



The Old One Hundred Psalm 100:1-5

Introduction:

Mary Tudor became Queen of England in 1553. She was a staunch Roman Catholic and was determined to push the Protestants out of England, or at least convert them to Catholicism. This resulted in many Protestants fleeing England to other nations that would allow them to worship God in the manner they believed God would have them to.

Now one of the men that fled England was a man named William Kethe. He not only was a Protestant but he also wrote music. Out of gratitude for getting away from Queen Mary, William Kethe took Psalm 100 and turned it into a song. A song of praise and thanksgiving to the greatness, the grace, and the goodness of our God. It was entitled "The Old One Hundred."

So in this message I want us to take a look at the Old One Hundred, and like William Kethe, allow it to move us to great gratitude for our blessed Lord.

I. First, let's notice that the Old One Hundred is a call to worship that's passionate and powerful (vs 1, 2, 4)

The passion and power that I'm referring to is found in these verses with words like "shout," "gladness," "joyful songs," "come," "enter." these words all indicate that our worship, praise, and thanksgiving should be done with great enthusiasm and excitement.

Now, of course, we need to remember that Paul teaches us that worship should be in an orderly fashion. "For God is not a God of confusion, but of peace. But all things, should be done decently and in order." (I Cor 14:33, 40). Paul was speaking to the Corinth Church that had a lot of confusion taking place during worship because people were speaking in unknown tongues that nobody could understand. So while worship should be done in an orderly fashion in order to do away with confusion it should in no manner prevent us from lifting up our voice in an exuberant praise of our great God.

Along with our passionate praise it should be done with joy and gladness. When we are not passionate, joyful, and glad worshippers we display a message that there's nothing special about our faith and our God, and that He doesn't bring joy and gladness to our lives.

Matthew Henry, that great preacher of the past said, "By holy joy we do really serve God. Gospel worshippers should be joyful worshippers." So let us come together every Lord's day with passionate and powerful worship. Our God is totally worthy of it.

II. Second, let's notice that the Old One Hundred is a call to worship from all people (vs 1)

The way the verse puts it is that, "all the earth" is to come before our blessed Lord and give him passionate and powerful worship. It's a call for all people's of all nationalities, of all skin colors, of all languages, of all sizes to come together to give worship unto God.

This teaches us that we must never limit our worship to people who are just like ourselves. Rather we must be willing to lift our voices in praise and thanksgiving alongside of those whose skin color may be different than ours, or who came from a different part of the world, or who has different likes than we do. For worship is not about who we are but who God is. And we all were created by the same God through the same original parents so let us lay aside our differences and come together and praise our God.

There is a day coming in which every knee shall bow and every tongue confess that Jesus is Lord to the glory of God the Father (Phil 2:10, 11). That day will include those who refused to believe in Christ and, of course, all who chose to follow Christ. And since all will be made to worship Him on that day let us not wait to be forced to do so. Rather let us choose to believe and follow Him now as our Lord and Savior and give Him all the joyful worship that He deserves.

III.Third, let's notice that the Old One Hundred is a call to worship through participation (vs 2, 4)

There are two strong words in these two verses that call us to participate in worship. They are "come" and "enter." Both of these words indicate an invitation and an open door. Our holy God has invited sinful humanity with the privilege and opportunity to come before His presence and worship Him.

This invitation however is not for everyone to come any way they choose. Remember it's God who gives the invitation. Therefore this means that it's only by God's method and means that we are allowed to come before His Holy presence. And that means is only through His glorious Son, the Lord Jesus Christ. Our sins separated us from God, but the apostle Paul shows us how we can be reconciled to God. "...We implore you on Christ behalf: Be reconciled to God. God made Him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God." (2 Cor 5:20, 21).

A young lad left the country side to come to London to see the king. When he got to the palace the gates were closed and locked. The guards standing at attention told the young man to go on because the palace was closed and he couldn't see the king. But he pleaded passionately to be allowed to see the king. Still however they refused to let him in. Then the police came along and encouraged him to leave. But the young lad continued to plead his case with the guard and police. So a well-dressed man overhead the pleading of the young lad with the guard and policeman. He approached the young lad and took his hand and said, come with me. As He did the police moved on and the guard graciously opened the gate and let the welldressed man through to the palace yard along with the young lad. He then led the young lad into the palace all the way into the presence of the king. You see the well-dressed man was the Prince of Wales, the king's son. So we, too, through the king's son, the Lord Jesus Christ have an open door opportunity to come into God's presence to worship Him. So let us, "come before Him with joyful songs." (vs 2).

IV. Fourth, let's notice that the Old One Hundred is a call to worship with perception (vs 3, 5)

To perceive something means that we see and understand something. Well, the psalmist says that what we perceive that should lead us to passionate and powerful worship is our knowledge of God. In other words when you have the knowledge and understanding of who God is then you shouldn't have to be pushed into worshipping Him because you will be moved purely from how great He is.

There are three things at least in these verses that the Psalmist tells us of who God is. First, he tells us that, "The Lord is God." Our Lord alone is God Almighty. If that was all we knew about God it would be enough to cause us to worship Him forever. For because He is God it makes Him capable of being the other persons He's presented to be.

Second, the Psalmist tells us that He's our creator, and that's because He's God. We didn't evolve, we didn't cause ourselves to be, rather our blessed Lord created us.

Third, the Psalmist tells us that God is our Savior. For the Psalmist tells us that, "We are His people, the sheep of His pasture." (vs 3). Not everyone whose been created are automatically a part of God's spiritual sheepfold. For Jesus said, "Very truly I tell you, I am the gate for the sheep. All who have come before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep have not listened to them. I am the gate; whoever enters through me will be saved. They will come in and out, and find pasture." (John 10:7-10).

Also the Psalmist tells us that not only the knowledge and perception of who God is but also the knowledge and perception of what God does will cause us to joyfully worship our Lord Jesus Christ. "For the Lord is good and His love endures forever; His faithfulness continues through all generations." (vs 5)

With the perception of who God is and what He does we will forever have unending causes for worshipping our God.

Conclusion:

So from the points presented in this message there should never be any excuses presented from any of us for not exalting and praising our Blessed Lord God Almighty. He alone is worthy.


