From Pastor Ralph's Desk:

For Such a Time as This

(Esther 4:9-17)

Introduction:

On Wednesday nights we've been preaching through the book of Esther. A few Wednesday nights ago we looked at our last message in the book before we moved on to the book of Job. The set of verses that we examined for the last message are the most famous ones in the entire book. As a matter fact if a pastor or preacher speaks from this book he will almost always uses these verses for his sermon. As a matter of fact for many these verses are the primary reason that this book being the only book in the Bible that doesn't directly mention God's name, was able to find it's way into the Bible.

Most people reading this message are aware of the circumstances that are taking place. Haman whose second in command in the kingdom of the Medes and Persians because of his hatred for the Jewish man, Mordecai has decided that he's going to have all the Jews in the kingdom annihilated.

However Mordecai believes that his cousin whom he raised, of course, named Esther, who was made queen to bring Xerxes was positioned into to her role for such a time as this. Meaning that he believed that God had put her into her role so that she could be used by God to deliver the Jewish people from the wicked Haman.

We, too, need to realize that God has raised us up for such a time as what we are facing. For once again there are many, many people across our globe that want to annihilate the Jews but also Christians. They also want to make right wrong and wrong right.

So it is time that we realize that as Christians God has placed us where we are for such a time as this. I pray that the example of Esther will motivate us.

I. First, let's notice that for such a time as this we need to be shocked and stricken by the circumstances (vs 11-14)

Now according to verse 11 it appears as though that Esther out of fear for her own life had decided that she was not going to get involved with what was taking place at that particular time. She figured that if she did nothing that she herself would probably be okay.

So the question is what was it that finally changed her mind to decide to become involved and do something about what was taking place?

Well, it was the shocking and shattering news that he cousin Mordecai shared with her. He told her that if she did nothing that not only would the Jewish people out in the kingdom perish but she and he would as well.

So the dire circumstances that Mordecai shared with her shocked her to the place where she realized that she no longer could just sit by and do nothing. She realized that the shocking circumstances required that she had to do something or the shocking and dire circumstances were only going to get more shocking and dire.

We too need to be shocked and stricken by the dire circumstances all around us and wake up to the fact that if we do nothing they will only get worse. We also need to see that the most shocking thing is that everyone without a personal relationship with Jesus Christ is headed for a devilish hell and we alone have the answer that can save them. May our God shock us to the point that we wake up and get involved with his work in the world.

II. Second, let's notice that for such a time as this we need to seek out our Christ (vs 15-17)

After being moved to do something because of the shocking circumstances presented to her she knew that she would need divine intervention to be able to get anything done about the dire circumstances she faced. She knew that it would take more than her position as queen to move the king. She knew that she needed the King of kings to move her earthly being to intervene and listen to her in order to get him to change the dire circumstances.

Thus Esther asked Mordecai to get Jewish people all over the Kingdom to fast for 3 days as she and her attendants what is well before she approach the king. Though the word prayer is not mentioned in these verses we know however that fasting is what the Jews did when they were focused upon intently seeking God and prayer over certain matters that had arisen and needed the help of God to deal with them.

Well no doubt whatsoever that the circumstances Esther and the Jews were dealing with, their very existence, truly needed God's wisdom power and guidance to bring about a positive result.

As Christians, in a world right now filled with the most dire circumstances that I've ever seen in my lifetime, are so blessed to have a savior in Lord through whom we have full continuous access to the very throne room of heaven. Where we can boldly seek for the life we need to make a difference in a world with such shocking and shattering news.

"Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has ascended into heaven, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to empathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are—yet he did not sin. Let us then approach God's throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need." (Heb 4:14-16).

III.Third, let's notice that for such a time as this we need to stand up for the right cause (vs 12-14; 10:1-3)

Now in this entire book it's obvious what was the right cause. It was the very salvation of the Jews from annihilation and that is the very cause that both Esther and Mordecai attempted to accomplish and it's the right cause because God has over and over promised and prophecies Prophesized that he indeed would save and deliver His chosen earthly people. Praise His holy name. He's going to do it again and ultimately bring them to full and complete salvation in Christ Jesus, our Lord. "I do not want you to be ignorant of this mystery, brothers and sisters, so that you may not be conceited: Israel has experienced a hardening in part until the full number of the Gentiles has come in, and in this way all Israel will be saved. As it is written: "The deliverer will come from Zion; he will turn godlessness away from Jacob. And this is my covenant with them when I take away their sins." (Romans 11:25 -27).

So the right cause is always for the salvation of all people both Jews and Gentiles. And for such a time as this God has called His church to understand that the only hope for the shocking circumstance we see is to bring people to the saving grace of Jesus who alone can save anyone willing to trust Him from annihilation, from death, from the grave and from hell.

Are we at such a time like these standing up for the right cause?

IV. Fourth, let's notice that for such a time as this we need to speak up with clarity and confidence (vs 14:7:3-6).

There's no way tht you can be shocked by the circumstances, seek out Christ, and stand up for the right cause and not speak up. Esther knew that the only way that she could get the king to deal with this dire circumstances was to speak to the king about them. Only once the kind could hear about he issue could he respond.

Well, he for sure heard and he heard the concern with clarity and confidence. She told the king that there was a person who wanted to destroy her and all of the Jewish people. Well, the king wanted to immediately know who the man was and right is Haman's presence she told the king that Haman was the vile person that south to kill her and all of her people.

Now because she spoke up it resulted in the salvation of the Jewish people on this occasion.

So it is in our times such as these if we are going to make a difference we've got to speak up with clarity and confidence. For unless the world hears our message they cant respond in faith. Just as Paul tells us in the book of Romans, "How, then, can they call on the one they have not believed in? And how can they believe in the one of whom they have not heard? And how can they hear without someone preaching to them? -- Consequently faith comes from hearing the message, and the message is heard through the word about Christ." (Romans 10:15, 15, 17).

You can't just say well I'll show them by my actions. Our actions are certainly important but they want to tell the whole story. People need to hear the message before they can respond in faith. For it's the message of Jesus Christ that will cause their faith to arise. So let us like Esther speak up with clarity and confidence.

Conclusion

May it be written or said of each of us that we understood that we knew that our God had places us here for such a time like these.


