

From Fastor Ralph's Desk:

#### We Don't Lose Heart

(2 Cor. 4:1—18)

Intro: Paul closes out the Book of Romans with a full chapter of Greetings. These greetings reveal much about the lives of the early Christians. So with their message I want us to examine these greetings to see how they can benefit our church as we soon begin the start of our new church year.

## I. First, let's notice in Paul's personal greetings that he greets a certain group of people.

Now, of course, the people he's greeting are Christians who live in Rome., but Paul uses several different terms to describe who they were to him. They were his friend, sister, relative, whom he loved, chosen in the land, and so forth. However, the term Paul used the most describing them was either fellow workers or those who work hard in the Lord. Thus, the people that were the focus of his greetings were those, who like himself, were dedicating themselves to the work and service of the Lord. Now what this tells us is that from the Apostle Paul's point of view, the people who are faithfully carrying on the work of the Lord were the ones that he greeted because they were the ones he knew about because of their work.

So we need to ask ourselves if Paul were greeting the people in Ridgeland today, would your name or mine be a part of his list of names to greet? Would he know that we were fellow workers in the Lord just like him?

## II. Second, let's notice in Paul's personal greetings that he greets with a great amount of praise.

Now, of course, Paul's greatest amount of praise is directed in one direction and that is toward the Lord Jesus Christ. However, in all of these greetings Paul gives a lot of recognition, honor, and praise to the great work the people are doing for Jesus. Again, the praise goes to Jesus because these people are servicing Jesus by doing the work of salvation that Jesus brought to their lives. Let's take a look at some of the terms Paul uses to honor these saints. He says that they were to be commended; they were outstanding; they were tested and approved; and they were risk takers.

So what Paul is pointing out is that those who are faithful to the Lord in servicing Him are worthy to be recognized for their service and with that recognition and praise, they will inspire other Christians to get with servicing Jesus as well.

### III. Third, let's notice in Paul's personal greetings that he greets with a precious plea.

It is with the first person that he greets (Phoebe) that Paul reveals this gracious plea and would also apply it to all other people that he greets. So let's notice what it is. It was that all the other saints of God in the churches in Rome would come along side of Phoebe and as well all the other persons Paul greets and stand with them, support them, and help them.

So as our new church year gets under way, all of us who are a part of Great Swamp Baptist Church need to come along side of those who are serving so faithfully in our church and stand with them, support them, serve with them, and help them carry out God's work in the world.

## IV. Fourth, let's notice in Paul's personal greetings that he greets with a grand proclamation (vs 17-19).

Now in the midst of these greetings, Paul points out that tragically in the churches there were men and women who were nothing like the person that he was sending greetings to. As we've already noted, the people that Paul was greeting were faithful dedicated servants of Jesus Christ who were serving Him to the point of risk their own lives for the cause of Christ. However the people that Paul was making a grand proclamation about were extremely selfish, self-serving and didn't care how much harm they did to the church.

Because of their selfish ambition they were creating division within the church if necessary in order to get their way. They even went a step further by promoting false doctrine and teaching within the church to draw attention to themselves, deceiving many of those who were naïve in the church. Sadly, this type of people is still in the church today and, until Jesus calls the church home in the Rapture, they will continue to remain in our midst.

Thus, Paul would encourage us to avoid those people and instead focus on living our lives in the manner of all those people that he greets in this chapter. Those that are the fellow workers in Christ with him doing it all for Christ's glory and not their own.

## V. Fifth, let's notice in Paul's personal greetings that he greets with a glowing promise (vs 20).

This verse follows the warning of the previous point. Paul is using this verse to encourage us to stay the course of being a faithful laborer and servant of Jesus Christ in spite of the fact that the church has people in her midst who are trying to lead it astray, because one day our God will crush Satan under our feet.

What Paul is saying is that those he warned us about are under Satan's control, but one day both he and they will be defeated. As Jesus told His disciples while He walked upon the earth, "...I will build my church and the gates of hell will not prevail against it." (Matt 16:18 KJV) So keep on serving Jesus, because in Christ we have the victory.

## VI. Sixth, let's notice in Paul's personal greetings that he greets with a grand purpose (vs 25-27)

Paul concludes the chapter with what is the main purpose and trust of all these people he greets. That purpose is to bring praise, glory, and honor unto Jesus Christ by preaching and promoting the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

So we must pray that God will use our service to Him for the purpose of spreading His message of salvation to a lost and dying world and that will result in praise to His glorious name.

Concl.: We must remember that if we strive to honor the name of Jesus Christ our Lord by serving Him in the manner of those Paul greets in this chapter. Then, one day we will hear another greeting and that greeting won't come from Paul, rather it will come from our Lord. He will say, "well, done thou good and faithful servant." (Matt 25:21).
