




From the Moderator

Have you ever really spent time considering why we have an association of local churches? I don't mean simply accepting that we do, but rather thinking deeply about why the cooperative relationship that we have voluntarily entered into is something worth investing in? This is perhaps the perfect time to be thinking about it.

We don't have any megachurches in SRBA. Most of our churches were established long before tourism and real estate development came to the area, and they continue along as treasured pieces of local communities, serving faithfully. Some of those places are in the middle of high-growth areas, and they are seeing significant growth in their membership. While others are tucked away in corners of the Lowcountry that development has seemingly forgotten, and their membership is gracefully aging under the stewardship of pastors who love them dearly. Every church is striving to fulfill the Great Commission, but the limitation on resources constrains the vision for what most of our churches can do on their own. Local churches tend to focus on the community around the church doors, which can limit our impact.

What the SRBA allows us to do is to come together, pooling some of our resources so that we can maintain a regional approach to building the Kingdom that includes every one of our member churches as well as looking towards the lost who aren't in a church. A fantastic example of that was at the OneNight men's event held on September 18th, in Ridgeland, which brought together more than 250 men from the region, for a fantastic evening of food, fellowship, and a powerful

Presentation of the Gospel. This is not the sort of thing any individual church within our association is likely to put on, but when we work together, we can be spurred to mighty acts that glorify God.

And lest you worry that we will rest on our laurels, the association is organizing a youth night for December 7th that will be held at the Hilton Head Christian Academy campus in Bluffton. Drawing together the youth ministries from within our association will allow us to host an event that will be an excellent complement to the regular youth events that we host at our home churches, perhaps fanning the flames of the Holy Spirit within our students to encourage them to purposefully seek career paths and lifestyles that bring glory, honor, and praise to Jesus our Lord.

There are plenty of other ways that our working together as an association strengthens our local churches and extends our reach into the lives of the thousands of the unchurched who live around us. However, if you aren't thinking about it, you likely aren't supporting the associational efforts like you otherwise might. Frankly, the lostness of our region presents significant opportunities, and if we are going to be as effective as we can be, we all need to be enthusiastic about locking arms together to leverage our resources for the battle.

Perhaps the easiest thing that you, personally can do to get more excited about the work of the SRBA is to attend our **annual meeting, to be held on Sunday, October 26th, at Ridgeland Baptist Church, starting at 5:00 pm. Come enjoy a great meal, fellowship with brothers and sisters from other churches, and learn about how God has been moving in our association.**
