From Pastor Ralph's Desk:

> Called to Freedom (Galatians 5:1-26)

Intro: Of course, it is no news to anyone reading this article that on July 4th, 1776, our Founding Fathers accepted, adopted and signed the Declaration of Independence. Thus declaring our nation a free and independent nation.

This began our experiment in the annals of human history that has lasted longer than any other nation in the history of mankind. The experiment I am referring to is the individual freedoms and rights that the Declaration of Independence afforded to each and every citizen in our land. Those rights as our Founding Fathers asserted were the rights to life, liberty and the pursuit of happiness as granted to us by God our Creator.

For 246 years as a nation, we have been experiencing those benefits mentioned in the Declaration of Independence. However, as we speak these individual rights and freedoms are under serious attack from those who prefer a more socialistic form of government. So it is quite possible that we could lose what our Founding Fathers accepted, adopted and signed their very names to.

However, regardless of what we may or may not lose based upon our Declaration of Independence rights afforded to us, there is a freedom that cannot be lost. It is a freedom that is far older than the freedoms afforded to us by this nation and by our Founding Fathers. Over 2,000 years ago, our Heavenly Father offered to us a call to individual freedom that will last for eternity regardless of what happens with our American and it is this freedom that the Church of our Lord Jesus Christ must promote above all other types of freedom because it is the one time freedom. So let us examine our call to freedom.

I. First, let us notice that we are called to a life of freedom. (vs. 1, 13).

When the Apostle Paul opens up the Book of Galatians, he has nothing positive to say about the church. As a matter of fact, it is just the opposite. For right after his short greeting, he immediately begins condemning the church there at Galatia for so quickly turning their backs upon the message of the grace of God that he preached to them when he first came into their midst.

After Paul left the church, some fake teachers slipped into their midst and began preaching a gospel which was totally different than the Gospel message that Paul had preached among them.

Let us look at what Paul declared that message of the Gospel was and is that he had preached to them. "For through the law I died to the law so that I might live for God. I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me. I do not set aside the grace of God for if righteousness could be gained through the law, Christ died for nothing." (Gal. 2:19-21). So, Paul is saying that the life of freedom that God offers us does not come by keeping the law which we are unable to do anyway. Rather, our freedom comes through the grace of God expressed in the finished work of Christ Jesus our Lord on our behalf at Calvary and in His glorious Resurrection.

"Christ redeemed us from the curse of the law by becoming a cure for us, for it is written: 'Cursed is everyone who is hung on a tree.' He redeemed us in order that the blessing given to Abraham might come to the Gentiles through Christ Jesus, so that by faith we might receive the promise of the Spirit." (Gal. 3:13-14).

"You are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus, for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourself with Christ. There is neither Jew, nor Greek, nor free, male nor female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus." (Gal. 3:26-28).

So, all of these Scriptures show us that the call to freedom, a life in freedom, is totally and completely possible because Jesus Christ our Savior and Lord has done everything necessary to give us full and free Salvation. He lived the perfect life we couldn't. he kept every law demanded by our Heavenly Father. He then went of the cross and took the curse that we deserved for us. He took our place and became cursed on our behalf. On the cross and in His Resurrection, He fought every enemy that has enslaved us, sin, Satan, death, hell and the grave. And all that is required for us to obtain the life of freedom is to repent of our sins and place our total faith in the work Jesus did on our behalf at Calvary. As Jesus said, you shall know the truth and the truth will set you free. Jesus is that truth.

II. Second, let us notice that we are called to live in freedom. (vs. 1,13).

Now as we've already noted in the first point, fake teachers crept in among them and began perverting the Gospel message by basically declaring that Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior alone wasn't sufficient enough to give us full and free Salvation. Rather, they taught that you need Jesus plus keep the law if you were going to be saved. Thus what they were saying is that you maintain your own Salvation by keeping the law and doing good works.

So, what was happening is that instead of living a life of freedom they were once again enslaving themselves to the constant fear of have I don enough or kept enough of the law that God will be pleased with me and accept me.

There are a few thing you are doing when you choose not to live the life of freedom that God has called you to. First and the worst thing you are doing is declaring that Jesus is not sufficient. That all that He came to do and did fall short of providing all that is necessary to provide for us complete Salvation.

We need to understand that if the Holy, perfect Son of God can't fully save us then certainly we can't save or maintain our Salvation.

The next thing we are doing is using up energy trying to keep ourselves saved that could be used in serving the cause of Jesus Christ in the world. In other words, when we know that through Jesus we are totally and completely saved in God's sight and don't have to use up energy to stay saved, we will then be free of anxiety and emboldened to carry out the work and will of God in the world.

Finally, you will be sending a mixed message to the world which will not result in helping people to truly be able to experience true Salvation.

So, we need to understand that we have not just been called to a life of freedom but we have also been called to live in freedom, and let the freedom motivate us to live for Jesus boldly and openly.

My dad served part of his time in the Seabees with the occupational forces in Japan at the end of WWII. One of the difficult jobs that he had there was to go up into the mountains where Japanese soldiers were hiding out and did not know the war had ended. They were trying to get these men to come out and enjoy the freedom that they could now enjoy. These soldiers, many of them remained hiding for years living in either fear or preparing to fight because they did not know the war was over.

Well, my friends, the was is over. Jesus Christ has defeated the enemy and through Him we can live a life of freedom.

III. Third, let us notice that we are called to love in our freedom. (vs. 13-15).

Our freedom in Christ was never meant to be freedom to do just whatever we want to do. Particularly our freedom was, nor is, meant to be used to carry out the desires of our sinful nature.

Rather, our freedom was meant to free us from our sinful and selfish desires and lead us to be free to do the things that are pleasing to God and beneficial to others.

Paul then goes on to tell us that the one thing above all others is that Christ has freed us to do which will cause us to what is pleasing to God and beneficial to others is to love others and love one another. The freedom that we have in Christ is because, "God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son..." (John 3:16). We will never more experience freedom than when we are loving one another as Christ has done toward us.

We used to sing that chorus we were young all the time which says they will know we are Christians by our over by our love. Besides it is not just in the song but in God's Word as well. So, use your freedom not to stir up things among the brethren; or to gossiping about the brethren; or to fight with them but rather to love them. You are free to do so.

IV. Fourth, let us notice that we are called to be led in our freedom. (vs. 16-26).

As we discovered in our last point, that our freedom in Christ does not mean freedom to do anything we desire to do whether good or bad. Rather our freedom in Christ means that we are free to do the things that are pleasing to God.

But what the Apostle Paul wants us to know is that those things that He has freed us to do, as we saw in the last point particularly to love one another, we will need the guidance and strength to do those things. Paul goes on to reveal that there is a person who has been given to us to give us the wisdom and strength to love in our freedom as God wants us to. Of course, that person is the Holy Spirit, and when we allow Him to control then the things of the flesh will become dimmer while the fruits of the Spirit become brighter. "But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law. Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the sinful nature with its' passions and desires. Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit. Let us not become conceited, provoking and envying each other." (Gal. 5:22-26).

So, let us seek the Spirit's guidance that we will use our freedom for the glory and honor of God.

Concl. Our Founding Fathers gave us a document declaring our freedom and then fighting a war to make it effective. So our Heavenly Father in His Word has declared His people a free people in Christ Jesus our Lord. Through whom He won all the battles and the war to set us free. So, go now and live the life of freedom that you have been called to and use it to honor the One who has freed you.




