



Knowledge that guided the ministry of John the Baptist.

John 1:1-35

Introduction: In my very last, fully attended chapel service as pastor of the school I felt led to discuss what I believe that my main roll has been with them for nearly eighteen years. The Biblical example that I used to describe my roll and purpose among them, was the roll and purpose of John the Baptist. His example is not only an example that I should attempt to exemplify but one that we all should attempt to do so.

Now the specific thing that I want us to examine about Johns ministry is the knowledge that he had that guided his ministry along. And if we will grasp this same knowledge that John the Baptist had then we will have the motivation and ability to carry out the work that Gods called us to do. The first knowledge that guided Johns ministry was knowing just who he himself was. Vs 19-23; 6-8. John was specifically asked this question by the religious leaders of the day. He answered their questions by primarily telling them who he was not. He answered them that he wasn't Elijah come back to life, or any of the other Old Testament prophets of old.

However the most definite, loudest and clearest answer of who he was not, was that he was not the Messiah. "I am not the Messiah " (v s 20). As a matter of fact John expresses the fact that he's not even worthy of untying the sandals on the feet to Jesus the Messiah.

So if John the Baptist is not Elijah, or one of the other prophets, or the Messiah, then just who is he? Well John answers that question by revealing not whose son he is or where he came from, or who he 's kin to but rather by what he 's been sent to do. And what he is sent to do, he 's absolutely assured of. To begin with the Apostle John who wrote the books of John, tells us who John is by what he was sent to do. *"There was a man sent from God, whose name was John. He came as a witness to testify concerning that light, so that through Him all might believe, He himself was not the light; he came only as a witness to the light."* (vs 6-8)

Then John the Baptist himself declares just who he is with words similar to what Apostle John wrote about him. Just after he declared that Jesus Christ was the lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world, he said, *"…the reason I came, baptizing with water was that He might be revealed to Israel."(vs 31)*Thus the apostle John and John the Baptist tell us that John is the one called to bare witness to the fact that Jesus is the Messiah.

So the important thing about this is that John holds a humble view of who he is. This helped him to be able to do his job amazingly well because it wasn' t about him but rather about the Messiah he was called to bare witness to. So it is with us as Christians, we too are called to have a humble view of who we are so we focus on the one we've been called to bare witness to. Do you know just who you, yourself is? Its imperative to the work God's called us to. **II. The Second knowledge that guided Johns ministry was knowing just who Jesus is. Vs. 5-8: 20-31.** In another set of verses in his gospel, the Apostle John shares the statement of what the people of Israel were saying about John the Baptist. *"Then Jesus went back across the Jordan to the place where John had been baptizing in the early days. There He stayed, and many people came to him. They said. 'though John never performed a sign, all that John said about this man was true". (John 10: 40-41).* So since everything that John the Baptist said about Jesus was true, it behooves us to pay close attention to everything that John said about Jesus, especially Just who He is.

There are numerous things that John declares about our Jesus. John declares that Jesus Christ is the eternal one and at the same time the Supreme one. "*John testified concerning Him. He cried out, saying, "this is the one I spoke about when I said, He who comes after me has surpassed me because He was before me." (vs 15).*

So how could John who was born before Jesus, declare that Jesus surpassed him and was before him? Because John was declaring that Jesus has always been, for He 's the everlasting, eternal Messiah, the glorious Son of God!

John also knew and declared that Jesus was and is the Messiah, the Christ, the Anointed and Chosen by God the Father to carry out the work of redemption for the nation of Israel and for the world. He readily declared that he wasn 't the Messiah because he knew beyond a shadow of doubt that Jesus was. "I have seen and testify that this is God 's chosen one." (vs.34) Also over and over John knew and declared that Jesus was the Lamb of God. *"the next day John saw Jesus coming toward him and said, 'look the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world!"* (vs. 29-35)

Another thing John knew about Jesus was that although he baptized with water, Jesus was going to baptize people with the Holy Spirit. "*A nd I myself did not know Him, but the One who sent me to baptize with water told me the man on whom you see the Spirit come down and remain is the one who will baptize with the Holy Spirit.*" (*vs. 29,35*).

Like John the Baptist, you will never be able to be a servant of Jesus Christ until, like John, you have a clear understanding of just who Jesus Christ is. But once you have that knowledge both in your heart and mind like John then you will be both equipped and motivated to do the work that God has called you to do.

III. The third knowledge that guided John 's ministry was knowing what he had to do. Vs 6-8, 22-23. So when John considered all the knowledge about Jesus that had been revealed to him then there was no doubt whatsoever in Johns heart and mind, about what he had been called to do. And simply put; that was to declare everything that had been revealed to him concerning just who Jesus is. As a matter of fact all the knowledge that he had received on the person of Jesus not only drove him to understand what his purpose and roll was, but was doing it for, and because of the amazing benefits that I meant for those that he declared the message to. *" To this John replied, a person can receive only what is given them from heaven. You yourself can testify that I said, I am not the Messiah, but am sent ahead of Him. The bride belongs to the bridegroom. The* Friend who attends the bridegroom waits and listens to Him, and is full of joy when he hears the bridegrooms voice. That joy is mine, and now is complete. He must become greater and I must become less. " (John3:27-30)

<u>Conclusion:</u> I pray that we all come to a full and complete knowledge of just who Jesus is and like John we choose to joyfully declare that message to our lost and dying world. That is what God has called us to do.


