From Pastor Ralph's Desk:



<u>A Dinner in Honor of Jesus</u> (John 12:1-11)

Introduction:

In our last message we examined the Sanhedrin's plot to kill Jesus. Because of this plot Jesus decides for a short period of time to lay low in a small town on the edge of the desert.

Soon thereafter the Jewish Passover celebration was getting underway in Jerusalem, and thousands of people were coming there for the celebration from all over. And the main topic of discussion was will Jesus come to the celebration with the threat of being arrested and even killed hanging over Him?

Well, the answer to the question is a definite yes because it was His destiny to do so. He didn't come to earth merely for the purpose of just hanging out with us and fellowshipping with us. Rather He came with a specific task at hand and that task was to go to the old rugged cross where He would die in our place and accomplish our eternal salvation. So, yes, He will show up at the Passover celebration.

This journey to Jerusalem for this particular Passover celebration would be His last week here on earth. That journey began with a dinner given to Him in His honor, and that's what we will examine today, a dinner in Honor of Jesus.

I. First, let's notice the place of the meal (vs 1, 2)

We are told in these verses that the village is Bethany and the home was one that He was very familiar with because He had been there many times before. He was always welcome in the homes of Martha, Mary, and Lazarus. As a matter of fact, it wasn't a reluctant kind of welcome where they would allow Him to come by if He was insistent about seeing them. Rather they were the ones who were extremely insistent that anytime He was nearby that He just had to come by and stay with them. And it's important to point out that they were this way even before Jesus resurrected Lazarus.

Whenever Jesus came to their home He was served. He was fed. He was listened to. He was given space to do His ministry and room and board.

It was as though this house was as much His home as it was theirs. We get that sense from the previous chapter where Jesus, away from Bethany receives news that Lazarus is very sick. It was specifically told to Him this way, "so the sister sent word to Jesus, 'Lord, the one you love is sick." (John 11:3). A couple of verses later we are told, "Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus." (John 11:5)

Now we need to ask ourselves is Jesus welcome in our hoes in the same manner as He was at Martha's, Mary's, and Lazarus' home? Do we give Him the highest honor? Do we serve Him in our homes? Do we give Him the opportunity to use our homes? Do we love Him in our homes? Are people able to decipher that Jesus lives in our homes?

I do want to say praise God before I move on to my next point that it's so wonderful that we are told that Jesus loved the people of this home. He loved Martha. He loved Mary. He loved Lazarus. Yes, Jesus loves the world but those who get to experience His love are those who welcome Him into their hearts and homes.

II. Second, let's notice the period of the meal (verses 2, 3)

What I'm referring to with this point is when the meal was given. It was given six days before the Passover meal. And just as the meal He's about to eat was given in honor of Him so the Passover meal six days away will also be a focus upon Jesus as well. The Passover meal celebrated two primary things. First, it celebrated Israel's deliverance from Egyptian bondage. Second, it celebrated each first born son of each Israelite family being spared from the death angel as it passed through Egypt destroying the firstborn son of every home that did not have the blood of the lamb painted on the side of their door frame and the top of their door frame. The Israelites were spared because they obeyed God and painted the blood of the lamb on their door frames while the Egyptians didn't because God intended on taking their firstborn son.

Jesus Christ has become the sacrificial lamb for us and by His blood we too have been spared from death, hell, and the grave. The Bible tells us "So whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God...." (I Cor 10:31). Both meals glorified Christ.

III. Third, let's notice the praise at the meal (verses 2, 3)

We are specifically told that this meal was given in Jesus' Honor. And everything that took place at this meal was to honor, glorify, and praise our Lord Jesus Christ for resurrecting Lazarus from the dead. Lazarus was seated with Jesus at the table to honor Him. Martha was serving Him, and Mary anointed His feet. So at Martha's, Mary's, and Lazarus' home Jesus was not only at this meal worshipped, praised, and honored, but it appears to be that He was always the person of praise at their home.

We need to ask ourselves is Jesus honored, worshipped, and praised at our homes both privately and openly? Our homes should be places of praise and worship of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Martha, Mary, and Lazarus honored Jesus because of who He is and because of what He had done for them with the resurrection of Lazarus. However, we not only know of the resurrection of Lazarus but everything else that followed Lazarus' resurrection and this meal given in His honor. We know of His crucifixion and resurrection for the redemption of our sins So how much more should our homes be places of worship where Jesus is honored above all others.

IV. Fourth, let's notice the preparation of the meal (verses 3-8)

Now with this point I'm not referring to the actual preparation of the meal itself. Rather I'm referring to the anointing that Mary did to Jesus when she poured the expensive perfume on Jesus' feet and then wiped it with her own hair. Jesus tells us that she did this in preparation of his burial. Now the question is did Mary actually know that Jesus was going to die? Well, we really don't know for sure. But one thing we do know for sure is that she knew that if He did He could resurrect Himself. For He not only resurrected Lazarus, but had declared Himself to be the resurrection and the Life.

I like what one preacher said about Mary's devotion to our Lord when she anointed Jesus' feet. He said that, "Jesus was accepting the worship that Mary gave Him because she rightly saw that He is worthy of all that we can give Him and even more. As Isaac Watts put it ("When I Survey the Wondrous Cross"): 'Were the whole realm of nature mine, That were a present far too small: Love so amazing, so divine Demands my soul, my life, my all.'

The point is, devotion to Christ will cost you financially. If He bought you with His blood, you don't own anything. It's all His and He can direct you to give some or all of it for His kingdom purposes. Probably most of us would have sold the perfume, given the ten percent to the Lord, and pocketed the rest to spend on getting a later model mule! But Mary gave it all because she knew that Jesus is worth it."

Conclusion:

So in my conclusion I just want you to ask: Do people know that Jesus is honored above all in our homes?







