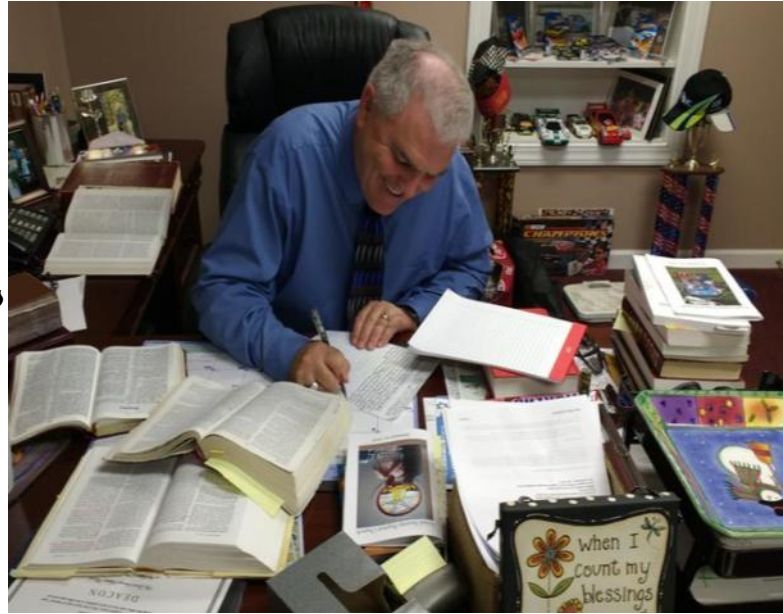

Hannah's Times Required Hannah's Choice
(I Samuel 1:10-28; 2:1-10; and Joshua 24:19-27)

Introduction:

The account of Hannah is a well known Biblical event that is often used for mother's day sermons. However, I believe that what's often missing with these sermons is the context of the times in which Hannah lived. I believe wholeheartedly that more than ever as we investigate the events surrounding Hannah that we really need to take into consideration the times in which she lived because they are so much like the times that we are living in today.

The real focus of the message however is the fact that Hannah made the right choice for her son Samuel both because of her times and regardless of her times. So with this message we are going to take a journey into the past which reminds us of the present to find solutions for the now.

I. First, Hannah's times required Hannah's choice because of the dedication the nation had made (Joshua 24:19-27)

So the times in which Hannah lived was during the period in which the Judges ruled. This period of 200 to 300 years was sandwiched between the time Israel conquered and settled in the promise land with the end of Joshua's leadership over the nation and the beginning of the rule of the Kings.

Just before Joshua dies and the judges begin ruling, Joshua makes a challenge of the people to dedicate themselves and their nation to God's control over their lives. And in this chapter in the Book of Joshua that we are using for this point the people and the nation chose to do that very thing. "But the people said to Joshua, 'No! We will serve the Lord.'" (vs 21). "And the people said to Joshua, 'We will serve our God and obey Him.'" (vs 24).

So Hannah knew that the period of the Judges which she lived in had begun with the nation having dedicated themselves to the Lord. Therefore no matter what actually took place during her times she knew that her responsibility was to keep the commitment the nation had made at the time that the period of the Judges got underway. So the only choice that Hannah could make was to dedicate her son to the Lord because that's the covenant that her nation got started under.

Sadly many of us have forgotten how our parents and grandparents dedicated us to the Lord, how they took us to church, prayed with us, and read scripture to us. It's time for many of us to recapture that commitment they made for us and return to the Lord.

II. Second, Hannah's times required Hannah's choice because of the direction that the nation had taken (Judges 17:6; 21:25; 14:1-3)

Even though the nation had dedicated themselves to the Lord as they were getting ready to move into the period of the judges they soon tragically moved into a total different direction. There are a couple of verses in the Book of Judges that describes the direction that the nation chose to take. Both of these verses are in two different chapters but say the exact same thing. So what this tells us is that what these two verses say reveal that the direction the nations chose to take they continued in that direction throughout the whole period of the Judges. Thus, Hannah's times are reflected in these two verses and here is what they say: "In those days Israel had no king; everyone did as he saw fit." (Judges 17:6; 21:25).

So what these two verses tell us is that during the time of the Judges basically everyone was doing what was right in their own eyes but not in God's eyes. In modern times we might say it like this, 'if it feels good then do it.' Or we might say, 'if it makes you happy, then it's all right.' Again, we might say, 'well, everyone else is doing it, why shouldn't I?' In both cases past and present, God's will and purpose is completely ignored.

Hannah was apparently one of the few of her times who understood that the direction the nation had taken was completely wrong and for the sake of her newborn son she had to take whatever measures necessary to make sure that he grew up doing what was right in the eyes of God, not in his own eyes.

So we must as parents and grandparents and Christian adults as well do all that we can in a world where everyone is doing what is right in their own eyes, and not what's right in God's eyes, to help our children in every way possible to grow up doing what is right in God's eyes. We must all be Hannah's in our present times.

