

From Pastor Ralph's Desk:



Changing Circumstances (Daniel 1:1-21)

Intro: I believe that the Lord would have me preach through the Book of Daniel. So, today, we are going ton start our journey in this amazing book. I refer to it as the Old Testament Book of Revelation.

As we open up the Book of Daniel, we have what I call the big move. It is the big move because the citizens of Jerusalem have been defeated by the Babylonians and the ones who survived having been taken into captivity and moved to a land far away that was totally foreign to them.

So, this big move was a complete change of circumstances for the surviving Jews in a big way. However, for at least four of those surviving Jews, which we find in this opening chapter and many more to come, they handled this big move and changing circumstances in a very appropriate manner. So, today I want us to examine how these four dealt with their changing circumstances and ask the Lord to help us do the same. My message is simply called "Changing Circumstances."

I. First, let us notice that changing circumstances are a reality.

These four young Jewish men had most likely heard much of their young lives that because God had chosen the nation of Israel to be His earthly chosen people from which He would bring about the family which would have a seed, someone who would be the Messiah, the Savior, Redeemer, King and Master, would therefore, never be defeated or taken into captivity. As a matter of fact, that is exactly what the false prophets were preaching. Yet, because of the many sins of much of the nation of Israel, God, Himself, took measures to make sure the nation would be attacked, defeated and taken into captivity.

We must never think that just because we are Christians, circumstances aren't going to change. That is a complete lie of the devil. We live in a sinful, fallen world and the consequences of that is that things are constantly changing, never, ever completely staying the same. So, the reality is that our circumstances will change from time to time, sometimes big, sometimes small but definitely changing. Once we accept that it will help us to appropriately deal with it in a Spiritual way.

II. Second, let us notice that changing circumstances have reasons.

Now, these four young men, no doubt came to or already knew why they were taken into captivity because thankfully not all prophets at that time were fake ones. The true prophets had been preaching and warning the nation that unless they turned from their evil ways, God was going to do to them exactly what He did to them.

So, once again, just the fact that we live in a sin filled world, it will never be completely stable until Jesus returns to make it so. Therefore, changes will constantly be happening.

Now, we obviously can be a little bit more specific about the reasons for changing circumstances caused by the presence of sin in the world.

First, after Adam and Eve disobeyed God and brought sin into the world and humanity, God spelled out consequences that would take place had to do with our physical bodies. Pain was introduced, hard labor became a part of work and eventually death. Obviously, that means that our bodies would have issues that would eventually lead to death. Therefore, our circumstances change because our bodies change, particularly with time, and those often bring about drastic changes in our lives.

Second, sometimes our circumstances change because sin has affected nature and that change can cause catastrophic events to take place which, in many cases, have totally changed the circumstances of a lot of people every year, actually every day. It might come in the form of tornadoes, or hurricanes or earthquakes or and the list goes on.

Third, our circumstances change because of the choices that we make and that can be toward good or sadly, and often toward the bad. If someone gets drunk and chooses to get in a car and drive down the road and lose control, wrecking and lose a limb in the accident, then their choice caused the change in the circumstances. Now, for the four young Hebrew men, it appears that their drastic change of circumstances was not of their own making. Rather, they were caught up in what I am calling the bigger picture. Just the fact that we are in a sinful world, sometimes we just get caught up in the general mess that takes place because of our fallen society which deals with the consequences that come along with that.

So, where does God fit into all of this? Well, we can't blame God because He is the One who warned Adam and Eve and thus humanity, that if you choose sin, then terrible consequences will occur.

However, we must say absolutely God is Sovereign and sits on the Eternal Throne. Thus some things that happen to us are direct doings of our God that He might discipline us; or test us; or grow us or on the positive side to bless us.

Sometimes, however, I believe that circumstances change because God allows it to happen and for the same reasons mentioned above.

However, always God's children need to remember that, "...in all things God works for the good of those who love Him, who have been called according to His purpose." (Rom. 8:28).

III. Third, let us notice that changing circumstances have a range.

Now, the range goes from one end to another; from one direction to the other. The range can go from good to bad and vice-versa. In the situation with these four young men, their change was a bit of both. To them, it definitely had a very negative range, however, because new opportunities arose for them, it therefore, also had a range toward the good as well.

Now, that is usually true for us all. When circumstances change, we see some negative that comes out of it but we also see some new possibilities.

Therefore, we need to be like these four Hebrew young men who didn't dwell on the negative and instead focused upon the new possibilities that God provided in their changing circumstances. Dwelling on the bad results won't make your circumstances any better so, look for what good can come out of your changes and with God's help, zero in on whatever that may be. Of course, that is always going to mean the good that will help you glorify God.

IV. Fourth, let us notice that changing circumstances shouldn't replace.

Of course, that is not a complete sentence but we will complete it by looking at what our changing circumstances should never replace.

A. <u>Changing circumstances shouldn't replace our purpose</u>. These four Hebrew young men must have been a part of the Jewish families back in Jerusalem who chose not to go the sinful direction of most of the people in the nation. They were among the few that continued to honor God by seeking to obey His commands. Therefore, when they were taken into captivity and their world was turned upside down, they still made the choice that they would not allow this drastic change to change their faith in god and their purpose to bring glory and honor to His name.

Tragically, many, many persons who call themselves Christians have allowed the changes in their lives to not only change their actual circumstances but also their trust in God and their purpose to honor Him. So, let us follow in the footsteps of these four young men and never allow our changing circumstances to change our purpose to honor God.

B. Changing circumstances shouldn't replace our progress. Under the new circumstances, they chose not to be bitter but to get better. They chose to continue to improve their lives so that they could continue to carry out the purpose of their lives to glorify God. Let is be said of us that we too, in our changing circumstances, are choosing to get better not bitter by progressing on in our walk and journey with Christ Jesus our Lord.

C. Changing circumstances shouldn't replace our practice. These four young men continued to practice their lives in the manner as which they did back in Jerusalem as much as possible as they could regardless of the consequences. They also chose to continue as part of their practice to continue to serve God and humanity as God meant for them to do so.

Our changing circumstances should never change how we practice our lives for God. We should seek to live as God means for us to and continue to serve as God called us to, to make a difference under whatever the changes that have taken place.

The whole point of this point is that while their circumstances changed, their lives didn't. Can that be said of us?

V. Fifth, let us notice that changing circumstances can't remove.

Once again, my point here wasn't a complete sentence. So let us complete it. What was it for the four Hebrew young men that their changing circumstances couldn't remove and what can they not remove from us either? They didn't and they won't remove God. As you read the chapter, God was moving all the parts around for the benefit of these young men. He was very much present in their new circumstances and for His people today our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ has promised to never leave or forsake His people. So, though changes take place in life, just remember our God will still be right there with us.

Concl. If you could talk to these young men about their changing circumstances, I believe their advice to us would be, hang in their faith in God and He will see you through and eventually it will all get better by and by and of course,, for the Child of God it will eventually in Glory be better by and by.

We will partner with the pastor of this good church to meet the spiritual needs of all of our members, our guests and the community as God leads us.



3—Monetary Donations


