

From Fastor Ralph's Desk:



The Believer's Time

(John 49:1-7)

Intro: For over a year now all across our land, pastors and preachers have focused much of their preaching on the end times, and for obvious reasons with all that is taking place in the world right now.

Though I personally haven't preached a lot of end time messages, I have stated and I believe that we are in the last days and that the rapture of the church would come any day. I also believe that the majority of people who are listening to my messages will agree with me.

So, today, I am not going to be preaching on end time events. However, in light of the fact that the end times might be right upon us, what ought we to be doing with our time while we have time. Of course, this would and should be a concern of ours whether it is the end times or not.

Well, in our Scripture text for today, Believers, can discover what they need to be doing with their time.

I. First, we must consider the focus of our time.

As the disciples were discussing the reason why this man had been born blind, they brought up the usual reasons that are stated for someone to be born blind. Those reasons stated were either that this man or his parents had committed some sin that caused God to blind this man. So, for the disciples the man was a mere theological discussion piece.

However, Jesus surprised the disciples by saying that neither this man nor his parents' sin had caused his blindness. There was no specific sin that could be pointed out. Rather, Jesus said this took place so that the work of God could be displayed in his life.

So, Jesus was saying to His disciples that this man was more than just a discussion piece rather he was a man in need and meeting that need would glorify God.

Then Jesus said to His disciples that it was "we" who must do the work of Him who sent Jesus. Jesus didn't say I must but rather we must. The work of bringing people out of Spiritual darkness into the marvelous light of our Lord is God's work but He uses us as part of the means by which He reaches them and helps them and changes them.

Therefore, we must then understand that God has called us to focus on those in need of the light of the Gospel and in need of help/ out time must be given to this focus of being used by God to help people in their time of need but mostly to bring them to the light.

When I was a young man working for my Dad in his construction company, he would send me out to one of his jobs to perform a certain task. I would be the one responsible to carry out the task but I would be doing the work in his name. in other words, I would be representing him because it was his job.

God is doing a work in our world and He is giving each one of us a certain task or job to do and we are to go and do it but it is to be done in His name and by His power so that lives can be changed.

So, how about you? Are you using your time to focus upon doing God's work of reaching those in darkness and bringing them to His marvelous light?

II. Second, we must consider the limit of our time.

Now, this point is very obvious. Jesus is saying we only have a brief period of time to get the work done that we are called to do. So, let us consider some of the many ways that our time is limited.

So, our time is limited by the fact that we all are going to die some day if Jesus doesn't come first. Of course, none of us know when that day will be.

Second, our time is limited because they, too, are going to die. In other words, we've got to get busy doing the work of God reaching out to them in spiritual blindness because my days are numbered.

A third way that our time is limited is because Jesus is coming again and the rapture of the church. Of course, none of know exactly when that will be. So, therefore, we have got to get busy doing His work while we can. Don't put it off because it could be too late.

III. Third, we must consider the benefits of our time.

Now by this I simply mean that when we are faithful to do the work of God helping those in need and bring them to our Lord Jesus Christ and His awesome power, we will have the benefit of seeing lives changed. So get to work.

<u>Concl.</u> As the old gospel hymn says, "We will work till Jesus comes, we will work till Jesus comes."

Are you and we working till Jesus comes?
