Prayer That Keeps Us Fighting (Eph. 6:18-20)

Intro: Tammy and I went to see the movie 1917 the other night. The movie is about two young soldiers selected to go and deliver a message to an army unit that is about to fall into a trap set for them. If these men can't reach this unit then the likelihood is that almost the entire unit of nearly 1,600 men will be slaughtered.

Now however, the problem for these men delivering the message is that they have only 24 hours to deliver the message and they will have to go through some of the enemy territory in order to reach the unit to which they are delivering the message.

So, the movie is about their journey of delivering their message, and all the perils, and trials they faced on the way. These perils, trials, and struggles could have easily caused most men to give up. But thankfully these men refused to give up, because so many men's lives were at stake.

Now I tell this story because the Apostle Paul reminds us that we are in a battle as well, a battle over the souls of lost humanity and a battle over the faithfulness of God's people to the Lord. Like the two men in the movie who refused to give up and fought on for their fellow soldiers, so must we not give up or in but rather fight on. So, in our verses Paul is going to show us the key to keep on fighting in the midst of the perils of war, and that key is prayer. Prayer i9s how a fully suited soldier stays in the battle for the souls of lost humanity and faithfulness of God's people.

I. First, Prayer that keeps us fighting is prayer that is prayed in the Spirit. (vs. 18).

This is exactly the first thing he says here about prayer that it must be done in the Spirit. Because the word Spirit is capitalized, we know that he is referring to the Holy Spirit of God.

So what does it mean to pray in the Spirit? Well, what he doesn't mean is that it is some kind of secret language or unknown language that you pray with. Rather praying in the Spirit means that we are praying in agreement with what the Spirit of God stands for. So we pray in such a way that we know that the Spirit of God wants us to pray, and the way we do that is to pray in accordance with God's Word in mind for the Spirit of God inspired God's Holy Word.

Dr. John MacArthur said, "To pray in the Spirit is to pray in concert with the Spirit, who, 'helps our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we should, but the Spirit Himself intercedes for us with groaning to deep for words; and He who searches the hearts knows what the mind of the Spirit is, because He intercedes for the saints according to the will of God." (Rom. 8:26 -27). As the Spirit of grace and of supplication, the Holy Spirit continually prays for us; and for us to pray rightly is to pray as He prays, to join our petitions to His and our will to His."

II. Second, Prayer that keeps us fighting is prayer that is prayed on all occasions. (vs. 18).

When Paul says here to pray on all occasions what he is telling us is that we are to pray continuously. In other words, we are to live in a constant attitude of prayer.

This challenge of Paul to pray on all occasions is clearly promoted throughout the Word of God, especially by Jesus Himself. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus gave His disciples a parable to encourage them to pray at all times. Luke tells us that that is why He gives the parable. "Then Jesus told His disciples a parable to show them that they should always pray and not give up." (Luke 18:1). In the parable Jesus tells about an unjust judge who doesn't fear God or care about men. A widow kept coming to this judge in order to get some justice she was seeking. At first the judge was reluctant to help her. However, because she refused to give up he finally gave in and gave her the justice she was seeking because he was tired of her begging him.

So the point of the parable is that if an unjust judge will bring justice to this widow because of her continually pleading with him, how much more will God do for His children whom He loves when they cry out to Him day and night. So let us pray as Pay says elsewhere, unceasingly. (I Thess. 5:17).

III. Third, Prayer that keeps us fighting is prayer that is prayed in every kind of manner. (vs. 18).

The way Paul put it here is to pray, "with all kinds of prayers and requests." as we saw in the previous point we are to pray on all occasions. Well depending on the occasion will often determine what kind of prayer you will pray. A simple example is that you want to pray in the same manner when you're driving your car as when you are praying in Church. I like the way a preacher from the past put it. "This suggests that we must avail ourselves of every method and approach in prayer. There is private prayer, family prayer, silent prayer, audible prayer, mealtime prayer, church meeting prayer, the set time for prayer, the emergency prayer. A constant sense of God's nearness and a consciousness of our need of Him will make us versatile in our prayer life. At times our prayer will take on one mode; again it will assume a different appeal altogether. There are prayers of commission, prayers of thanksgiving, prayers of intercession, prayers of supplication, and prayers of petition, and the true soldier of Jesus Christ will practice them all from time to time. We should pray at all times, in all places, and under all circumstances."

IV. Fourth, Prayer that keeps us fighting is prayer that is prayed for all of God's people. (vs.18).

Paul is reminding us here that the war and fight for the souls of lost people and the faithfulness of God's people can't be fought by just one individual, or by a small number of God's people. This battle requires the involvement of all the saints. Therefore we must absolutely leave out none of the people of God when it comes to prayer. All of God's people need the empowerment of the Holy Spirit to fight the good fight of the faith. Therefore let us keep on praying for each and all of the people of God.

V. Fifth, Prayer that keeps us fighting is prayer that is prayed for the right objection. (vs.19).

As I've been saying all along we are in a war and battle for the souls of lost humanity. Paul clearly agrees with my assessment. Therefore Paul calls upon God's people to pray for a very specific objective and that objective is that God would give him the words, the opportunities, the boldness to preach and proclaim the Gospel message of Jesus Christ. For this is the commission and command that God has given to us to take the Gospel to the ends of the earth. This bold task will require more than we humanly can produce. However, with god's leadership it can be accomplished and for this reason we pray that we might know the power of His resurrection to embolden us forward.

Concl. A soldier's task often seems out of reach or id you would just plain impossible. However, the Apostle Paul knew and understood that if God's people prayed continuously with all manner of prayers, and prayed for one another that we would be bold in presenting the Gospel to our lost world then he knew we could get the job done. So, Children of God, let us keep on praying so we can stay in the fight.
