From Tastor Ralph's Desk:

Honoring Our Greatest War Hero

(Isaiah 52: 13-53:12)

Intro: Our nation has done an honorable thing by establishing a holiday that is set aside for the purpose of memorializing the men and women who have paid the ultimate sacrifice in order to keep us free. As long as I am pastor, we will certainly recognize and pay tribute to these great American heroes who have laid down their lives on our behalf so that we can have the freedom to do the things that we do.

Now, however, I want to take time to mention that there is a war hero that we need to honor today who was not an American soldier. As a matter of fact, this war hero was on earth thousands of years before America was even discovered. As a matter of fact, this war hero was around before the foundations of the earth were even laid. But once they were laid, He made the determined decision that one day He would come and fight for our freedom, a freedom that would last for all eternity. This fight led to this great war hero making the greatest sacrifice and paying the greatest price ever paid with when He laid down His life in the greatest battle ever fought. As a matter of fact, this war hero is not just a great war hero but rather the greatest war hero of all times, and today our message is all about honoring Him. The title of my message is simply, Honoring Our Greatest War Hero.

I. First, we honor our greatest war hero because He paid the ultimate price for us. (vs. 4-5.8). In two of these verses, we find the word "Our" mentioned four times. Under the leadership of the Holy Spirit, Isaiah was letting us know that our Lord Jesus Christ was fighting the war that He fought not for His sake but for ours. He did what He did on our behalf. All of the infirmities, sorrows, afflictions, piercings, wounds, oppression and death that He experienced in the great battle of all times was done all for our benefit not His.

So, while we set aside on special holiday a year to honor our heroes who have given their lives for our freedom, let us honor the greatest war hero of all times not just for one weekend a year but everyday of our lives. For what He did on our behalf will last us an eternity. Oh, blessed be our Savior who paid the price on our behalf.

II. Second, we honor our greatest war hero of all times because He paid the ultimate price in spite of us. (vs. 52:14-53:4). When you read these verses you are made totally aware of the fact that humanity had a dim view of our blessed Savior. We considered Him to be totally unattractive. We came to the conclusion that He was a person completely despised by God Himself. Therefore, we despised Him and we took every measure not to exalt Him in any form or fashion. We felt as though all the punishment He was receiving was because He deserved it.

Oh, praise His name that in spite of our attitudes and feelings toward Him, He did not allow them to hold Him back from fighting the good fight of faith and finishing the course on our behalf. When we would have backed out of the whole deal with the kind of attitude He was facing, He kept right on marching forward right into battle.

Our Vietnam Veterans found a situation much like this. Many of the people our nation, at that time, had turned against the men and women who were fighting in this war. While they were over there fighting, the people here were saying awful things about them. Then when they returned home, they were met not with a hero's welcome, but rather with hostility, anger and total resentfulness.

However, in spite of the hostility that they faced there, great men and women who were fighting to stop the spread of socialism and communism carried out their tasks in an exemplary manner.

Now, however, no one has ever faced the amount of hostility that our Savior Jesus Christ faced. But in spite of it all, He fought on until He gained the victory. Oh, what a Savior.

III. Third, we honor our greatest war hero of all times because He paid the ultimate price without us. In the 15 verses that make up our text for this message, you will find the words, He, His, and Him at least 52 times. What this tells us is that our Lord Jesus Christ did all the work necessary and fought all the enemies required to defeat all on His own. As the song says, He could have called thousands upon thousands of angels to come and deliver Him from the cross but He died alone for you and me.

When He was dying on the cross battling the forces of Hell, death and sin, and bearing the punishment the Father poured against our sins, He cried out those very revealing words, "My Father why have you forsaken me." These words let us know how seriously alone Jesus was at the cross. That while He became sin for us, His Father judicially had to punish Him and look away from Him.

So, we must realize that the work of salvation is not a Jesus plus my works. No, it is what Jesus did all alone on our behalf that gives us eternal salvation. Oh, bless His Holy name.

IV. Fourth, we honor our greatest war hero of all times because He paid the ultimate price to win us. (vs. 9-12). These verses let us know that all the sufferings of our Savior were not to no avail. They let us know that following His death came resurrection and following His resurrection came redemption for many of whom I am one, and so are many of you and so many more of you become by repenting of your sins and trusting Jesus for your salvation. So, Jesus did all that He did in order to win us.

Concl. Jesus won the victory and Jesus got the spoils of that victory and those spoils are all of His children. Oh, what a hero! There's none like Him and never will be.


