

You're Not Finished Yet (Joshua 1:1-18)

Introduction:

We know that God promised to Israel land that would be their very own. In our set of verses, Israel after 40 long years of marching through the wilderness have finally reached the border of the promise land. Reaching that point was a great time of excitement and celebration.

However, reaching the border was not the end of their journey. Though it may have felt like it, and it indeed was a great time of accomplishment and celebration, yet in reality their journey was beginning all over again. For though they have reached the border, they must now go into the land and possess it. You can celebrate and rejoice that you've come this far, but the next phase of the journey must begin. Joshua is telling them that they're not finished yet.

Today with this message we want to say to all of our seniors that it's wonderful that you have reached this point in your life, and take a few days to celebrate it, but also understand that getting a high school diploma is not the end of the journey. Like Israel at the border of the promise land you must now begin the next phase of your journey and take hold of the plans and purpose that God has for the rest of your lives. Thus, this means that you're not finished yet.

I. First, you're not finished yet because you've still got a life to live.

God didn't bring Israel to the border of the promise land to merely give them a peek over. No, he told them in this chapter to prepare to march over into the promise land because in three days they were moving out and crossing the river to take possession.

So reaching the border was not the end game for the nation of Israel. Rather it was a new start for them. They now had to take hold of the rest of their lives God had prepared for them in the promise land.

Getting your high school diploma is not the end game that God has for your life. In a few days all of our celebrations will be over, and you will have to wake up and start living the rest of your life. You'll put the party hats, ceremonies, and special dinners given in your honor behind you and you'll start living the rest of your life. At least that's what is expected of you to do.

But we must remember that getting to the border of the promise land and going in to possess it was the life that God chose for Israel to live. As well we must chose to make the next journey of our lives the one that God has chosen for us to live. So we are not finished yet, we've still got a life to live the one God has chosen for us, so go live that life.

II. Second, you're not finished yet because you've got labor you must do.

It's indeed true that God had promised the land to Israel, but He didn't promise them that they could just sit back and cost along while He took care of everything for them in possessing the land. No, God told them that indeed it was theirs but they had to go in and possess it. It was God's gift to them, but they had to go in to be able to experience the promise God had made to them and it wasn't going to be easy, however, because of God it was all completely possible, but God chose to use the people themselves to possess it.

For forty years Israel had marched through the wilderness. In these forty years they learned a lot of things that could and did help them to go in and possess the land. So it is that God has helped each one of us to get to where we are at today and with that and trusting Him we must labor on taking hold of the life God's called us to. As the old hymn says, "we will work till Jesus come, and then we'll be gathered home."

Seniors, as well as all of us, must work hard for the cause of Christ. We are not finished yet not till Jesus comes.

III. Third, you're not finished yet because you've got the law that you must obey.

To the nation of Israel of course the law was a reference to God' word to them. In their forty years of wondering in the wilderness they received much of what is God's word as printed in the Bible today. And for then this word often came directly out of the voice of God himself. God reminds Israel as they are getting ready to march over into the promise land and take possession of it they were to do so in a manner that was conducive to the teaching of God's law that He had laid down for the nations in His Holy Word.

In other words whenever they took possession of the promise land they were to live in that land, and far as that goes anywhere they went, according to the laws God had given them.

Now in order for them to do this they had to know what God's law said and thus they needed to mediate on it. They then had to make a commitment to keep it and to never back down from it.

Young people and all of us we aren't finished yet because we've got God's word to get to know, learn, commit to and follow, never backing down. And that's exactly what the world is going to try to get us to do but don't let them, because it's only fulfilling God's word that will bring eternal rewards. Besides God is whom we will finally be accountable to, not the world.

IV. Fourth, you're not finished yet because you've got the Lord to see you through.

Yes, Israel had a life still to live, labor to do, the law to fulfill, all of which seemed a bit overwhelming, until they hear the rest of God's promise to them. He not only promises to them the land but He also promises to give them the power they will need to take possession of the land. The power will come from His presence with them. "I will give you every place where you set your foot, as I promised Moses... As I was with Moses so I will be you; I will never leave you nor forsake you. Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go." (vs 3, 5, 9). There are other verses in the chapter saying the same thing.

As God promised His abiding presences with Israel in the Old Testament and in the New Testament, He's done the same with the church. Jesus said that He would never leave us or forsake us and that He would go with us to the ends of the earth.

So we can go live the life God's called us to because He's promised to be there for us, and with us to guide us along the path He intends for us to take.

Conclusion:

So today we celebrate your achievements to be able to graduate but tomorrow we challenge us all go take hold of this life God has called us to because we can because He will see us through.
