never experienced those things to begin with. I mean they6 will know but they won't know. They will know by knowledge but never again by experience.

For they will be in Heaven serving the Lamb of God who redeemed them. Night and day they will be before His throne, and the One who sits on the throne will forever protect them, feed them, quench their thirst; give them the perfect temperature; and take away all tears from their eyes. He will be their forever Shepherd.

Concl. Now the great news is this, Jesus will give these same rewards to whosoever will come to Him for salvation. Do you want to spend eternity in Heaven in God's protective presence or do you want to spend eternity separated from God in the fires of Hell? Today let this be the day you book your flight to glory by turning all over to Jesus.




