

## The Man Jabez

(I Chronicles 4:9-10)

Intro: Last week on Wednesday, we finally moved out of II Kings and started the Book of I Chronicles. In that first message, we did something very rare for me and that was that we covered in one message nine chapters. Now the reason why we covered nine chapters was because all those nine chapters. Now the reason why we covered nine chapters was because all those nine chapters are genealogy of the people of Israel particularly of their kings. Therefore, it merely read this person was the son of that person and so on.

However, in the midst of all of so and so begat this person, we find some very interesting stories of a few of the names listed in the genealogy. One of those names which we will examine today was a man by the name of Jabez. He turned what most people would consider a boring set of reading into something pleasant to look at. He was a gem in the midst of a bunch of names. Even though there are only two verses given to him, they are jam packed full of valuable lessons for us. So, let us take a look at the man Jabez.

### I. First, let us notice that the man Jabez had a problem.

Now, right off the bat these two verses don't come right out and state what his problem is. However, we discover there is a problem from the name he has received from his mother. The name Jabez means Pain, and she named him this because of the pain he caused her giving birth to him.

Now, of course, it is not unusual for a mother to have severe pain in birth. However, in this case the way in which it is stated, it appears that her pain did not go away after giving birth to him. Her pain seems to have lingered much longer so that each time she saw her son, she was reminded of all the pain he caused her.

Then could you imagine all the suffering he faced when he became a teenager and all the other young people made fun saying such a pain, or he could hear people talking behind his back about how much suffering he caused his mom.

You say I don't see all of that in these two verses. Where do you see that? Well, my conclusion comes from the fact that just as we are told about his name, then the next thing out of his mouth was God I need help and take this pain away. So, I believe that much of his growing up years were full of emotional and mental pain but the good news we discover is that he doesn't seek to have let his pain in that he doesn't seem to have let his pain take him down. For the first tells us that he was more honorable than his brothers and in chapter two of the Book of I Chronicles it appears that they have named a town after him. (I Chronicles 2:55)

So, in our next point, we will see how he rose above his problem to go on and be an honorable man and even have a town named after him. He found a solution. So, if you too are suffering with problems that are causing you pain, whether that be emotional, mental, spiritual or physical, take a careful look at how Jabez dealt with the problem and moved on.

### II. Second, let us notice that the man Jabez found a solution.

Now, of course, we have no doubt whatsoever what his solution was because once he mentions his problem being that he was named for the suffering he caused his mother, he immediately begins praying and that is all he does for the rest of the verses and then his story ends with his prayer being answered.

So, if you have problems that cause you and others pain, then you need to follow in the steps of the man Jabez and begin praying.

However, it is important that we take a close look at his prayer and see if we are praying as he did. This is really important because as we discover his prayer was answered, and this too is what we desire, that our prayers be answered.

First, notice the passion in his prayer. Jabez didn't just kind of say a little quiet prayer and there is nothing wrong with a quiet little prayer, however, when you are in the midst of pain some times you just need to cry out to God. You need to show Him the hurt you feel. Show Him that you know that with the pain you are feeling, only He can help you deal with the hurt you are feeling. As he poured out his heart to God, may we do the same.

Next, notice the person to whom he prayed. The verse says that he prayed to, "the god of Israel." No wonder he put so much passion on his prayer because of whom he was praying to.

Practically every religion I the world has some kind of prayer system. Many spend hours upon end before a statue of some kind or another crying out their concerns and this was taking place when Jabez was walking on earth and tragically many Israelites were doing this very thing. But, oh, how foolish to pray to something that man has made with his own hands that can't see, hear or speak. When Elijah challenged the prophets of Baal to see whose God was truly god, the prophets of Baal prayed hours upon hours pleading with their so called god and nothing happened but when Elijah prayed, God moved. If we want help with our pains and our problems, then we must cry out to the only one who can hear us, see us, speak to us and have the power to answer us. And that is the God of Israel, the God of the Bible. He alone is our Creator. He alone is the One who knows us, loves us, and can help us. But more importantly He knows what we need for ourselves than we do. So child of God, cry out to the God of Israel.

Next, notice the petitions of his prayer. First notice that it was a personal request. He prayed to god to "Bless me." We often feel like we should only pray for others and not for ourselves. However, that is very arrogant of us to think that others need His help but not us. We, too, need His help, His strength, His guidance, His love just as much as others that we are praying for. So, let us not be afraid to cry out for help for ourselves and declare our need for God's help.

Second, notice that his petition not only was a personal request but it also was a petition for plenty. He said to God, "enlarge my territory." Now, the point I want to make out of this part of the petition was that he had a big view of God. He saw no limit to what God could and can do. Now, of course, the territory he was referring to was land or territory in the land God had promised to Israel so Jabez was praying for something God would have wanted him to do.

We, too, need to see that God is not limited and wants to do great and mighty things for us that will be according to His will. God enlarge our territory.

Next, in his petition, he prayed for the power and presence of God. He said, "let your hand be with me." if we are going to have to deal with pain in this life, and of course we are, there is no better way to face and move forward than by the very power and presence of our Blessed Lord. Of course, the Lord has promised to never leave or forsake His people. But some times we need that strong sense of His power and presence. So, let us cry out acknowledging what we need more than anything else, God himself, His presence and His power. Oh, what a God we serve and how precious to know He is available for His people night or day.

Next, part of his petition was a petition to be freed of having pain. I believe that we need to pray for God to deliver us from harm and pain. There are many things that can harm us and cause us pain. As we've already noted for Jabez, it was apparently an emotional pain. However, what I believe is that Jabez is praying, god don't let anything get in my way of doing what you have called me to do. So, let us pray for God to deliver us from pain however He chooses to and move on forward serving Him.

Concl. In conclusion, I sometimes wonder why Jabez didn't change his name to something more pleasant and I think maybe it was because it reminded him that it was his pain that drove him to the Lord and the Lord gave him all he needed to move beyond the pain, and He will do the same for You.


