From The Pastor Ralph's Desk:



Will I Recover

(2 Kings 8:7-15)

Intro: My message today comes from our Wednesday night Bible study. We are examining right now the life of Elisha. The event in Elisha's life that we presently are looking at is where Elisha goes to the city of Damascus in the neighboring country. While there an official of the King in the country where he's at comes to visit him. King Ben-Hadad sent his official Hazael to ask the prophet Elisha if he were going to recover from the illness that he was dealing with.

Clearly in the midst of our pandemic, many people are either asking this same question or at least wondering what if? So, lets consider this question, will I recover from this illness.

I. First, let's consider who asked the question will I recover. (vs. 7-8)

Well, we don't have to speculate because these verses clearly tell us that it was King Ben-Hadad that asked the question. So, of course, that means that it was the king who was sick with some kind of illness.

Now, what I want us to understand from this fact is that no person, regardless of their stature in life or position in life, is exempt from illness and death. A king can get ill and die just as much as the lowest of his servants can.

I have buried people from practically every age group there is. As a matter of fact, it is really not practically, its definitely. I've also buried people who were the poorest of them and those who were quite well off. I've buried people who worked at convenience stores and I've buried people who ran their own successful businesses. So, you can't say I'm too good for this illness or that illness is to get me. You can't say I'm too powerful for this illness or that illness to infect me. Again, illnesses and death are no respecters' of persons.

So, obviously I don't need to really say it but I will and that is that the most important thing in life is to be prepared for death by crying out to Jesus for eternal life that He alone offers.

II. Second, let us consider when the question was asked will I recover.

In other words, how long back was it that Ben-Hadad got sick? Well, it was around 3,000 years ago.

Now, the point I want to make out of this is that illnesses are not something that have just suddenly appeared among mankind. It is important that we hear this message because we are acting as though the coronavirus is the first illness that mankind has ever faced. But, of course, we know that it is not the case. From the time sin entered the world so did sickness and death.

Sadly, so many other terrible diseases and illnesses have been overlooked because our focus is only on the coronavirus. People were getting sick and dying before the coronavirus came along. Since March, our church has buried 6 people and not a one of them died because of the coronavirus. Now, I'm not trying to belittle the effects of the virus. It has been dangerous and deadly.

However, the majority of people who contract the virus will have little to no symptoms. We know that 99.9\$ of people who are 65 years old and younger will recover from the virus. We, also, know that even most senior adults will recover. It is the ones who are 80 years old and older who have many other physical issues that it's the most dangerous and deadly for. The average life expectancy in America is 78 years. The average age for someone dying with the covid virus is 81 years old. The death rate in our nation is less than half of one percent. Now the reason I bring this up is because I want us to not fear this virus like we do and understand that illnesses and death have always been around and will be until Jesus returns and permanently put it away. So, again, the important issue is to be ready for when the Lord lets us take our last breath. For it is coming to us all and only He knows when that will be. So, are you ready? Have you come to understand your lostness before our Holy God and repented of your sins trusting the work at the cross Jesus did to save us? That is the only way to be ready.

III. Third, let us consider who did he ask will I recover?

Well, of course, these verses plainly tell us that he sent his official Hazael to ask the prophet Elisha would he recover. Now, King Ben-Hadad was not an Israelite. He was the king of a nation that was considered an enemy of the nation of Israel where Elisha was from.

Why didn't King Hadad ask his own religious leaders if he would recover or not? Well, I believe that answer is quite simple. Elisha had a reputation that preceded him everywhere that he went. He was known for the prophecies that he made that had been fulfilled. He was known for being a disciple of Elijah. Finally, he was known for the great miracles that he had performed that could have only come about by the power of Almighty God.

So, the king knew that Elisha was a man of God. As a matter of fact, he called Elisha the man of God. He knew that Elisha walked with God. Therefore, he knew that Elisha would get an answer from God. He knew that Elisha would have a Word from God.

Listen, people are asking the question, will I recover? Now, when they ask this question, it is not always about recovering from the coronavirus. There are many things happening in their lives that they feel the need to recover from. So, the question is, would they choose us as a person to seek an answer for their recovery? Do they believe that our walk with God is such that they could be confident that we could give them an answer concerning their recovery?

Well, the good news is that we do have the answer. It is the same one that Elisha had. His answer was a Word from God. You and I have this answer as well. We have the entire Word of God and it clearly gives the answers on how people can recover. We clearly know that it shows that Jesus is the answer. Are you helping people to know that through Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior, we can recover. If not, is the life time clearly in in the life to come when we go to be with Him. Have you trusted Him yet?

IV. Fourth, let us consider what he did to influence the question, will I recover? Well, the king informed his official to take a gift or gifts to Elisha when he asked him the question, would he recover from his illness. These verses tell us that Hazael took 40 camels full of gifts and material things. Maybe the king believed that these gifts would somehow influence the answer to turn out positive for him.

However, all the material gifts in the world couldn't influence the answer that he wanted. Riches, gold, silver and all the money or even human achievements and efforts will not prevent us from having illnesses and eventually dying. David tells us, "No man can redeem the life of another or give to God a ransom for him. The ransom for a life is costly, no payment is ever enough." (Pr. 49:6-8). No only the Blood of Jesus is payment enough to set us free from our sins and make us a Child of God. (I Pet. 1:18-21). So, let us not try to humanly influence but rather let us trust in Christ alone to influence our ultimate positive outcome for the question, will I recover?

Concl. Now, Elisha told Hazael to go back and tell the king that he will recover. But then he said to Hazael, but God had shown him that in fact he would die. So, was Elisha being dishonest? No, he knew that from the illness he would have recovered. However, he wouldn't recover from the murder of his life by his official Hazael.

So, my closing point is this, if an illness doesn't take your life, something or someone else will. So, always be ready by receiving Jesus Christ as your personal Lord and Savior then you will definitely recover either here or for sure there in glory.




