

We Are God's Handiwork

Eph 2:1-10

Introduction:

This last Sunday was Labor Day weekend. So my message centered around the theme of labor and work. We noticed to begin with that as far as we can tell the very first public celebration of the American worker took place September 5, 1882 when New York City put on a parade in honor of the American laborer. As a matter of fact, this parade actually proceeded the federal recognition of Labor Day.

The federal recognition of a day honoring the hard working efforts of the American work force took place when President Grover Cleveland on June 28, 1894 signed a law recognizing the first Monday of September as a Labor Day celebration. Since that time the entire country has celebrated the first Monday of September as Labor Day.

However long before America was ever a nation and long before there was an official day set aside to honor the efforts of laborers and workers the word of God had already recognized and honored the labor and work of the greatest worker of all time and His name is God.

Our present set of verses that we are looking at for this message we are specifically told that "...we are God's handiwork..." (vs 10). The Bible leaves us no doubt whatsoever that we are God's greatest work of His labor. So in this message we will notice how we are God's handiwork.

I. First, we are God's handiwork because He creates us (vs 10)

Now it is absolutely obvious that before God could or can do any other work in our lives He first had to and has to create us. And that's exactly what the first chapter of the Bible is all about. That God first and foremost is our creator. It also clearly teaches that we are His greatest handiwork because He created human beings alone in His image (Gen 1:26, 27).

However the first chapter in the Bible is definitely not the last chapter of the Bible revealing the fact that we and everything else is God's handiwork. God knew that a day would come when sinful humanity would raise up a generation of scientists in the world that would go out of their way to present our world and universe as a place created by mere chance or random processes absent of a personal creator. Thus God made sure that His word from the very beginning to the very end is filled with references of His creation's power most particular of His creating us. In the Old Testament alone God is mentioned as creator in some form or fashion around 2,600 times.

"This is what the Lord says -- the Holy One of Israel, and its Maker: Concerning things to come, do you question me about my children, or give me orders about the work of my hands? It is I who made the earth and created mankind on it. My own hands stretched out the heavens; I marshaled their starry hosts." (Is 45:11-12).

"Come, let us sing for joy to the Lord; let us shout aloud to the Rock of our salvation. Let us come before him with thanksgiving and extol him with music and song. For the Lord is the great God, the great King above all gods. In his hand are the depths of the earth, and the mountain peaks belong to him. The sea is his, for he made it, and his hands formed the dry land. Come, let us bow down in worship, let us kneel before the Lord our Maker; for he is our God and we are the people of his pasture, the flock under his care." (Ps:1-7).

"Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth. Worship the Lord with gladness; come before him with joyful songs. Know that the Lord is God. It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, the sheep of his pasture. Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name. For the Lord is good and his love endures forever; his faithfulness continues through all generations." (Ps 100:1-5).

So let us rejoice that we are not mere accidents but rather the handiwork of our great and awesome God who placed His image in each one of us.

II. Second, we are God's handiwork because He converts us (vs 10)

So in our first point we took notice that we are God's handiwork because He created us. However tragically once Adam and Eve sinned against our holy God there was a part of our original creation that died. That part was our spiritual life. That's the part of our being that allows us the privilege to walk intimately with God.

However as our first three verses clearly reveal our spiritual life has been destroyed by the sins that we have all committed. "As for you, you were dead in your transgressions and sins, in which you used to live when you followed the ways of this world and of the ruler of the kingdom of the air, the spirit who is now at work in those who are disobedient. All of us also lived among them at one time, gratifying the cravings of our flesh and following its desires and thoughts. Like the rest, we were by nature deserving of wrath." (vs 1 -3).

Now everyone knows that whatever is dead is incapable of doing anything. But blessed be the name of our gracious, merciful, and loving God that by His almighty power He can bring back life to our dead spirits so that we can have that intimate personal relationship with Him.

He does this through His grace toward us. A word which means unmerited favor. In other words God has given us His favor to allow us to know Him, without meriting it, through the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus Christ. As we noted already because our spiritual lives are dead we can't resurrect them. However Jesus Christ can because He overcame death through His own resurrection. And God is willing to resurrect our dead spirits freely when we are willing to put our absolute trust in Jesus Christ our Lord who died to forgive us and resurrected to give us life spiritually and eternally. This is the conversion that I'm referencing to and no one not even ourselves can save us, redeem us, convert us, and give back life to our spirits but Jesus Christ. Without Him you remain spiritually dead forever. Jesus is the only, absolutely, only way, and God is willing to freely allow us to believe in Him for our conversion. Won't you let God do His handiwork of conversion in your life today?

III.Third, we are God's Handiwork because He calls us (vs 10)

In life we often, as the old saying goes, get the cart before the horse. Well, what we are referring to in this particular point is the fact that many preachers, churches, denominations, religions, organizations indeed get the cart before the horse. They first place the calling I'm referring to which is the calling to good works, ahead of the previous point of conversion.

In other words these folks take away from the handiwork of God by placing some of His handiwork into our own hands. They do this by claiming that we do good works in order that we might obtain or keep our conversion or salvation.

However before God mentions the good works that He called us to do He first gave us nine verses describing how He saved us purely by His grace and His grace alone. Our works, our accomplishments, and our pride had not one thing to do with our conversions or salvations. The only boasting we can do is boasting in our Lord Jesus Christ. To Him be all the glory.

So God has saved us not by good works but so that we can do good works. So even the good works are God's handiwork for He planned the ones He wants us to do and He created us and converted making it possible for us to do them. To God be all the glory.

Conclusion:

All of us are God's handiwork through creation but not all of us are His handiwork of conversion and calling. However God make all of His handwork available to any and all who are willing to place their trust in His grace through His glorious Son the Lord Jesus Christ. So let God finish His handiwork in you today by crying out to the Lord Jesus in faith trusting in Him alone.


