

From Pastor Ralph's Desk:

What Kind Of Father Was Job?

(Job 1:1-5,42:12-17)

Intro: When we consider the Book of Job, about immediately, one or two things pop up in our minds. First, we dwell upon the suffering that Job had to deal with, that then often leads us to think about why do good people suffer like Job did?

Today, however, I don't want us to dwell upon those topics. That will be for another day. However, if you would look at the Book of Job as one that deals with many issues, our eyes would open up to a lot of other great teachings in this particular Book. One example is the book's teachings and lessons is on creation. From the Book of Job we find descriptions of dinosaurs. So there is much to be learned about God's great creation.

Today, I want us to focus upon another topic that Job deals with that for the most part gets overlooked. That topic is the topic of Job's fatherhood. In other words, this book tells us what kind of father Job was and that is what I want to focus upon on this Father's Day. My, the kind of father Job was, inspires us today to follow in his footsteps.

First, let us notice that Job was pious for his children. (vs.1). Before we know anything about Job's children, we first discover what kind of person Job himself is. This verse teaches us that Job was a pious man. Of course, this means that he waqs a man completely sold out to the Lord. He was a good and godly man who feared God and shunned evil.

Now as we consider what kind of father Job was, and in the next few verses we will find out what kind he was. We can clearly say that it was his walk with the Lord that made himn to be the good father that he was. So, the best thing you can do for your children, in order to be the kind of father that God expects you to be, is to be sure to have a personal relationship with Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior and in return that will make you to be the kind of father you should be. My dad's walk with the Lord has greatly influenced my ability to be the kind of man that the Lord wants me to be. This first point is the most valuable point of the whole message. Dads, are you pious for you children? Do you have a personal relationship with Christ?

II. Second, let us notice that Job prioritized his children. For our set of verses for today's message, it is very clear that Job considered his children to be of upmost priority in his life. When you read the verses, you discover that his children were constantly on his mind. He dwelt upon what he needed to do for them in order for them to be in good shape, and to be godly in manner. Then as he thought about them, he would put his thoughts into action to make sure what he wanted for his children came to fruition. As a matter of fact, Job's children were such a priority to him that the last set of verses in the book is all about his children and grandchildren.

Dads, moms, are our children a priority in our lives? Do we dwell upon them and does that dwelling lead us into action to make sure that we do all we can to help them become the kind of children God wants them to be?

III. Third, let us notice that Job provided for his children. It is obvious from the text that Job's children didn't go without. They had everything necessary and much more. For indeed, we realize that Job was a wealthy man and he was able to give them many things. But, Job worked hard in order to do that. He had to run a business and it was a very large one. To do this entails hours on end to make it successful so that he could provide for them. Now, dads you may never be wealthy like Job was and you may never be able to provide a lot of extra things for your children but you have a responsibility given to you from God Almighty to be sure to take care of your families.

Paul puts it very plainly. "If anyone does not provide for his relatives, and especially for his immediate family, he has denied the faith and is worse than an unbeliever." (I Tim. 5:8).

It is important that we understand that we must provide much more for them than just to meet their physical needs. We must also work on providing for their emotional needs and as well and most importantly their spiritual needs. So, dads, let me ask you are you or are we providing for our children in everyway possible?

IV. Fourth, let us notice that Job is personal with his children. (vs. 5). Now, what I mean here is that Job worked on a personal relationship with each one of them. He didn't show favoritism toward one of them over the others. First, I know this because we are told exactly how many sons and daughters he had. All of them were mentioned. Second, we know this because we are told in verse five that he provided a sacrifice, not just for one or two but for the whole bunch. Rather, he provided a sacrifice for each one. He did this because each one of them was of extreme value to him.

Dads, our children need us to get personal with each and all of them. They each need to know that we consider them each one of intricate value. Are you personal with your children? Do they feel that personally you love them and value them?

V. Fifth, let us notice that Job purified his children. (vs. 4-5) Now, what the text is indicating here is that Job was greatly concerned that when his children had a celebration together, such as celebrating one of their birth-days', they may have done something displeasing to God and they would need to be purified so they could be right with the Lord. Well, I want us to consider the things he did in order to make them pure.

First, I will submit to you that Job would pray to God on the behalf of each of his children. For the sacrifices that he's lifting up on the behalf of each of his children is being lifted up, of course, unto God Himself. So, with these sacrifices he is reaching out to God on his children's behalf. If we want to help our children to stand before the Lord pure, then we must spend time in prayer before the throne of God on their behalf. I was so blessed to have had a mother and father that never ceased to pray for us while they were living. Their prayers indeed helped to keep us pure in God's sight.

Second thins that Job did was to flesh out the Word of God in their presence. The mere act of the sacrifice was something that Job did for his children because of what the Word of God taught him to do. He knew that God taught that it was through a sacrificial lamb that sins are forgiven. So, he was following the teachings of the Word of God in plain sight of his children. When our children see us fleshing out the Word of God in their sight, it will help them to stand pure in God's sight. For we all know that famous verse in Psalms that says, "Thy Word have I hidden in my heart that I might not sin against God." (Ps. 119:11). Well, in that same chapter, it also says, "How can a young man keep his way pure? By living according to your Word." (Ps. 119:9). So, dads, let us be sure to give our children the Word of God in word and action in order to help them be pure.

Last of all the best thing Job did for his children to help them be pure and to be all that God wanted them to be was to turn them over to Jesus Christ the precious Lamb of God who was slain from the foundations of the world.

Now, you may say that Job didn't turn his children over to Jesus because he himself didn't know who Jesus was for Jesus hadn't walked upon the earth yet. Well, what Job did know was that God demanded a sacrifice for our forgiveness. So, by turning their children over to the sacrifice for the forgiveness of their sins, he was eventually turning them over to the ultimate sacrifice for their sins who would one day come, the precious Son of God, and lay down His life on their behalf. As a matter of fact, Job mentions later on in the Book that he knew that his Redeemer lives. (Job 19:25-27).

Concl. Dads, moms, when you've done everything you can for your children, be sure that you have given them to Jesus Christ our redeemer. He and He alone can permanently and forever take care of them. He's their answer.
