From Pastor Ralph's Desk:

Reasons for Jesus' Ascension

(John 17:1-26)

Intro: Tammy and I went over to Beaufort to watch the Blue Angels perform at the air show. They absolutely have to be the most talented pilots in all the world. While I was watching them, I was thinking that if there was an enemy aircraft anywhere close by, then that enemy aircraft can kiss it goodbye.

A number of years back when the Iraq war began, we deployed a new missile defense weapon over to Israel to help prevent that country from coming under attack from enemy missiles. The missiles were called the Patriot missiles. They had the capability to intercept an incoming missile and explode it in the air so that it ceases to be a threat.

Now, I brought up these events to make a point about our Lord's ascension. There is no air force pilot talented enough if they had been around at the time of Jesus' ascension, and no missile fast enough or powerful enough to have prevented Jesus from reaching His destination in glory. He went right up through the atmosphere, the clouds, the heavens and Satan and his demonic forces together couldn't intercept Jesus in the air and prevent His ascension from happening. As the glorious, risen, exalted Lord and Savior, He had all power in Heaven and earth. Therefore, His ascension was going to take place and indeed and fact it did happen.

Now, we need to rejoice forevermore that He not only was crucified and risen from the dead, but that He also ascended back to glory. We need to rejoice greatly so because had He not arisen, we would be missing out on so much of what makes it possible for us to be Christians and live as Christians. Today, I want us to examine many of the reasons why it was necessary for Jesus to have ascended back to Heaven.

I. First, Jesus ascended because He completed His work. (vs. 4). Jesus is saying in this verse to His Father that He could return back home to be with Him because He had accomplished everything that He was sent to do. Now at that very moment not everything had actually been completed. However, Jesus knew that it was about to all be wrapped up so He was praying in that manner.

Now, we know that He not only prayed as though it had happened, but we know just right afterwards it indeed did happen. For just before Jesus released His Spirit from His body on the cross, He uttered those three sacred words to us, "It is finished."

This means that He had finished everything the Father required for the forgiveness of our sins. The Father required a perfect sacrifice be given on our behalf. He required that our sins be punished and paid for. By going to the cross, Jesus was our perfect sacrifice. He did take our punishment and pay our redemption. Ohm, bless His Holy name for finishing the work He was sent to do. How about us? Are we doing the work God's called us to do?

II. Second, Jesus ascended to return back to the glory He had before coming to us. (vs. 4-5). Prior to our Lord's incarnation, He had spent eternity up to the moment before coming to earth living at the right had of the Father. He had enjoyed for all eternity all the privileges and prerogatives of being the glorious Son of God.

However, nothing was more glorious to Him than being back with the Father at His side. For Him that was glorious beyond measure, and to go back having completed what the Father gave Him to do would be even more glorious because what He did glorified them both.

Now, Jesus, because of who He was rightfully deserved the glory He was getting even if He had never come to earth because of who He is, the wonderful Son of God. By doing what He did, revealed just how amazing and how glorious that the whole blessed Trinity really is. Amen.

However, I want us to understand that all the glory Jesus was experiencing prior to His entrance into the world, being the Son of God combined together with all the privileges and priorities that come from being in that position, makes the incarnation of Christ into the world more incredible that our human minds could ever comprehend.

The Apostle Paul gives us the best description of just how amazing it was that Jesus Christ our Lord was willing to step away from the glory and privileges of His position in order to bring an eternal salvation. Let me share these verses from Phillips translation. "Let your attitude to life be that of Christ Jesus himself. For he, who had always been God by nature, did not cling to his privileges consenting to be a slave by nature and being born a man. And, plainly seen as a human being, he humbled himself by living a life of utter obedience, to the point of death, and the death he died was the death of a common criminal. That is why God has now lifted him to the heights, and has given him the name beyond all names, so that at the name of Jesus "every knee shall bow", whether in Heaven or earth or under the earth. And that is why "every tongue shall confess" tha Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father." (Phil. 2:5-11)

Oh what a Savior Who indeed more than ever deserves going back to the glory He once knew. A final note on this point is that our Heavenly Father is going to allow all the people of God to share in His glory as well. Blessed be the name of our Lord.

III. Third, Jesus ascended in order to send back the promised gift of the Holy Spirit. John in his gospel reveals much to us about what Jesus had to say about the blessed third person of the Holy Trinity, the Holy Spirit. Chapter fourteen through sixteen are the primary chapters that teach us so much about the coming and works of the Holy Spirit. One thing is very clear in these chapters as well as in Acts chapter one is that the Spirit of God would not come to dwell in our hearts permanently until Jesus ascended back to Heaven. Jesus said these very words, "Now I am going to Him who sent me, yet none of you ask me, where are you going? Because I have said these things, you are filled with grief. But I tell you the truth: It is for your good that I am going away. Unless I go away, the Counselor (The Holy Spirit) w8ill not come to you; but if I go I will send him to you." (John 16:5-7). In the past, the Holy Spirit came and went but with Christ 's ascension, He has come to dwell in our hearts continuously. Praise the Lord. Just as the Spirit

Empowered Jesus to complete His work here on earth, He will do the same with us if we allow Him to. Are you allowing Him to work through you?

IV. Fourth, Jesus ascended so He could go and prepare a place for us. (John 14:1-6). In these verses, He tells us that He is going to go away in order to prepare a place for us. Thus He said He would come back to get us so that He could bring us back to live with Him. Christianity in a nut-shell, is an eternal relationship with Christ. Thus He is preparing a place where we can forever dwell with Him.

Of course, not only is He preparing a placed for us, but He has also provided a way for us to get there and that way is through Him and Him alone. So, that prepared place is for a prepared people who come by the only prepared way. Will you go there? Only if you have come to Christ and trusted Him as your only way there.

V. Fifth, Jesus ascended so that He could intercede for us. Jesus went back so that He could present our cases before the Father for us. When we pray, He sits before the Father as our great High Priest, who carries our petitions to the Father and with compassion pleads our case.

The Apostle Paul said, "Who will bring any charge against those who God has chosen? It is God who justifies. Who is he that condemns? Christ Jesus who died—more than that, who was raised to life—is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us." (Rom. 8:33-34).

Also, the writer of Hebrews speaks of this as well. "therefore, since we have such a great High Priest who has gone through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who's been tempted in every way, just as we are —yet was without sin. Let us then approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need." (Heb. 9:14-16).

Let us praise our God that 24 hours a day our great High Priest, the Lord Jesus Christ, ascended back to glory so He could intercede on our behalf. Amen.

VI. Sixth, Jesus ascended so He could return in all His glory. When Jesus came the first time, He came in a very humble fashion. It was so humble that many never recognized Him to be our Messiah, Lord, Savior and King. They weren't looking for a baby born in a barn and laid in a manger. No, they were looking for the Messiah to come in all His regal glory and might. They expected Him to be riding ion a beautiful horse like a conquering military general, who would swoop down from Heaven and destroy all the enemies of Israel and make them once again the primary ruling nation of the world. But instead He came as a suffering servant. However, this was necessary first. For the sin problem had to be dealt with first and the only way it could dealt with was for Jesus to be our sacrificial lamb.

Now that He has fulfilled what was necessary to save us from our sins, He can come in all His regal glory to openly show all creation that He is undeniably the Lord of lords and King of kings. Are you looking and longing for His coming?

Concl. So, let us never again forget that Jesus was not only crucified and not only resurrected but that He also ascended to sit at His Father's right side and there in that position He is doing more for us than if He had remained with us. Thank you Jesus for your glorious ascension.






