From Pastor Ralph's Desk:



Lessons To Be Learned

(Daniel 4:19-33)

Intro: One of Job's so-called friends by the name of Elihu, speaking to Job said, "For God does speak—now one away, now another though man may not perceive it." (Job 33:14). This verse speaks well of what is taking place in the life of King Nebuchadnezzar. God had spoken at least twice in a big way to King Nebuchadnezzar. First, God spoke to him through a dream which Daniel was able to interpret for him. Secondly, God spoke to him without words when he saw God deliver the three Hebrew men from the fiery furnace.

However, it seems as though neither one of those experiences caused the king to perceive what God was saying to him. He neither perceived, comprehended or learned what God intended upon him learning.

Therefore, God chooses to speak to him one more time giving him another chance to perceive, comprehend and learn what God wanted him to learn and the great news is that it clearly appears that on this occasion he learns what it is that God wanted him to learn.

So, today, I want us to examine the lessons that King Nebuchadnezzar had to learn and see how these lessons apply to our own lives. I have simply entitled my message, "Lessons to be Learned."

First, let us notice who needed to learn some lessons.

This is, of course, a very obvious answer. It was King Nebuchadnezzar. Now, I think it is important that we emphasize this because you would think that because of his position he wouldn't have anything more that he would need to learn.

Well, as the old saying is, you're never too high and mighty to learn. As a matter of fact. We more often than not discover that person in these high positions, need to learn the eternal lessons that God wants us to learn more than those who are at the bottom of the totem pole, so to speak.

Listen to the words of the Apostle Paul under the Spirit's leadership. He said, "For it is written; 'I will destroy the wisdom of the wise; the intelligence of the intelligent I will frustrate.' Where is the wise man? Where is the scholar? Where is the philosophers of the age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of the world? For since is the wisdom of God the world through its' wisdom did not know Him, God was pleased through the foolishness of what was preached to save those who believe." (I Cor. 1:19-21).

So, those who often are in high positions have the wisdom of the world but the wisdom of God which is the only wisdom that is eternal in value.

However, no matter what position we hold in life, it is of utmost importance that we learn the eternal lessons that God has for us to learn. For all the lessons the world has to offer will always fall short.

II. Second, let us notice when he learned the lessons he needed to learn.

Now, this point really ties in with the first point. He learned the lessons that God was teaching him when he was at the top of his game, so to speak. His kingdom was at its' pinnacle. In other words, his empire was as large as it had ever been. His building projects has never been more impressive. His accomplishments by man's standards had never been greater. Yet, God was saying that in spite of all of his achievements he hadn't learned what really mattered in life.

Human achievements, large or small, will never be sufficient enough to produce the knowledge required to learn the lessons that God considers of eternal value. All of our achievements stand before God as imperfect measures in His sight. So, let us open our ears to the lessons that God is attempting to teach us about.

III. Third, let us notice how he learned the lessons he needed to learn.

The how comes in the form of trials, testing and discipline. God causes King Nebuchadnezzar to become something like a wild animal. His behavior was so bad that he was ostracized from the rest of humanity until he learned the eternal lessons that God wanted him to learn.

So it was this time of testing, trials and discipline that brought him to his right mind and to learn all that God wanted him to know. Praise be unto our God that He is willing enough to do what He needs to do to get persons to learn and accept God's eternal lessons.

The Bible verse that we began with in our introduction from the Book of Job, has some verses that follow it to further illustrate what God did to King Nebuchadnezzar. So, let me share those with you. "For God does speak—now one way—now another—though man may not perceive it. In a dream, in a vision of the night, when deep sleep falls on men as they slumber in their beds, He may speak in their ears and terrify them with warnings, to turn man from wrong doings and keep him from pride, to preserve his soul from the pit, his life from perishing by the sword." (Job 33:14-18).

However, my prayer is that you don't be as stubborn as King Nebuchadnezzar and instead learn the eternal lessons before such trials are required. Yet God will put us through testing to build our faith.

IV. Fourth, let us notice how long it took for him to learn the lessons.

So, the king was told that he would be in his wild-like animal condition for 7 times. Well, Bible scholars tell us that, that 7 times means 7 years. So, it took 7 years for the king to get the lessons but God was gracious enough to give him that time.

The Apostle Peter reminds us of how long-suffering God is as He waits and gives mankind time to learn the eternal lessons for our souls. "But do not forget this one thing, dear friend: With the Lord a day is like a thousand years,

and a thousand years are like a day. The Lord is not slow in keeping His promises, as some understand slowness. He is patient with you not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance." (II Peter 3:8-9). God has given you another day so let this be the day you respond to the Lord while He is being long-suffering with us. For one day, however, His long-suffering will come to an end and then it will be too late.

V. Fifth, let us notice what lessons he and we need to learn.

Now, I have finally gotten down to the most important part of the message, what was the lessons that God wanted King Nebuchadnezzar to learn. These also are the same lessons He wants us to learn.

A. First, he needed to learn that God is in control. Daniel told the king right out that the interpretation of his dream was for one primary purpose and it is stated very clearly, "...seven times will pass by for you until you acknowledge that the most high is Sovereign over the kingdoms of men and gives them to anyone He wishes." (vs. 25).

God is calling upon us all to come to the place in our lives where we recognize that there is only one God in control and He is the God of the Bible, and He takes second place to absolutely no one.

Therefore, because He is in control, then He alone must be obeyed and His commands followed, and He commands all men everywhere to repent and believe in Jesus Christ alone as our Lord and Savior. He tells us there is no other way. (John 14:6). So, listen and learn this eternal lesson before it is too late.

B. Second, he needed to learn that God deserves the credit.

This had been the problem or I should say the sin of King Nebuchadnezzar. He had refused to humble himself and give all the glory, praise, and honor to God. Rather, he gave all the credit to himself. He said, "is not the great Babylon I have built as the royal residence, by my mighty power and for the glory of my majesty." (vs. 30).

Now, just as soon as he gave all the glory to himself, God humbled him and seven years later he gives God all the glory.

We need to learn that God resists the proud but gives grace to the humble. (James 4:6). Also, the Apostle Peter said, "Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that He may exalt you in due time." (I Peter 5:6).

C. Third, he learned that God is constant.

King Nebuchadnezzar learned that God's kingdom is not temporary in nature, but rather eternal. Twice in the chapter he said, "How great are His signs, how mighty His wonders! His kingdom is an Eternal Kingdom; His dominions endures from generation to generation."

So, why would you want to simply learn the wisdom that is of the world which is only temporal in nature, while God's is totally and completely eternal.

So, grab on to the eternal lessons of God's Eternal Word while you have the opportunity to do so.

D. Fourth, he learned that God is compassionate.

He learned that God didn't give up on him until he learned God's Eternal message. We, too, have learned that God is compassionate because He gave us His one and only Son to die on Calvary's cross to forgive us and give us Eternal Life. So, let us learn this lesson and to ever more be grateful.

Concl. My prayer is that we won't have to go through so much to learn God's Eternal lessons. However, I am grateful that He didn't give up on me.


