



A Dinner In Honor Of Jesus John 12:1-11

Introduction: As we continue our journey toward the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus Christ our blessed Lord, in this message we will take a look at a special dinner given in honor of Jesus, and exclusively in honor of Jesus. I dare say that anyone of us looking at this message have ever been to a meal or dinner given exclusively for the purpose of honoring Jesus. While we have been to many dinners in honor of a lot of other persons.

However no one deserves greater honor than Jesus Christ our Lord. And really every meal we eat and everything we do we should do in such a way that Jesus Christ receives all the glory and honor. So hopefully from this message we will learn better how to honor Jesus as we examine the way in which He was honored at this meal.

I. First, lets notice why a dinner was given in honor of <u>Jesus</u>. Verses 1,2.

As we examine this dinner we will clearly discover that there are at least two reasons why there was a dinner given in Jesus' honor.

Both reasons have to do with the town in which the meal took place, as well as the specific home the meal was given in. The town was Bethany. This was a very special place to Jesus because of the friends that He had there. The friends He had there that are well known to us are Mary, Martha, and Lazarus. Now Jesus had spent much time in their home and recently had been there only a few days earlier.

However on this occasion it wasn't Martha, Mary and Lazarus' home, though they were very much a part of the meal. But from the Gospels of Matthew and Mark we are specifically told that the meal was at the home of Simon the leper.

So the question is why does where this meal takes place tell us why the meal was given? The answer to that question is that Simon the leper is no longer a leper, because if he was then hardly anyone would have shown up out of fear of getting leprosy. The obvious implication is that Jesus recently healed Simon. Also Jesus had just, in the last few days, resurrected Lazarus up out of the grave. Thus the meal was given by Simon the leper at his house in conjunction with Lazarus, and his two sisters to honor Jesus for the healing of Simon and the resurrection of Lazarus.

So what we learn is that this meal of honor, is a meal of gratitude. Today if we threw a meal in honor of Jesus it would be a time for all of God's people to, one by one, stand up and voice all the wonderful things that our Jesus has done for us. As a matter of fact, spiritually speaking, every Christian has been raised from the dead. For the Bible tells us that we were dead in our transgressions and sin, but made alive through Christ Jesus our Lord. Therefore we must live our lives in a manner that we are constantly giving gratitude to Jesus and openly expressing it.

II. Second, lets notice who was at the dinner in honor of <u>Jesus</u>. Verses 2-4.

From Johns Gospel, as well as from Matthew and Mark we learn that definitely Mary, Martha, Lazarus, Simon the leper, as well as the disciples were there. However the implications are that there probably were other guests there as well that were appreciative of all that Jesus had done.

Now the point that I want to make from this is that the people that were there were exactly the people that should have been there. For all of these people, in one way or another, had been miraculously touched by Jesus. Therefore the people of God need to realize that they, very specifically, should come together for the purpose honoring Jesus. And if a stranger came to one of our church gatherings they should go away saying, "Boy, at that church they are bent toward honoring the name above every name, the name of Jesus Christ our Lord".

III. Third, lets notice what took place during dinner given in Jesus honor. Verses 3-8

Now first of all what took place was that obviously a meal was prepared and served in Jesus honor. So the way that Martha primarily showed her honor to Jesus was by serving the meal, and I'm sure that others must have been helping her as well.

However as we look at this event the meal was not the only way that honor was given to Jesus. For the greatest emphasis of the meal was not the meal itself but rather what took place after the meal had already been served. Which was Mary's anointing of Jesus with oil and perfume. She anointed His feet here in John's Gospel but in Matthews and Marks we are told that she also anointed His head. This anointing by Mary appears to be the greatest honor given during the whole event.

However, from the other Gospels, Judas as well as others that were at the dinner, believed that what Mary had done was the worst and most dishonoring thing done during the whole event.

But Jesus speaks up and shows Judas, as well as the other complainers, that their indignation against Mary is one hundred percent wrong. As a matter of fact He tells them to leave her alone and declares that what she's done, according to Matthew and Mark, was a beautiful thing, and will be spoken of down through the centuries, for the honor she gave, until Jesus comes again.

So why was her honor to Jesus so well defended by Jesus Himself? First because her act of honor was and extremely extravagant one. Both the jar and the perfume in it, which was used to anoint Jesus, were extremely valuable. As a matter of fact John tell us that it was so valuable that if sold it would have been enough to have paid workingman's wages for an entire year.

Second, Jesus defends her honor because it was an act of humility. She didn't use a rag to do the anointing of Jesus feet, rather she let her hair down and used it to wipe the expensive perfume upon His feet. In the past, when a woman let her hair down in public it was often seen to show that the lady was a harlot. Well Mary didn't do it for that reason. She did it to show; no matter what people thought, she loved Jesus and was going to honor Him even if it looked humiliating.

Third, it was defended by Jesus because her act of honor was one that recognized and honored His holy Word. For he declared that what she did was to prepare Him for His burial. Thus when He told them on at least three different occasions prior to this special meal in His honor, that he would be crucified and then three days later resurrected, she listened and believed what He said and was expressing her faith in His words.

So if we want to honor Jesus in the way Mary did then we need to be willing to be extravagant in our honor of Him. We need to be willing to humble ourselves in His presence, and we need to honor His Word by putting our faith in it. Like Mary our honor of Jesus must be one of unfettered love and devotion to Him. Jesus can never get too much of our honor no matter how much of it is.

VI. Fourth, Lets notice hoe the dinner honoring Jesus concluded. Verses 9-11


It concluded with the word getting out that a meal had been given in honor of Jesus and that He was there as well as Lazarus when Jesus resurrected him and it resulted in a large crowd showing up to see Jesus and Lazarus. So the point I want to make about this is that when the church is honoring Jesus in the manner done at this meal the Word will get out and it will help draw people in because they will want to see what Jesus has done in our lives. And nothing honors Jesus more that the saving of lost souls AMEN!

Conclusion:

Let us live the rest of our lives as though every moment of it that we are throwing Jesus a dinner in His honor.
