

From Pastor Ralph's Desk:

The Announcement of the Coming Birth of Jesus

(Luke 1:26-38)

Intro: The period between the Old and New Testaments is a span of time that lasted for four hundred years. During this four hundred year period of time, God did not speak to the nation of Israel at all.

However, at the end of the four hundred year span of time, God suddenly began to speak to the nation once again. He opens up from His long period of silence with two great announcements. The first of those announcements came to a priest by the name of Zechariah. God announced to him that his wife who had been barren for all of their marriage and was now beyond child bearing years, was going to get pregnant and give birth to a son. They were to call this son John, and he would be the forerunner to the soon coming Messiah.

The second announcement was the glorious announcement, which the angel Gabriel gave to the virgin Mary concerning the coming birth of Jesus. She would be the instrument God would use to bring about the incarnation of Christ into the world.

Oh, let us rejoice that when God chose to break His silence, He did so by announcing two announcements of glorious news that would result in eternal salvation for a lost world. So, let us take a little time today to examine the angel's announcement of the coming birth of Jesus.

I. First, let us notice who made the announcement. (vs. 26).

Well, of course, we already know that it was the angel Gabriel who brought the announcement. So, what does this indicate that he was chosen as the vessel to reveal this good news of great joy? First, it indicated that the message was not originated with the angel Gabriel. For the Word of God teaches us that the angels are messengers. Their only job is to carry out what they are told to say and do. This is exactly what the angel Gabriel was doing. Our verse tells us that it was God who sent the angel to Mary. So, this great announcement originated with God. The first mission headquarters was not Jerusalem or Richmond, Virginia. Rather it was the very throne of God. Just as God sent Gabriel to make this glorious announcement so He is still sending messengers out to make the announcement. However, He no longer is using angels to do so but rather His people. He's called all Believers to be missionaries and has sent us out to carry the good news.

Second, the use of the angel Gabriel was to indicate that the message that he was sent to share was a message of good news and not judgment. For every time we read in the Bible about the angel Gabriel, he is delivering messages of mercy. Let us go for we have been sent and what we have been sent to do is to deliver the message of mercy and grace as Gabriel did.

II. Second, let us notice the place of the announcement. (vs. 26).

Our verse tells us that God sent the angel Gabriel to the town of Nazareth. Now, this seems to be the most unlikely of places for such a holy and glorious message to be delivered. It seems more appropriate that God would have delivered the message to a more sacred and holy place like Jerusalem.

Nazareth had an extremely low reputation. Most people would go out of their way to avoid traveling through the town. We get a glimpse of just how bad an area it was when we see that the people of the town sought to kill Jesus when He came back there to preach during His three years of ministry.

Now, we realize that the most obvious answer is because that is where Mary and Joseph lived, and of course, this is true. However, I also believe that God chose this town so that He would show the very reason why Jesus was coming into the world. So, that He could save those who are of the lowest of the low. As Jesus said that He came not to reach those that are well but those who are sick and Nazareth symbolized those who were sick. By coming to Nazareth, God has shown that any of us can be saved if we respond to Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior.

III. Third, let us notice the person who received the announcement.

Clearly, I doubt that anyone doesn't know who received the message. But maybe what some may not understand is why Mary? There are three things I would like for us to consider about Mary and her usage in the Christmas Story.

First, let me point out that Mary received the message from Gabriel who was sent by God because she was able to fulfill the prophecies. There are at least three prophecies Mary was able to fulfill concerning the birth of Jesus. First, God had promised Abraham that through his seed He would bless all people of the earth. Well, Mary is a descendant of Abraham.

The next prophecy Mary is able to fulfill is the prophecy and promise that God made to King David. God had promised King David that he would always have an heir that would rule over God's Kingdom forever. Well, Mary and Joseph were a part of the tribe of Judah which King David came out of. Therefore humanly speaking, Jesus was a descendant of King David.

The third prophecy Mary was able to fulfill was the one that the prophet Isaiah made. He prophesied that the Messiah would be born of a virgin and Mary was a virgin. So Mary was an obvious choice because she was able to fulfill the prophecies of His coming.

The next reason God used Mary was because she was highly favored. The word favored means that same as the word grace. Mary is the recipient of this grace. In the strangest sense she is the recipient of this grace because she is highly favored. God showed His grace to her in a most powerful sense. In other words, Mary basically could say only by the grace of God was I chosen, and for no other reason.

This is a perfect example of how amazing our God is. Because of His own gracious spirit, He graciously chose Mary. This example is exactly what He did in sending His Son into the world. It wasn't because we deserve it. Rather, it is because He is gracious.

