From Pastor Ralph's Desk:

Growing Bigger By Growing Smaller

Introduction:

Last Sunday, we looked at priorities in worship. This came from our studies in the book of Nehemiah. One of the priorities that we examined was the priority of proclaiming God's Holy Word. We discovered that it appeared that when they held their first big Jewish festival, once they completed the rebuilding of the city walls, and Ezra, the scribe, stood on a platform above all the people and read to them from God's Holy Word that he would periodically stop, and then allow the priests that were scattered out amidst the crowd to gather the people into smaller groups to give them understanding of God's Holy Word that Ezra has been reading to them.

So the point I'm making is the proclamation of God's word was provided in both the large setting as well as the smaller groups.

We find this to be a pattern throughout God's word, That fellowship, worship and discipleship were carried in both large group settings, as well as smaller group settings. Both settings are definitely required for the health, wellbeing, and growth of the Body of Christ, His blessed Church.

The large group settings are needed so that everybody together can use their commitment, devotion and love for God to be able to express their worship together as one. This type of worship is good for the well-being and health of the church because watching and experiencing the large group worship gives you encouragement as you see everyone together participating in the event.

Also, however, small groups settings are needed because of what they are able to provide that the larger group worship experience cannot. As a matter of fact, most of us live out our lives in small group settings. From the families that we live with, to the small businesses that we go to, to the office where we wait to see a few people, to the classrooms that we attend in our school, we more often are in small group settings.

The value of small group settings for the church is immense. For they give to us a far more personal experience than we can get in the large group setting. You are able to build relationships on a name to name basis, and this will allow the groups to get more intimate with one another, creating a greater ability to have close fellowship and have the ability to better care for one another. It also allows for a more personal and intimate study of God's Holy Word where each participant is able to be a part of this discussion.

Small group settings help people to feel like they belong and also as though they are not overwhelmed by large settings.

At Great Swamp Baptist Church for the time being our small groups are primarily Sunday School. There is also the Grandmothers Group, Swamp Kids, youth, and praise teams. We are presently starting to have Sunday School leaders come together and discuss how we can better do our primary small groups setting, and of course one of the things that we can do to help is to promote it. So I am with this message encouraging everyone to not just settle with Sunday morning worship service, but also choose Sunday school. This way we can grow as a church bigger as we grow it smaller.

I want to close this message with how the church created health, growth, and well-being for itself when our blessed Lord brought it into existence. They did both large group meetings at the temple and small group settings in their homes. "They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles. All the believers were together and had everything in common. They sold property and possessions to give to anyone who had need. Every day they continued to meet together in the temple courts. They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favor of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved." (Act 2:42-47).
