



From Pastor Ralph's Desk:



Benefits of the Ascension (Luke 24:50-53; Acts 1:1-11)

Introduction:

Tammy and I had the privilege of traveling to Israel in the winter of 1980. While there one of the so-called sacred spots we visited was called the Chapel of the Ascension. It's located in the village of Bethany on top of Mount Olives. Inside this chapel you find just a large open room with nothing but a rectangular boxed in area on the ground. Inside that boxed in area is what's claimed to be two footprints etched into the stone on the ground. The claim is that these two footprints were Jesus' footprints from when He ascended back to heaven. While we were there, and even now when people visit there, some would bend down and either touch the footprints or literally kiss them. And in the minds of many of those who touch or kiss the footprints, they believe that their action will somehow benefit their lives.

Now let me say that it's highly unlikely that these are actually Jesus' footprints because Jesus' disciples were there and they never mentioned anything about Jesus leaving His footprints when He ascended. But even if they were just touching them or even kissing them, are not going to somehow magically benefit your life. However there are indeed very clear benefits for the child of God because of Jesus' ascension, and that's what we will look at in this week's message.

I. The first benefit let's consider has to do with when Jesus ascended (Acts 1:1-3).

In these verses Luke, who wrote the book of Acts, tells us that Jesus' ascension took place after He had spent a period of forty days revealing Himself to His disciples and teaching them many things during those days.

So the benefits from when He ascended was, first of all, that He ascended only when He had fully accomplished all He was sent to accomplish. Meaning that we have full assurance that Jesus didn't go back until we knew beyond a shadow of a doubt that He had done all that was necessary to bring about our eternal salvation.

Another valuable benefit from when He ascended was the fact that He didn't ascend until He gave us convincing proof that He indeed arose from the dead. Which, in turn, means that our faith is not a blind faith in something that wasn't real or just a story or a fairytale. Jesus actually died for us, arose from the dead, and then ascended back to glory, and it was all witnessed. Oh, what a glorious faith we have because it **IS** real!!

II. The second benefit let's consider has to do with where Jesus ascended from (Luke 24:50).

This verse tells us that Jesus led His disciples out to the vicinity of Bethany, which is on the Mount of Olives and it was from here that He ascended.

So the question is why did Jesus chose this area to ascend from? Well, we all know that Bethany was a place filled with many great memories for Jesus and His disciplines. In the home of Martha, Mary and Lazarus, there had been sweet fellowship, moments of great teaching, and witnessing of great miracles. So I believe that Jesus chose this as His departing place to say to His disciples that though He's going away they still would have sweet fellowship with Him. They still would receive His teachings and they still would know of His resurrection power at work in their lives. So while Jesus is in heaven, we are still experiencing these great benefits that His disciples knew when they were with Him in Bethany.

III. The third benefit let's consider has to do with where Jesus ascended to (Acts 1:10, 11).

These verses tell us that the place Jesus ascended to was heaven. So He's going back to the place that He came from to begin with -- heaven. In Jesus' great high priestly prayer that He made, Jesus said these word to His Father, "And now, Father, glorify me in your presence with the glory I had with you before the world began" (John 17:5). So Jesus is returning to all the glory He knew in the presence of His Father from before His coming to us, and even before His creation of us.

Also He tells us that in this place of His glory, called heaven, He's preparing a place for all of His believers so that we can spend eternity with Him (John 14:1-6). So the benefit of where He ascended to reminds us of Jesus in all of His glory and that we aren't home yet and that like Jesus we will one day go to be with Him. Amen and praise God!

IV. The fourth benefit let's consider has to do with what Jesus was doing when He ascended (Luke 24:50, 51).

What Jesus was doing was blessing His disciples. He is blessing His disciples with His hands raised before He ascends, but the picture shows even more — He's also blessing His disciples *while* He was ascending. What a beautiful picture this is! He's not condemning His disciples as He descends, He's not chastising them as He descends, but rather He's blessing them.

John told us on one occasion that, "God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world in Him" (John 3:17). So Jesus came into the world blessing us and He went out blessing us and He's still blessing us because He's up in heaven interceding on our behalf.

"Who is He who condemns? Christ Jesus, who died -- more than that, who was raised to life -- is at the right hand of God and is also interceding for us" (Romans 8:34). Oh, thank God that Jesus ascended to continuously bless us through His interceding on our behalf!

V. The fifth benefit let's consider has to do with who was released when Jesus ascended (Acts 1:4, 5).

In the gospel of John Jesus told His disciples that He was going to go away, but He wasn't going to leave them because He would send back the Holy Spirit to dwell in each of them. So through the gift of the Spirit Jesus would dwell in each of His followers.

However according to John's gospel Jesus said the promised gift of the Spirit couldn't be released until He ascended back to His Father. "But I tell you the truth: It is for your good that I'm going away, unless I go away, the Counselor will not come to you" (John 16:9).

Now just before Jesus ascends back to heaven, Jesus reminds them of this great promise. In these verses chosen for this point, He told them to wait for the promised gift of the Father which was the Holy Spirit. So when Jesus ascended they could be assured that soon the Holy Spirit would come upon them, and in just a few short days following the ascension, the Holy Spirit came and indwelt the believers and He's still doing it today.

VI. The sixth benefit let's consider has to do with the reminder of Jesus' ascension (Acts 1:9-11).

In the times that we are living the reminder of Jesus' ascension is incredibly comforting. Because what it reminds us of is the return of Jesus, or if you would, His second coming. For the angels present at Jesus' ascension told the disciples directly "...'this same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen Him go into heaven."

Thus we can rejoice knowing that because Jesus ascended He will also return.

Conclusion:

Luke tells us that when Jesus was taken up to heaven the disciples worshipped Jesus and returned to Jerusalem with great joy. And after they returned they kept right on rejoicing even though Jesus was now gone and the reason why is because the ascension further proved that Jesus was who He claimed to be all along. The second reason was because they now understood that His ascension was to their benefit. So let us too rejoice and worship our blessed Lord because His ascension proves His Deity and benefits our walk with Him!
