From Pastor Ralph's Desk:



Rebuilding Walls and Restoring Lives, Part 5 (Nehemiah 6:15-7:5, 7:73-8:1)

Introduction:

We've looked at a number of things in this rebuilding walls and restoring lives series. We've looked at why the walls came down. What we discovered was that Israel's rebellion against God brought the walls down, and it's our own rebellion that caused our walls of protection and security to crumble down as well.

Second, we looked at how it's possible for our broken walls and our broken lives to be put back together. What we discovered is that the restoring of our lives is God's business. He made a promise to Israel to restore them. He had plans to bring His promise to pass and He has the power to back it all up. It's the same for us. He has made promises and put those promises into action with the plans He had from the foundation of the earth. Because He's God those plans have been carried out through Christ Jesus our lord. Therefore, it's now possible to experience that restoration.

Third, we've examined when is the right time to experience that building and restoring of our lives. The answer that God's Word gives us is now and there's an urgency to do it now because time is hastening now.

With this message I want us to examine what thing took place once the rebuilding of the walls in Jerusalem were completed. For there are many correlations between what things happened to the Jews once the walls were completed and what happens to our lives once we allow our blessed Lord Jesus Christ to restore them.

I. First, what took place when the walls were completed was that our God was exalted while the foes were deflated (vs 6:15, 16).

Israel's foes used every strategy in the book to prevent the Jews from getting the walls rebuilt. Their foes had been entranced in this area longer than those Jews who had returned to the promised land over 70 years earlier. They also had more resources and persons available to oppose the work. Yet in spite of all this, they could not stop the work from getting done. When the walls were completed in 52 days, the enemy was astonished, surprised, angry, but mostly defeated and deflated. For in these two verses, for this point, Nehemiah tells us that when the work was completed, their foes were both afraid and lost their-self confidence.

Now it wasn't because of the Jews themselves that caused the foes to be afraid and lose their self-confidence. Rather, it was the fact as Nehemiah said, ". . .because they realized that this work had been done with the help of our God." (vs 16). So both the Jews themselves, who rebuilt the walls, and the foes who opposed the work acknowledge that the work was accomplished solely because of the help of Almighty God. Without His help, the work would have never gotten completed.

When we turn to our Blessed Lord and allow him to restore our lives, which can never happen without His help, then we ourselves who have experienced the restoration will stand up and give all honor and glory to our Blessed Lord Jesus Christ. Also, however, not only will we give our Lord the credit, so will those who are our foes and those who are still outside the walls will, too, understand and know that apart from God, our lives would have never been restored and rebuilt. This can give them hope for their lives while deflating and discouraging our enemies.

II. Second, what took place when the walls were completed was that fear was relieved (vs 7:1-5).

Now it was not like all of a sudden, they felt total and complete relief. For we are told in these verses for this point that Nehemiah placed guards at all the gates and at first only allowed the gates to be open for a short period of the day. Nehemiah understood that though the enemy may be deflated for a time, he never completely goes away. So we have to always have a watchful eye and be ever alert.

However, we clearly see that there is much more relief once the walls are completed because Nehemiah and the people began making plans for getting things up and going within the city that had not been taking place while the walls were down. These plans were to repopulate the town within the walls because very few refused to live there while the walls were down, but now they need not be afraid.

Just as these walls offer protection and security for the Jews, so when we allow Lord Jesus Christ restore our lives and put back together then our lives become more secure than we can ever imagine. For just as the walls surrounded the people of this city with security and protection, so we are surrounded with the love, mercy, grace, and power of our blessed Lord, as He now holds us in fold of his glorious hand.

Jesus said, "My sheep listen to my voice; I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish; no one will snatch them out of my hand. My Father, who has given them to me, is greater than all; no one can snatch them out of my Father's hand. I and the Father are one." (John 10:27-30).

So if you want to conquer your fears, so you can live for Jesus then you must allow him to restore you.

III. Third, what took place when the walls were completed was that their focus was changed (vs 7:1-5).

Now while the walls have been down the city was open to the enemies of their faith. As a matter of fact, many of them were themselves working with the enemy. They were working with the enemy either because they were afraid of what the enemy would do to them if they did not work with them or because they liked the enemy and wanted to work with them.

Now, however, that the walls were up, they didn't have to either be afraid of the foe or they didn't have to choose to go along with him because they were now safe within their walls. Now they could have a new focus. One that now zeroed in on the things of God. They could now focus on being the community of God's people doing His will and His way. They could also focus upon helping one another.

So it is that when we allow our blessed Lord to restore our lives and rebuild them, then we will be able to change the focus of our lives in the direction of the things that please our Lord and truly benefit our lives and the lives of others around us in a far more positive manner and a far more joyous spirit. There's no doubt that many whose walls have crumbled they are clearly saying that they wish the direction of their lives could change. Well, our blessed Lord can do that very thing. 'He can make all things work together for our good and His glory.' (Rom 8:28).

IV. Fourth, what took place when the walls were completed was it evangelism became a priority (vs 7:1-5)

Once the walls were completed, one of the things that Nehemiah felt led to do was to get the city repopulated. Because the walls were down, no one hardly wanted to live there, but now that it was safe because the walls had been rebuilt, it was time to get the people to come back and live there. So Nehemiah went to work to get people to refill the city.

In a sense, Nehemiah was doing work similar to evangelism. For he was compelling people to leave wherever they were at in order to move into the city so he could fill it up.

In like manner, when God calls us and restores our lives then one of the priorities we will experience is the desire to get others to experience the same grace that He showed us. We will want to fill up the house, so to speak, by compelling others to come to Christ. "And the Lord said unto the servant, 'Go out into the highways and hedges and compel them to come in, that my home may be filled." (Luke 14:23)

V. Fifth, what took place when the walls were completed was that God's word took precedent (vs 7:73-8:1).

Shortly after the walls were rebuilt the people within the city called Ezra the teacher of the law to come and read and give understanding of God's Holy Word. They understood that now that God had led them to rebuild the walls and restored them that they were responsible to live out their lives in the manner that God desired them to. They also understood that the only way they could do that was to receive God's word because that is how God leads us into the things he wants us to do. It's all right there in the pages of God's Holy Word.

It alone is the authority for our lives because it is God's word. Therefore, it must take precedent over all other authorities.

The Apostle Paul said it this way, "All scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting, and training us in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work." (2 Tim 3:16,17).

Conclusion:

With the walls of Jerusalem rebuilt the city was a much better place to be. It was a total different environment, different spirit, and different feel, but all in a very good way. Once again, people wanted to be there and indeed and fact moved there. Inside those walls they became a community of believers seeking God's will and helping and supporting each other.

So when we allow Christ Jesus our Lord to restore and rebuild our lives we then will feel much better and our lives will be much better, safe in the arms of Jesus.