III. Third, Hannah's times required Hannah's choice because of her duty to God. (I Sam 1:9, 10, 24-27; 2:1-11)

When I preached this message to the church I called this point the demand of God instead of her duty to God but both go hand in hand.

First of all, the choice that she made to dedicate her son completely to God was her duty to make because God had answered her prayer and blessed her with a son. When she had finished weaning her son Samuel she took him to Eli, the high priest, to allow him to raise Samuel and she explained to Eli why with these words, "As surely as you live, my Lord, I am the woman who stood here beside you praying to the Lord. I prayed for this child, and the Lord granted me what I have asked of Him. So now I give him to the Lord. For his whole life he will be given over to the Lord." And he worshipped the Lord there." (I Sam 1:26, 27)

So it is with us, our children are gifts to us from the Lord and He's blessed our lives in so many ways that we could never count them. Thus we have a duty and responsibility to raise our children in a way that is pleasing and honoring to our Lord.

Second, Hannah realized that it was her duty to give her son over to the Lord not only because of the answer God gave her to her prayer, but also because of her own accountability to the Lord.

When you read this powerful prayer that Hannah prayed in chapter two, you become keenly aware of the fact that Hannah had an amazing understanding of just who God is. This prayer is filled with theology. It reveals God as holy and as the only one who is God; that He's sovereignly in control of all things; that He's the creator and sustainer of all things, and many other things.

And so because God is who He is therefore according to Hannah all of us must give an account to Him. And those who oppose Him will be brought down but those who trust Him will be saved. "He will guard the feet of His saints, but the wicked will be silenced in darkness..." (I Sam 2:9).

So because of who God is and it is to Him we are all accountable Hannah made the choice to do what was right in God's eyes and gave her son over to the Lord. And so we too must do the same with our children because we too will be held accountable to Almighty God.

Conclusion:

When we stand before the Lord, He's not going to ask us did we choose to do with our children what as right in our own eyes, but rather did we do with them what was right in His eyes?

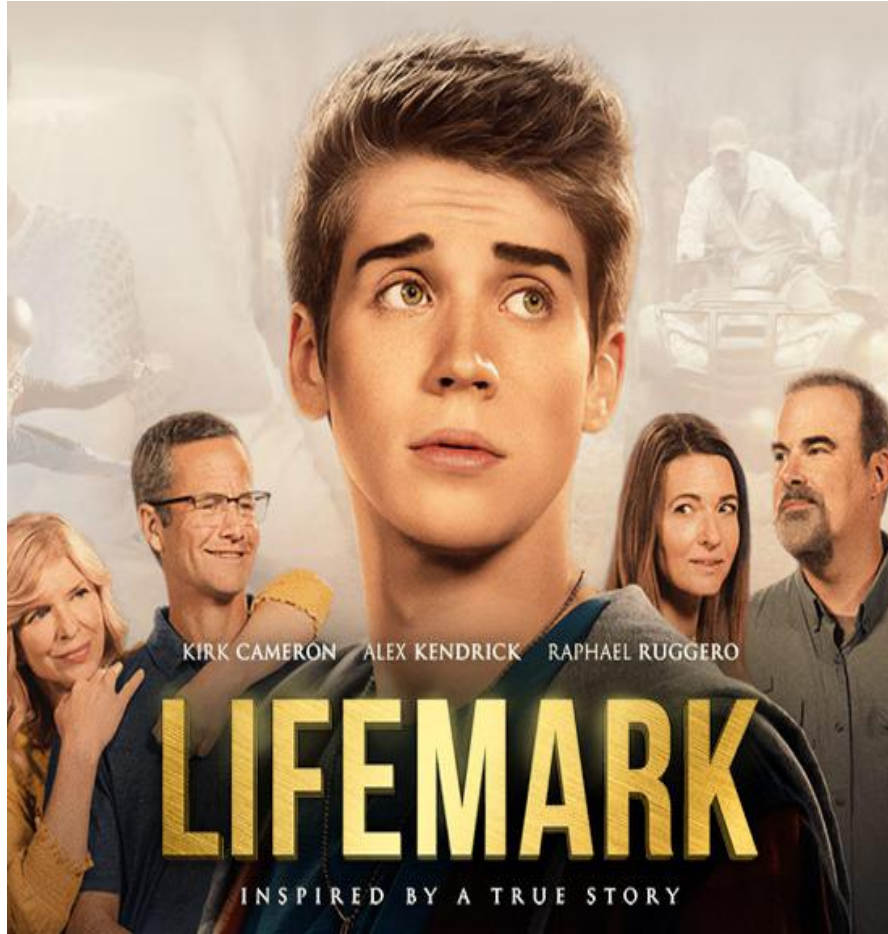

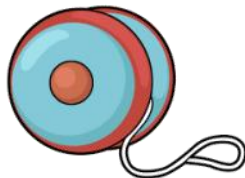

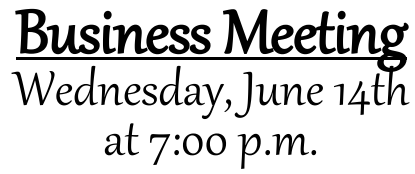
