From Fastor Ralph's Desk: The Elements of Unity (Part 2)

(Eph. 4:1-16)

Intro: Two weeks ago, we began looking at this set of verses under the title "The Elements of Unity." the point of the message is that there are certain elements that must be met if we are going to have unity have unity in the Body of Christ, His Church. We examined on that particular Sunday four specific elements. Those four were the elements of cause (motivation), conduct, control, and confession (of our faith). So, Paul was saying that if we will allow all that Christ has done for us to motivate us; and show gracious conduct of patience, humility, gentleness, bearing with one another in love; and allow the Spirit to control our actions; and finally hold ever so strictly to our sacred beliefs, then we can have the unity of the Spirit within the Church..

However, those were not the only elements he mentions. There is one more he brings up in our text and that is the element of contribution. Now, I am referring to our Lord's contribution of grace and gifts to His people. With these contributions, we are able to carry out our specific ministries which enables the church to work as a united team to do the work of the Lord. So, let us examine together this element of contribution.

I. First, let us notice to whom the element of contribution was made. (vs.7). Paul opens up verse seven with, "But to each one of us grace has been given..." So, the answer to whom has our Lord contributed to is "to each one of us." of course, this is particularly referring to the people of God His glorious church.

Now, we know that to each one grace has been given. Of course, that grace includes our salvation by grace. However, it also includes the grace gifts to each of us. We've all received specific grace gifts that our Lord determined each one would receive. In our present set of verses, the Bible shows the various gifted leaders that He has given to the church. However, in Paul's writings in 1 Corinthians, we are shown that every single Believer receiver a specific gift or gifts from the Holy Spirit and that when the whole body of Christ, with each using their particular grace gift carries out their particular ministry, we operate then as a single body united because each part is doing their part for the benefit of the whole.

What Paul is telling us is that there is unity in diversity. As Paul said, "the body is a unit, though it is made up of many parts; and though all of its' parts are many, they form one body." (I Cor. 12:12). So, let us not think that we can sit back and coast and not really participate in serving in the church. For in order for us to be united in service, we must each use the gift or gifts God has given to each one. Then we will act as a united body. Are you doing your part?

II. Second, let us notice who it was and in whose making the ele-<u>ment of contribution. (vs. 7).</u> "But to each one of us grace has been given as Christ apportioned it." (Vs.7). So, the answer to this point that it is Christ who has apportioned to each one of us His measure of grace. He apportioned to us the full measure of saving grace so that we are fully and permanently saved forever, lacking no shortage of it whatsoever.

Now, He also apportioned to us the grace of gifts. He didn't give to each one of us all the gifts but He gave to each one of us some of the gifts.

The point is that without our Blessed Savior and Lord, we would have no special blessing of grace but because of Him, we are graced through and through. Paul tells us that our Lord Jesus told us that, "It is more blessed to give than to receive." (Acts 20:34). Our Lord not only said those words but clearly more than anyone ever had demonstrated those words by pouring out to each one of us His marvelous, rich, amazing grace.

Why did and does our Lord pour out His grace upon us? I think John MacArthur answers it well. "God is gracious because of who He is, not because of who or what we are. His grace is therefore unmerited, unearned, and undeserved. It depends entirely upon th one who gives it, not on those who receive it. Grace is God's self-motivated, self -generated, sovereign act of giving." oh, blessed be the One (our Holy Lord) who pours out His grace upon us. **III. Third, let us notice what was done to make possible the ele-**<u>ment of contribution. (vs.8-ao).</u> In other words, what did Christ do in order to make it possible for us to experience all the grace that He poured out upon us? Well, I can pretty much answer this question by simply saying He did everything and beyond in order to make it possible for us to experience His grace given freely to us.

Now the two primary words used to describe our Lord's actions so that He could pour out the gift of grace upon us are "descended" and "ascended." These two words wrap up in a nutshell the incredible actions of our Lord to pour out His grace upon us. For Christ descended from glory to come down to us and become one of us so that He could fight the fight in flesh for us that we lost in the flesh. Since we failed in the flesh by yielding to sin He conquered, by overcoming sin in the flesh. His descent also took Him to the old rugged cross. Here He agreed to pay the penalty for our sins and die in our place. Now, by doing this He defeated for us the consequences that our sins held over us, the consequences of death and separation from God. For our sins required death and separated us from God. So, Jesus died our death for us to reconcile us to God because God's holiness required that payment be made and He made it.

Oh, but thanks be to God that the second word was included, the word "ascended." Jesus ascended in two ways. First He ascended up out of the grave. Hallelujah! Conquering again death, hell and the grave for us. The second way He ascended was to ascend back to glory back to His high and Holy place at the right hand of His Father.

Now Jesus did this ascension in full view of our arch enemy, Satan and all his demons. Both the grave and death are his realm and the atmosphere is his home. In neither place could Satan and all of his demons prevent Christ from ascending. OH, praise our Lord. Our Lord has defeated His enemy and ours, and now in our text He is leading a victory parade. You and I are in that parade because He has set us free from our enemy and now by His grace we belong to Him. As the result of His victory, the Heavenly Father has given to Him the right to pour out gifts to each one of us through the blessed gift of the Holy Spirit whom He has poured upon each one of us since He ascended back.

Oh my dear Child of God we must, let me say it again, we must in light of all that our Lord did to make it possible for us to receive His gifts of grace upon us now to work together using the gifts given to glorify His name here on earth. IV. Fourth, let us notice why our Lord gave to us the element of

contribution. (vs. 11-16). Today I am not going to get into the specifics of each of these gifted persons that our Lord has blessed the church with. I really only want to point out with this point that our Lord gave us gifted leaders to the church and graces gifts to each and all of His children so that ultimately, "...we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ." (vs.13). Also, Paul said, "From Him the whole body, found and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its' work." (vs. 16).

So, our Lord's contribution to us should lead each of us to do our particular part and that will result in the whole function together for the course of Christ.


