From The Pastor Ralph's Desk:



Let's Move Forward

(Nehemiah 2:11-20)

Intro: The first time I ever actually drove out on a race track with other cars on the track, it didn't go so well. One night while carrying out my chaplaincy work at I170 Speedway, one of the drivers asked me if I would like to take his race car out during the practice laps. Of course, he didn't have to ask me a second time. Without hesitation, I jumped right in and headed for the track. Now, I'll have to admit that I was a bit nervous because I had never actually been on a track with a group of cars around me. So, I decided to start at the back of the group so I wouldn't hold up the guys who were used to being out there. Also, so I could begin to take some time to feel things out.

Well, I began to get in a groove and began feeling comfortable until the pack began to catch up to me. At that point I quit focusing upon what was out in front of me and instead focused upon what was going on behind me. I could see the cars coming quickly and I couldn't decide which way to get out of their way. So I began to go all over the place. When that happened, I got black flagged. That means that they made me get off of the track because of my erratic driving.

Well, one of my favorite race car drivers taught me an important lesson about racing. His advice was don't drive out your rear view mirror. Always drive with your eyes focused upon what is out in front and drive like no one is going to get ahead of you. Well, I listened to his advice and was never black flagged again. As a matter of fact, it helped me to win four times and finish in the top five many times.

Now, I am sharing this with you because it fits with what I want to encourage us to do as we head into 2020. I don't want us to focus upon the rear view mirror. Rather, I want us to look at the front windshield and drive like no one will get by us. I want our motto to be Let's move forward.

Now, Nehemiah was a man who managed to move the remnant of Jewish people back in Jerusalem forward in a very big way. What he accomplished with the remnant that had come back out of captivity, was indeed a mighty event. I want us to examine how he moved this group of people forward. May the Lord use his example to also move us forward.

I. First, Nehemiah moved the people forward by observing and acknowledging the problem. (vs. 11-17).

The very first thing Nehemiah does once he arrives in Jerusalem after resting from his long journey there was to spend an entire night riding around the city observing and assessing the problems of the city. What he saw and observed broke his heart. The city wall was broken down completely to the ground. The city gates were burned completely up. In other words, it was in complete ruins.

Next, he went to the Jewish remnant that was already living there in the city and shared with them of his observation of the city, particularly the walls and gates of the town. He was helping them to see that they must acknowledge the situation before they could move forward and do something about it.

God wants us to wake up and see the mess the world is in. like the broken down walls and burned gates, there are broken down lives all around us. There are lives that are nearly all burned up with all manner of things. Also, there are many needs in our won lives and church. We must remove our blinds, observe the problems and acknowledge them in order to move forward. For if we ignore them, we won't move forward because we won't do anything to fix the problems. Also, if we don't know about it, the problems won't be fixed either. So, let us observe and discover what walls are broken down around us. Then let us acknowledge what they are so we can begin putting those broken walls back together.

II. Second, Nehemiah moved the people forward by obtaining and organizing the people. (vs. 17).

Once Nehemiah observed and acknowledged the problems to the people in Jerusalem, he also immediately began strategizing the solution to the problem. That strategy began with three words, "Come Let us..." When he began revealing the solution by using the pronoun "us" he was stating that the first strategy for getting the problem of the broken down walls fixed was to use all the people of the Jewish remnant that lived in the land of Israel to get the walls rebuilt.

So, Nehemiah didn't say that the way the wall is going to get fixed is that I am going to fix it myself. He also didn't say that me and a few others will get the work done. Nor did he say that most of us will rebuild the wall. No, instead he said, "Let us" meaning that all of us that are here must work together to fix the problem that is before us.

Now this doesn't mean that everyone did the exact same thing but it does mean that everyone contributed some part in accomplishing the goal of rebuilding the walls. Some gathered the materials; some put the materials up; some provided the necessary resources to get the materials; and some in the case of rebuilding the walls provided security. Also, some provided meals for the workers while others were praying for them.

It is no different today when God reveals a need or problem that He wants us to fix or repair. He intends on the whole of God's family to work together in order to get the repairs done. The New Testament is filled with may verses that reveal this absolute truth that it is the totality of God's people working together that will get the broken walls and lives all put back together. As we learn from the Apostle Paul in I Corinthians 12, the church is one body but it is made up of many different parts. So, we each have been gifted by God in some manner and function to help the body do the work God has called it to do.

Now this means some of us will give resources to help get this work done. Some of us will pray diligently for the work to get done. Some of us will do the actual work in the field and son. So if we are going to move forward in 2020 like never before, then we must realize that it is a "Let us" proposition. What will you be contributing this year so that we can get the problems fixed?

III. Third, Nehemiah moved the people by obeying and obtaining the potentate. (vs. 12, 18).

Now the sad fact of the matter is that many of God's people are not going to move forward with the work that needs to be done simply by realizing that the problem is there and that all of God's people should be working to get the problems fixed. No, sometimes it takes a greater motivation to get the people involved in getting the work done.

Well, Nehemiah presented the one motivation that should move all the people to carry out the work together even if they didn't really want to. What was that motivation that caused the people to indeed work together even if they initially didn't plan on it? It was the fact that the work they were to do was what God wanted them to do. They were to do it out of obedience to God's wishes over their own desires.

In verse twelve, Nehemiah reveals that what he came to do was what God put on his heart to do. Then in verse eighteen, he let the people know that the gracious hand of God was with him.

So, Nehemiah is basically saying that we don't really have any option but to do the work of rebuilding the wall because it is what God wants us to do. Any other course of action would be disobeying the Lord.

However, Nehemiah also reminds us that in obeying the Lord we not only are doing what He calls upon us to do but we will also have the privilege of being able to depend upon our Lord to provide all that is necessary for us to get the work He called us to do. So, by obeying the Lord we also are obtaining Him. We must remember that no one wants broken walls and lives fixed more than Jesus Christ does. Let us get to work repairing these broken walls and lives because we know that it is not just a matter of obeying the Lord but more importantly it is doing what He loves us to do most and that is fixing and repairing lives. If we are not doing that then, no matter what, we are not moving forward.

IV. Fourth, Nehemiah moved the people forward by omitting the problem makers. (vs. 19-20).

Just as soon as Nehemiah had convinced the people to join together to fix and rebuild the walls, they encountered immediate opposition. Before the first rock was laid or the first gate rebuilt, the opposition was already doing whatever was necessary to prevent the work from ever getting off the ground. The opposition came from the local political leaders of the area who had been in the position for quite some time.

However, Nehemiah pressed on with the work because he knew that it was of God and that, therefore, it would get done. He directly told the opposition leaders that, "The God of Heaven will give us success."

So, let us know that we don't live in a perfect world and when it comes to God's work, we don't just face opposition from the usual kind of things that arrive, but we will on a greater level face opposition from the devil himself who opposes anything that God wants us to do. However, let us press on because our God will give us success. Amen and Praise the Lord.

Concl. So, when we don't observe and acknowledge the problems; and fail to obtain and organize the people; and refuse to obey and obtain the Potentate; and refuse to omit the problem makers, then all we are doing is driving out of our rear view mirror, never advancing forward. May the Lord turn our eyes out front and move us forward like no one is going to get by us.


