From Tastor Ralph's Desk:



Having A Testimony

(John 4: 4-26,39-42)

Intro: When a salesman comes to our home or contacts us in some manner to sell us a product before we would even consider purchasing whatever the product is, we would want to know if the product is effective at doing what they claim it can do. So, if the salesman has actually used the product themselves, they would have a greater chance at convincing us of the effectiveness of the product because of their own experience using the product themselves.

So, what does this have to do with our message today? Well, just before Jesus ascended back to heaven, He told His disciples that they were to be His witnesses in the world. However, to be an effective witness for Christ, you need to be able to talk about what Christ has done in your own life before you can effectively convince someone else of the reality of the saving grace of Jesus Christ.

Now, it is true that Jesus Christ and Jesus Christ alone saves us. However, it is our own personal testimony of Christ in our lives that can be the instrument that helps others look to Jesus, and that is exactly what we discover in our story today. The testimony of one person multiplied several times over.

So, I have one question, do you have a testimony that can help convince others of their need for Christ? Today, let us examine what I am simply calling, Having A Testimony.

First, having a testimony requires the makings of a testimony. (vs. 7). Well, the answer is quite simple and this simple answer is the same answer for us all and we can see the answer right here with the Samaritan woman. For the only reason why she developed a testimony was because she encountered the Lord Jesus Christ.

Now it all began when she went out to draw water from the well. She, intentionally on that day, was merely there to get the water needed to take care of the things she needed it for. She wasn't going out there to get a testimony. However, because Jesus was there she wound up getting a testimony.

Now to add to that scene, it wasn't the woman who even began the conversation that ultimately gave her a testimony. No, it was Jesus Himself who asked the woman for a drink of water and that request got it all going. If Jesus had not asked for a drink then this woman would have missed out on a testimony because she had no intentions of talking to Jesus. No, true testimony can be separated from the fact that apart from Jesus there is no testimony. He both begins them and concludes them. This is how they are made.

When you read the Book of Acts, you will discover that the Apostle Paul gave his testimony on a number of occasions, and each of those times he acknowledges that what changed his life and gave him a testimony, was his encounter with the Lord on the Damascus Road. So, does your testimony shtart and end with Jesus?

II. Second, having a testimony requires knowing the message of a testimony.

Every testimony should include certain aspects that make up the message of a testimony. By the end of our story, the Samaritan woman had a message to share about what happened to her. This message included three particular points that make up her message.

The first part of her message was that the Lord offered her something better than what she had. As a matter of fact, it was something better than anything the world could offer her, living water that would will up into everlasting life.

A true testimony will always begin with the fact that God has something better to offer, eternal life, His love, a personal relationship, a home in heaven and so much more. Oh thank God that there is something better.

The second part of her message was that she had a sin problem and it was this sin problem that kept her from having the better life that the Lord offered her. This occurred when the Lord confronted her about her marital status. He then basically pointed out what appears to be an extremely immoral lifestyle.

Now, Jesus brought the matter up following the offer of living water. Because you can't have the living water until your sin problem has been acknowledged, confessed and dealt with. The Samaritan indeed acknowledged, confessed and had her sin problem dealt with.

The Bible is very clear that no one can come to Christ without a recognition that they are a sinner in need of a Savior, and of course, we all are.

The third part of her testimony was that there was a Messiah who fixed her sin problem so she could have the living water Jesus offered her. She said that a Messiah was coming who would tell them everything they need to know, and that would include fixing our sin problem. Of course, Jesus spoke up and said that He was the Messiah.

So, the same person who offered her living water but who also pointed out her sin problem is also the same person who could fix her problem because He, too, is the Messiah who was sent into the world to deal with the sin problem on the cross of Calvary. Oh, thank God that she met Jesus on that day who gave her everything she needed to have a testimony to share.

So, every testimony must have a similar message that we were offered a better life but our sins kept us from experiencing it until we met Jesus who fixed the sin problem for us.

III. Third, having a testimony requires carrying out the mandate of a testimony. (vs.

28,30,39). The mandate of a testimony is to share it and that is exactly what the Samaritan woman did. She was so excited about her hew found faith that she left her water pots at the well because her life had a whole new purpose to share with others what Jesus had done in her life.

So, when a person has a true testimony, they will want to share it with others in a most aggressive way. However, even if you are reluctant, you need to be aware that God has demanded that we tell others of all the wonderful things that He has done for us. So let me ask you a question, are you sharing your testimony, if not, why?


IV. Fourth, having a testimony will result in the multiplication of your testimony. *Because the Samaritan woman shared her testimony, it resulted in many coming to Christ.*

Now, many of the ones who came to Christ did so because of the words of Jesus Himself but it was the testimony of the Samaritan woman which enticed them to come to Jesus and hear His words. Let us keep on sharing our testimony because somewhere along the line, it will help others seek the only One who can save them, Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior.

Concl. So, let me ask you a question, do you have a testimony to share? Then, if not, let today be the day that you let Jesus give you that living water by repenting of your sins and trusting Him as the only Way. Then go and share.
