From the Pastor's desk:

Jesus View of Children

Mark 10:13-16

Introduction:

In the writing of Antiquity we generally don't find much written about children, but when we do it often reveals a negative view of them.

However one Book of Antiquity, the Bible, the word of God gives us a positive picture of children. A good example is found in the book of Psalms. "Children are a heritage from the Lord, offspring a reward from Him. Like arrows in the hands of a warrior are children born in one's youth. Blessed is the man whose quiver is full of them. They will not be put to shame when they contend with their opponents in court." (Ps. 127:3-5).

So the Psalmist is telling us that children are a blessing from the Lord. Well, this positive view of children is also found in the New Testament. Especially is this the case with Jesus' view of children, and that's the message that I want us to examine for this sermon since we have done a baby dedication this past Sunday. So let's look at Jesus' view of children.

I. First, let's notice Jesus' view of children from His passion that He expresses for them (vs 13,14)

Generally when we think of the word passion being expressed toward someone we see visions of joy and excitement being displayed. However, on this occasion Jesus expressed His passion for the children with indignation. The indignation was not directed toward the children but rather toward His own disciples. For they were rebuking the parents seeking to have their children to be blessed by Jesus. In other words they were being a hindrance for these children getting to see Jesus, and this angered Him.

The disciples were being indignant toward the parents, and Jesus was indignant toward the disciples. Jesus was sympathetic toward the desire of those parents and guardians because He sees children as a blessing from the Lord and is worthy of His love and attention. So the question that needs to be asked of us all as a church, as parents, and as an individual, do we see children as a blessing, or as a problem, as a heritage or as nuisance?

The tragedy is that our world has some very awful views of our children. They often see them as pawns to be used in the world of human trafficking, or property to be pushed around and abused or as an object not even worth being considered a human being. All of these points of views just mentioned cause our blessed Lord to be indignant toward those who choose to treat children in these ways. May we choose instead to follow the steps of our Lord doing all that we can to implore our children to come to Jesus.

II. Second, let's notice Jesus' view of children from His purpose that He desires for them (vs 13, 14)

Now it's quite obvious what's Jesus' desires for the children and it is that they be brought to Him. And what is the purpose for bringing the children to Jesus? So that through their trust in Him, with the same kind of trust that they express in someone like their parents, they would become a part of the kingdom of God. Thus, before they could enter the kingdom of God they must first come to Jesus, and that's exactly what our blessed Lord wants them to do.

We, too, must grasp this desire and purpose that Jesus has for our children and do everything possible not to hinder them from coming to Jesus but rather do everything possible to bring them to Jesus. There are many ways that we can hinder children from coming to Jesus, but there also are many ways that we can help them come to Jesus.

So let us consider a few ways that we can help our children come to Jesus. First, the best way we can help them come to Jesus is to come to Him ourselves. Our own personal example will encourage them to consider the fact that if coming to Jesus was important to us then it should be for them.

Another way we can help the children come to Jesus is by reading and sharing God's word with them. One day Jesus was speaking to the religious authorities in Jerusalem and He said to them, "You study the scripture diligently because you think that in them you have eternal life. These are the very scriptures that testify about me, yet you refuse to come to me to have life." (John 5:39, 40). So Jesus was saying that God's word points people to Jesus.

A third way we can help children come to Jesus is by taking them to church where they can receive re-enforcement with the spiritual training that you as a parent are doing with them at home. At church they will see, hear, and experience worship of the very one that we are encouraging them to believe in. And this worship will be done by other families and individuals which will further give them more examples of others following Jesus.

Finally without elaborating if we want to encourage them to trust in Jesus then we must love them as Christ has loved us. For love is a most powerful motivating tool.

These are a few of the ways we can help to challenge our children to go to Jesus. When you leave any of those out you begin to hinder your children's journey to Jesus. So let's pray that the Holy Spirit will guide us to do the right thing to guide our children to Jesus so that they can be a part of God's kingdom.

III.Third, let's notice Jesus' view of children from His participation with them (vs 1, 6)

Now the participation I'm referring to is that fact that He became very personal with them. He did this first of all by receiving them and taking time with them. He also took time to touch them in a Godly manner thus letting these children understand how important they are to Him. Finally the verse says that he blessed them. To bless someone is to give them some kind of favorable word or message. Thus Jesus gave these children some personal favorable message to each one of them. Most likely a message of hope and promise of His care and love for them.

So if we are going to be like Jesus toward our children then we need to give them our time, our touch, and our encouraging words. They need to know that we understand that they are loved by Jesus.

IV. Fourth, let's notice Jesus' view of children from the picture that He presents of them (vs 14, 15)

The point I am making here is that Jesus uses the example of the child like faith of the little children as the only means and way that anyone can enter into the kingdom of God.

In Matthews Gospel we get a further explanation of this example using children as the means of coming into the kingdom of God. "He called a little child to Him, and placed the child among them. And He said: 'Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven. Therefore whoever takes the lowly position of this child is the greatest in the kingdom of heaven. And whoever welcomes one such child in my name welcomes me." (Matt 18:2-5).

You see a little child is completely aware of his or her dependence upon their parents or guardians to get along in life. They are fully aware of the fact that they are fully dependant upon their parents for food to eat, clothes to wear, a shelter to live in and so on. So it is that if we are going to enter into the kingdom of God like a little child we must humbly come to Christ Jesus our Lord and Savior and trust in Him fully with the reliance that a little child has in their parents taking care of them. We must fully declare our reliance upon the Lord Jesus Christ as our only means of entering God's kingdom, and this trust in Him is an everlasting trust.

So have you come to Christ with this childlike faith in Christ, trusting fully and completely in Him and all that He did in his life, death, burial and resurrection to save us? If not, I pray that today you will.

V. Fifth, let's notice Jesus' view of children from His praying over them (Matt 19:13)

Now this point is found in Matthew's gospel presentation of the same event that we are looking at in Mark's gospel. What the verse tells us that's not in Mark's gospel is that the parents brought the children to not only be blessed by Jesus but that He would also pray for them.

Now to be honest with you we aren't told if Jesus actually prayed with them. However when He blessed them as part of the blessing He may have prayed with them and over them. But there is no doubt from all the emphasis on prayer from the Lord Jesus Christ, and all the Bible, that Jesus prayed for the children and so should we.

As in our last point to enter the kingdom of God we must humble ourselves and with childlike faith trust Christ. So to raise our children we too must have the childlike faith to cry out to God for help to raise our children in the manner He so wants us to. Are you praying for your children and are you praying with your children?

Conclusion:

Jesus loves the little children, all the children of the world, red and yellow, black and white, they are precious in His sight, Jesus loves the little children of the world. Do you?
