From The Tastor Ralph's Desk:



Paul's Prayer For the Philippian Believers

(Philippians 1:1-11)

Intro: The Apostle Paul set a great example of how we should be praying for one another in his prayer that he prayed for the Philippian Believers. So, I would like for us to examine the aspects of this prayer closely and ask the Lord to help us emulate this kind of praying at our church for one another.

I. First, let us notice the attitudes that Paul expressed in his prayer for the Philippians. (vs. 3-4,8)

There are at least three different attitudes that Paul expresses when he prayed for the Philippian Believers. The first of the attitudes he expressed was the attitude of thankfulness. In his prayer for them he thanks God for them.

The second attitude that Paul expressed in his prayer for them was the attitude of joyfulness. He said, "In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy." (vs. 4).

Now the third attitude that Paul expressed was one that seemed to come about as he prayed for them. In other words, as he prayed for them with thanksgiving and joy, he was evoked into longingness to be with them. (vs. 8).

The thing I want us to consider is what led the Apostle Paul to pray with these positive attitudes for the Philippian Believers? Well, I believe there are at least three reasons we can find in this set of verses as to why he did.

First, I submit to you that the Apostle Paul prayed with these particular attitudes for them because of who they were. In verse three and four, he keeps talking about remembering you and praying for you with joy and thanksgiving. So, the question is who are the you? Well, you say the Philippian Believers and you would be right. However, Paul gets a little more specific as to who the Philippian Believers are in the first verse. He says these Believers are "the saints in Christ Jesus at Philippi."

Like the Apostle Paul, these Believers had become born again Believers in Christ Jesus because they had been set aside from sin, death and destruction unto an eternal relationship with God by the atoning work of our Blessed Lord Jesus Christ at the old rugged cross.

He wasn't thankful and joyful because they were perfect or never had any problems. No, you can read the whole Book and discover that there were a few issues Paul had with some of them. However, like himself, they were Children of God only because of the grace and mercy of God and for no other reason.

So, he was rejoicing that like himself, they had been given the privilege of being the Children of God by the grace of God. We, too, can have the particular attitudes when we pray for one another because each of us are Children of God only because of the atoning work of our Lord Jesus Christ.

The second reason I want to submit as to why Paul prayed for them with these positive attitudes was because of who they would continue to be. Paul tells us in verse six. Paul is telling us in this verse that the Philippian Believers would continue to be the saints in Christ Jesus all the way into glory. What God had begun in them when He saved them, He would carry it out unto completion until the day iof Christ Jesus. In other words, Paul could pray for them with these positive attitudes because he knew that God had saved them and would keep the saved all the way to eternity where He would completely finish His work of Salvation in us. Oh, what a great reason to pray for one another because God is still working on us.

The third reason Paul could pray positively for the Philippian Believers was because of what they were doing. Now, from the first two reasons already stated, we see that Paul was thankful and joyful because of what the Lord had done in them and for them. However, in this third reason Paul expresses in his praying for them, thankfulness and joy and longing for them because of the work they were doing in helping him to spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Of course, the Spirit of God was leading them to cooperate with the Apostle in doing this great work of evangelizing and witnessing.

In verse five Paul describes what they are doing as partner shipping with him in the work of the Gospel. So we should ask how were they partner shipping with him? In at least three ways. First, they were praying for Paul as he carried out his work of missions. (1:19). Second, they gave financial support to help Paul carry out his work. (4:10-18). Last of all it just seems apparent that Paul is also indicating that they are partnering with him simply by sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ to others themselves.

So, like the Apostle Paul, may we pray positively for one another because of who we are, who we will continue to be and for what we are doing in carrying out the work of the Gospel. On the last reason we may need to pray that the Lord will help us to be doing the work of missions, evangelizing and witnessing.

II. Second, let us notice the appeal of Paul for the Philippian Believers. (vs. 9-11).

In other words, what were the actual requests to our Heavenly Father that Paul asked for on the behalf of this group of Believers. Of course, it would be the same request he would ask for all Believers everywhere. Well, he states three requests on their behalf.

The first appeal on their behalf that he made was that their love for one another would grow. (vs.8). He wanted their love to be overflowing. However, he also wanted them to understand that their love for one another must always be controlled by the knowledge and deep insights of God's Holy Word. So, he prayed that their love would be the kind expressed in the Word of God. We, too, must pray that our love for one another comes with the knowledge and deep insights of God's Word so that we would love the way God teaches us to do so.

The second appeal he prayed on them behalf was that they be able to discern from God's Word how to live pure and blameless lives. His prayer was that their behavior would be such that it displays their walk with the Lord, and how we need to pray the same for one another.

The third appeal Paul prayed on their behalf was that they would, "be filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ." (vs. 11). Now the best place to find this particular fruit is to look at what Paul calls elsewhere the fruit of the Spirit. "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Against such things there is no law." (Gal. 5:22-23). We can't go wrong praying for one another that our lives will be filled with the fruit of the Spirit so that we may display a life of righteousness letting the world see Christ in us. Are you praying this for yourselves and one another? Are these appeals the ones you are making for the Believers that you know. May it ever be so.

III. Third let us notice the aim that Paul has in his prayer for the Philippian Believers. (vs. 11).

Paul ends his prayer for them by saying, "To the glory and praise of God." His prayer for everyone was always that their lives in everyway would bring glory, honor and praise to God. Praying for one another must never have as its only conclusion that a person's life is made better in some way or another. Indeed we want their lives to be made better but only in a way that we know it will bring glory and honor to our Lord Jesus Christ. This must always be our objective for everyone. Therefore that is how we must pray.

Concl. May the Lord help us to pray with the right attitudes; make the right appeals and seek the right aim for one another when we pray.


