From Fastor Ralph's Desk:



The Christian Clothing Part III

Introduction:

Five weeks ago we began looking at this set of verses for the purpose of noticing the particular set of clothing that the Apostle Paul said that Christians should be wearing. Now once again, we are not referring to literal clothing that we wear on our bodies, but rather we are referring to our spiritual clothing tht affects our attitude and behavior.

In these verses Paul gives us a list of eight pieces of clothing that he intends on us selecting. As we already pointed out in our previous two messages, these pieces of clothing are not a pick and choose selection. Rather Paul is pointing out that we are to select the entire group.

In this message we will look at the remaining three that we've not look at yet. But it behooves us to remind ourselves what the previous five were that we looked at, because all eight of them really require each of the other to be fully clothed in the manner God intends for us to be clothed. Those first five were compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness, and patience. So let's go shopping and pick up the remaining pieces of the Christian clothing.

II. Second, let's continue noticing the selection for the Christian clothing (vs 12-14)

F. Bearing with one another is the sixth selection (vs 13).

Now, of course, this is closely related to the previous point which was patience. It is patience carried out to its extreme end. It is patience doubled over.

We often hear and say my patience is running out or has run out, but this is not to be said of Christians in their dealing with one another. For they are to go to the extra mile and literally endure one another, even when they've been wronged. Retaliation has no room in our dealings because we are bearing and enduring one another.

As with all of these pieces of clothing, we find Jesus to always be the supreme example and it's also the case with bearing with one another. To see this to be the case all you've got to do is read the Gospel. In the Gospels, of course, we read of Jesus walking in our midst. As He walked among us, He chose 12 men to be His disciples. The three years that those men walked with Him and followed Him they were constantly bickering with each other and arguing with each other. They were often comparing themselves to one another to show who was the best among them. They eventually either denied Him or even betrayed Him. But through it all Jesus endured them, and praise be to His name that He endures us through all eternity.

G. Forgiving one another is the seventh selection (vs 13).

Of course, if we were asked the question "what is the most discussed Biblical subject," forgiveness would be right up near the top. However. Usually when we are discussing the topic of forgiveness, it generally is a discussion about God's amazing and gracious forgiveness that He demonstrated to us through the sacrificial offering of His glorious and holy Son Jesus Christ.

However, what very often gets left out of the discussion is God's expectation for us to forgive one another based upon His forgiveness of our sins. Well, Jesus gives us a story in the Gospels that powerfully illustrates our forgiving one another. This story that Jesus shares begins with a statement that the Apostle Peter made. "Then Peter came to Jesus and asked, 'Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother or sister who sin against me? Up to seven times." (Matt 18:21).

Now Jesus' response to this was mind boggling to Peter and as well to us today. Peter thought he was being generous when he suggested seven times. For the Jewish religious leaders of the time taught that you forgive them twice, but the third time you retaliate. Jesus, however, said that you forgive them seven times seventy. Which was a reference to an endless number of times. Then Jesus gives the story that illustrates His statement to Peter.

The story is about a king who decided to settle accounts with his servants. As he did this, he discovered that one of his servants owed him an enormous debt. A debt that by today's values would be in the millions of dollars. There was no way the servant could get the money he needed to pay the king back. So the king decided to sell the man, his wife, his children, and everything he owned to repay the debt.

However the servant began to plead with his king to please give him time that he would eventually pay him back. He continued begging the king until the king took pity and showed mercy by forgiving the man his entire debt.

Now you would think that this servant would be so overjoyed that he would do the same for anyone that owed him a debt, but he did not allow his experience of forgiveness with his king to affect his actions toward his fellow servants. For a fellow served owed him a small amount -- roughly between \$20 to \$50 in today's currency. This fellow servant's debt couldn't even begin to compare to the millions the other servant had owed the king, but instead of forgiving his fellow servant, he had him cast into prison until he paid him back what he owed him.

Now when the king heard what this servant did, he chastised him and threw him in jail until he paid the king for his new debt of unforgiveness. Then Jesus said these words to His disciples, "This is how your heavenly Father will treat each of you unless you forgive your brother or sister from your heart." This story says it all: Because Jesus has forgiven us, we must forgive one another.

H. Loving one another is the eighth selection (vs 14)

This is the final piece of the selection, but not because it's of least importance. Rather it's the final piece because it is the most important. As a matter of fact, without this piece of clothing you wouldn't be able to wear the rest of the selection, because this is the piece that makes all the other pieces possible and it's the one piece that binds all the other pieces together.

The Apostle Paul said, "Let no debt remain outstanding, except the continuing debt to love one another, for whoever loves others has fulfilled the law. The commandments, 'you shall not commit adultery,' 'you shall not murder,' 'you shall not steal,' 'you shall not covet,' and whatever other command there may be, are summed up in this one command: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' Love does no harm to a neighbor. Therefore love is the fulfillment of the law." (Romans 13:8-10).

Jesus said it to His disciples in a very strong manner when He said, "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another." (John 13:34).

Conclusion:

So let us this new church year make sure that we have put on the proper attire by selecting the clothing that our Lord has chosen for us to put on as discovered in these verses that we have covered.

If we do so, we will be able to unite over the things that matter and not fight over the things that don't matter.



- ·ONE black non-retractable pen (no wire clips, no other color ink)
- ONE standard size writing tablet approx. 6"x9" (no wire bound books, composition books, post-it notes, or colored paper)
- •ONE adult toothbrush (individually factory-sealed, no multi-packs)
- ONE 4 oz to 6 oz toothpaste (no travel size)
- ONE 3.2 oz to 6 oz bar of soap (no travel size, no unwrapped or unboxed bars)
- •TWO rolls of hard candy like LifeSavers, Mentos, Breath Savers (NO Smarties, Sweetarts, Necco Wafers, Rolos, Starburst, TicTacs)
- THREE first-class #10 Stamp-Embossed Envelopes (from US Post Office, NO regular stamps, no other size envelope)
- ONE gallon size zipper bag (no other size bags accepted)

ALL ITEMS MUST FIT IN THE ZIPPER BAG WITH ZIPPER CLOSED SECURELY DO NOT INCLUDE: washcloths, toothbrush holders, floss, combs. Extra approved items may be sent to NewSpring Church on collection day in a bag/box marked "extra items."

You put it together. We'll put it in the right hands. God will do the rest.

The Christmas Packets for Prisoners project began in 1976. It is a joint project of SCBC and SC WMU. As the project has grown, our churches continue to give faithfully and generously. Thank you for sharing the love of Jesus with those who need to know Jesus in a personal way.
