The word *discipline* either garners a good feeling in you or a feeling of dread depending on your experience with the word. Scripture talks about the importance of spiritual disciplines in the life of a Christian because they promote growth and conformity to the image of Christ.

While discipline of any kind requires work, for some, the spiritual disciplines of Bible reading, prayer, and worship, for example, seem attainable and enjoyable. Other disciplines, like evangelism, may seem overwhelming, anxiety inducing, or meant for someone else—someone more suited. But all spiritual disciplines are for our good. They all help us live lives of faithfulness as we conform to the image of Christ. Sometimes we can all use a reminder of why evangelism is important, why we do what we do.

When Christ left the earth to go to His Father, He charged believers with this mandate: "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations" (Matt. 28:19). Believers

don't accidentally share the gospel with people. We must intentionally share it. If this thought causes angst in your heart because you don't feel prepared or equipped to share, here are some things to consider:

- 1. Evangelism is a call from Christ we are to obey (Matt. 28:18-20).
- 2. Evangelism is a discipline that must be practiced (1 Peter 3:15).
- 3. Evangelism is a charge to pray for the lost (Matt. 9:37–38).

Here are some practical ways to use the discipline of evangelism in your daily life:

- 1. Pray specifically that God would open doors for you to share Christ with others.
- Practice sharing your personal faith story with family and friends, especially if nerves or fear is an issue.
 Writing out your story will be helpful.
- 3. Plan a time to share your faith story with neighbors or people in your community who are nonbelievers. Make a list of names of unsaved people you know. Look for gospel opportunities to invite them into your home for a meal and a time to get to know one another. These times should be both planned and spontaneous.

Make the discipline of evangelism a part of your life. Remember, God has called each one of us to share His message of love and forgiveness of sins to everyone who doesn't know Him. How did you come to know Christ as your Savior? Was it because someone took the time to share the gospel with you? Go and do likewise.

Do you know anyone serving God at age 120? Neither do I. How about 100? Maybe. Moses began serving God late in life, and the Lord said, "Since then, no prophet has risen in Israel like Moses, whom the LORD knew face to face" (Deut. 34:10).

Anna, who was very old and had been a widow for many decades, daily worshipped God in the Temple, and the Lord blessed her with seeing the Christ child (Luke 2:36–38).

We're never too late, or too old, to serve Christ. However, it looks different as we age.

TIME

In our retirement years, we can now fill our days with grandchildren, home and garden projects, travel, and dining out. A 90-year-old church member registered children for Vacation Bible School. Her beautiful face was the first one they saw when entering my church. Look for ways to give your time to Christ.

LIMITATIONS

Aging brings wisdom and experience, but our minds and bodies may not work as well. Do you love children but aren't able to get up and down easily? Teach the Bible story or help them memorize Bible verses. Join the choir or serve on a committee.

MENTOR

Pray for someone who needs to begin, or grow, their faith journey. Invite them for coffee. Listen to their story and share yours. Follow up with weekly meetings or phone calls. Ask for prayer requests and commit to pray.

WITNESS

Hand a gospel tract to your grocery store cashier, hairdresser, or anywhere you frequent. Invite them to church. Send notes of encouragement and prayer to a local educator, first responder, or government official. Visit a lonely neighbor. Share what God is doing in your life with someone. Ask a server, "We're Christians, and we're going to pray for our meal. What can we pray for you?" You'd be surprised how many people long to know someone cares!

PRAY

My 100-year-old dad's eyes are dimming, and his hearing is weakening, but he can still pray. He's a mighty prayer warrior and an encouragement to many! He is the type of person the psalmist spoke of: "The righteous will flourish like a palm tree. . . . They will still bear fruit in old age, they will stay fresh and green" (Psalm 92:12–14).

Use whatever God has given you. Every believer of every age can reflect what Scripture says in Ephesians 2:10: "For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do." Show His love. Bring Jesus into conversations. Offer your gifts, talents, and experiences at church and in the community. Joyfully serve wherever God leads. You just might show what a senior adult can do, paving the way for others!
