

From Pastor Ralph's Desk:

Thanking The Lord For You

(Phil. 1:1-11)

Intro: The Apostle Paul expressed an extremely positive point of view of the Philippian Believers. He begins the Book of Philippians with that positive attitude. It is an attitude of thankfulness, prayerfulness and longingness for this group of Believers. When he thought of them, it was with thanksgiving. When he longed for them, it was because he was thankful for them.

Now the question to consider is wy did the Apostle Paul have such a thankful spirit for the Philippian Believers? Well, that is what I want to answer with my message today. Also, let me say that this Thanksgiving holiday, I am preaching this message because I feel the same way about Great Swamp Baptist Church and Step of Faith Christian Academy.

<u>I. First, Paul was thankful for the Philippian Believers because of who they were.</u> (vs. 1,3).

In verse three, Paul speaking to the Believers at Philippi said, "I thank my God every time I remember you." so, who is you—well, of course, they were the Believers at Philippi. However, in verse one, he called them "The Saints in Christ Jesus at Philippi." So, who they were, were saints. By the way, these saints were living saints. The word saint means to be set apart. A saint is anyone that has been saved through the grace of our Lord. Therefore, set apart from sin, death, hell and the grave and set apart

unto Jesus Christ. Nothing should make us more thankful for one another than the fact that the Lord has made us saints in His sight, and this is why I am thankful for you guys at Great Swamp Baptist Church and Step of Faith Christian Academy.

II. Second, Paul was thankful for the Philippian Believers for who they were going to be. (vs. 6).

So, who were they going to be? Well, that answer is simple. They are ultimately going to be everything God planned on them being because Paul said, "Being confident of this, that He who began a good work in you will carry it out to completion until the day of Christ Jesus." so, Paul was thrilled over the fact that God wasn't through with them yet and as a matter of fact, wouldn't be until He turned them completely into the persons He intended them to be, which is being totally Christ-like, which of course, will take place when we come before the Lord.

So it is for me that I am so thankful for my dear friends at Great Swamp Baptist Church and Step of Faith Christian Academy because I know God will ultimately turn us into the perfect persons who are completely Christ-like. Oh, what a day that will be.

III. Third, Paul was thankful for the Philippian Believers because of what they were doing.


There were at least three things they were doing. They were giving Paul financial support to help him carry out his mission work. (Phil. 4:10-19). Second, they were giving Paul prayer support. (1:19). They were praying that God would strengthen Paul as he carried his tough task of being faithful to preach Jesus even while imprisoned for his faith. Third, they were giving Paul witnessing support. (vs. 5). Paul said they were his partners in the Gospel. They were helping Paul to share and preach the Gospel message themselves.

So their activities of giving, praying and witnessing just stirred his heart with praise to God and thanksgiving for their dedication.

Concl. I can't express my gratitude enough for all my members here at Great Swamp Baptist Church and Step of Faith Christian Academy because of who you are "Saints," and because of who you will be completely Christ-like when the Lord completes us, and for what you are doing. You are giving, praying and witnessing. May you only increase in these areas so we can continue to be thankful for one another.
