


where he had been senior pastor for thirty-two years. Bro. Eddie and his wife currently reside in Columbia, South Carolina.



From Pastor Ralph's Desk:



Where Do We Find Jesus?

(Matt. 14:22-36)

Intro: This message is going to focus on one question and that question is, where do we find Jesus? This question is extremely relevant for the times we are living in. for with the whole Covid-19 experience, and all the civil unrest along with the hotly contentious political election has left unsure where they should be and what they should be doing. So, by looking and discovering the places where we find Jesus, we can then know exactly where we need to be and what we need to be doing in these turbulent times.

Now the set of verses we have chosen to examine to answer our question of where do we find Jesus, we will focus our message not so much about what the text is about but rather how it illustrates the places where we find Jesus. So, let us take a journey and discover those places where we find Jesus and them go and join Him.

I. First, we find Jesus with His Heavenly Father. (vs. 22-23).

In these two verses we find Jesus where we have often found Him before and where we will find Him many more times. Of course, that is clearly stated in the verses. He is alone but not alone. Rather, He is in the presence of His Heavenly Father spending time praying and communicating with Him.

As Bible Believing Christians, we whole heartedly upload the Deity of Jesus Christ. However, when Jesus came into the world, He took upon Himself human flesh and became a man. So, He was both God and man something no one else has been or ever will be but Him.As a man, like any of us, He needed to seek His Father for wisdom, strength, guidance, direction and just time of being with Him.

Now, this kind of activity appears to be an ongoing habit of our Lord. "Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up,. Left the house and went off to a solitary place, where He prayed." (Mark 1:35). The night before Jesus was taken away to be crucified, we find Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane praying. He prayed at the opening of His ministry and He prayed while carrying out His ministry and He prayed at the close of His ministry. So, where do we find Jesus with His Heavenly Father? Would

they find us with our Heavenly Father? If Jesus needed to pray, how much more do we?

II. Second, we find Jesus with His disciples. (vs. 24-32).

Once Jesus finished praying, He went out to His disciples who were out on a boat in the Sea of Galilee. Now, it is a good thing that Jesus had spent time with His Heavenly Father before He went out to His disciples because they were caught in a fierce storm out on the lake and about to sink.

Second, though regardless of the storm, He went to His disciples. No storm will ever keep Jesus away from His true followers. He will be with them wherever they are. Just read the Gospels and wherever His disciples were, you always found Jesus close by.

We learn from this that God's people need to spend time with one another. We need to do the things together that we find Jesus doing with His disciples such as praying, teaching, encouraging, worshipping and fellowshipping together. It is so important that we come together to church functions from Sunday School to Worship and everything else to encourage each other along in our Christian walk with Christ. When we spend time together, we also are spending time with Jesus because He is with His disciples. So, let us come together.

III. Third, we find Jesus with those in need. (vs. 34-36).

Now once Jesus and His disciples reached the other side of the lake, people recognized that it was Jesus. They quickly spread the news and in no time people from all over were coming to Jesus bringing all those who were sick and need of healing.

Now, Jesus didn't run or hide. Rather He welcomed them and healed them. He even allowed them to touch Him for their healing. We find Jesus over and over wherever there were people in need. Take time to read Mark 1:29-34. these verses demonstrate once again that Jesus was often found wherever people were in need.

One of the ways the world will be able to see Jesus through us is when we are reaching out and meeting the needs of a lost and dying world bringing them the love of Jesus. "In the same way, let your light shine before men, that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in Heaven." (Matt. 5:16).

IV. Fourth, we find Jesus with crowds. (vs. 14: 13-14).

These preceding verses come right before the set of verses we've chosen for our sermon. In these verses, we find Jesus working with a large group of people. Estimates have been as high as 20,000 or more when Jesus fed this crowd in a miraculous manner. The Bible says He had compassion on them. We know also from the other Gospels that He also preached to them. God has called us to look at and see the throngs of people we need to reach out to.

Also, we need to see in this that God wants us to have small group gatherings but He also wants the whole family of Believers to come toget6her in a larger group to fellowship, worship and praise together. It is good for the world to see crowds coming together to worship the Lord. It demonstrates how real our God is to us and can be for them.

V. Fifth, we find Jesus working with individuals. (vs. 27-31).

In this set of verses, we discover, of course, that Jesus is coming to His disciples but in the midst of that incident, He takes time to focus upon just one of the disciples and that one was Peter. Whenever you read the Gospels, outside of His time with His disciples, we find Jesus working with individuals more so than

with just about any other segment of society. It would take us all day long just to list the individuals that He spent time with and took time for. You see I believe Jesus loves the crowds because the crowds are made up of a whole lot of individuals, and we will build a crowd at church when we focus upon the individual.

We need to really pray about this election because one group of politicians, if they get their way, will want to whittle away little by little bit our individual rights that our founding Fathers fought so hard to make happen.

Most importantly, however, let us focus upon the individuals Jesus puts before us and work to point each one of them to Jesus.

VI. Sixth, we find Jesus in the places of worship. (Luke 2:49).

When you read the Gospels you will often find Jesus at either the Temple or in a Synagogue, or wherever the people were gathered to worship. It did eventually say that it is not the place but that it is to be done in spirit and truth. However, He wants us to do worship together to do it in spirit and truth. So, once again, we need to come to church gatherings so that together we can worship in spirit and truth.

Concl. I know that I haven't covered the entire list of the places we find Jesus, but I've covered a big section of the places where we find Him, and the questions are found in those same places. May the Lord take us to the place where He was and is.