Some scholars also believe that God was gracious to favor her because He knew the kind of person she was. She appeared in every way to be humble, spiritual, prayerful and willing. I believe that all those attributes were extremely valuable. However, even with all those things had God not been gracious, He still would not have chosen her.

The third thing I wanted to mention about Mary was that she was terrified. I mean who wouldn't have been terrified.

She most likely was a very young lady, somewhere between her mid to late teens. When suddenly an angel appears to her and says that God has highly favored her, she has got to be thinking, I am just a young, poor girl from a hick town, what in the world does God want of me?

However, before the angel gives her the message that she will give birth to Jesus, he first tells her that she not only is highly favored but also that the Lord was with her.

So, what God did through the angel before He broke the news of her upcoming pregnancy. He let her know that He was with her. Therefore, she could be assured that whatever news she was about to receive, and whatever was about to happen to her, God was with her in it. He would be there guiding her through the whole event making possible all that was to and in fact did happen.

You and I don't know what tomorrow holds but we do know that for the people of God the One who holds tomorrow is also holding us. So, let us plow on because God will. He is with us. Amen and praise the Lord.

IV. Fourth, let us notice the person of the announcement.

In other words, what is or should I say, who is the announcement really about? Of course, that answer is Jesus Christ Himself. Mary's pregnancy is all about the Son that she will give birth to.

There are five things we are told in the announcement about the person of the announcement. First, we are told that the person of the announcement was clothing themselves in human flesh. He told Mary that she would be with child and give birth to a son and that she was to give Him the name of Jesus. These three things let us know Mary was literally giving birth to a real human being. He was a child, a Son and had a name.

Jesus had always existed in a Spiritual form but at His coming into the world, He took upon Himself human flesh, and became a man. He wrapped His deity up in flesh and dwelt among us.

Paul Harvey tells the story of a non-religious man who didn't attend church. When his family went to the church Christmas program he refused to go with them because he just couldn't buy into this incarnation stuff of God coming into our world,

However, while the family was away at church, he heard a few small birds outside having a difficult time because it was so cold. The man had a large barn in his yard so he tried everything he could to get them into his large barn.

However, everything he tried failed. Then he had a thought, if only I could for a short bit become one of them, I could lead them into the barn. Then it hit him. That's exactly what the incarnation is all about. In order to show us the way and give us the way, He stepped into our world and became one of us. So, at that moment the man hurried on to the church service understanding now why Christ had to take upon human flesh.

The second thing these verses tell us about the person of the announcement was that He was to be named Jesus. He was to be named Jesus because of the meaning of the name. The Greek word for Jesus means Jehovah saves, or God saves. The child was to be given this name because He would fulfill the meaning of the name. Many of us have names that mean something but we don't actually define the meaning in the way we live our lives. However, Jesus did in the fullest sense of the word. He was called Jehovah saved because He was and is Jehovah and He did save and He is saving. Oh, thank God that He was given the name Jesus and that He fleshed the name out providing eternal salvation for all who would believe.

The third thing that we learn about the person of the announcement is that, "He will be great." not that He possibly might be great, or that He has a good chance of being great. No, He will be great and great beyond measure He was. The word great here means to be distinguishable above all others. Indeed, He was and is and will evermore be distinguishable above all others. Paul tells us that His name is the greatest name above all others." therefore God has exalted Him to the highest place and gives Him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue confess that Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of God the Father." (Phil. 2:9-11). Is He that great to you and me? Our prayer should be that we will forever see and know and declare His greatness.

The fourth thing that these verses tell us about the person of the announcement was that, "He would be called the Son of the most High." Mary was giving birth to a son and she was to give Him the name Jesus which was a human name at the time. This was His human side. However, He was more than just a human. He was also the eternal Son of God. In Matthew's Christmas story, we are told that Jesus would also be called Immanuel which means God with us. You see people recognized Him to be the Son of Mary, a human being, walking in our midst. However, they also recognized Him to be more than just Jesus, the son of Mary, a mere human being. They also, because of His miracles and signs, recognized Him to be the Son of the Most High. When Jesus asked the disciples who He was, Peter replied, "Thou art the Christ the Son of the Living God." (Matt. 16:16). Jesus is unique. For He is fully man and He is fully God. He was the God-man dwelling on earth, and no one will ever be the person that He was and is. Oh, let us worship Him who is the Son of the Most High.

The fifth thing the verses tell us about the person of the announcement is that He will reign over an Eternal Kingdom. The child in the manger is no longer a child. He sits on the Throne of Glory. Victoriously, He conquered all and everything that sought to prevent His rule over us. Since there are no more foes, He reigns supreme and since He is the Son of the Most High, He has always been supreme. So, if you want to be a part of the eternal, victorious kingdom, then you must flee to Jesus Christ the King of kings and the Lord of lords and He will bring you into His Eternal Kingdom.
